

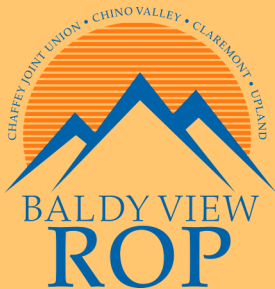

Paola added that she took many AP classes while in high school and said if she could balance ROP and her eventual job at Pacific Sunwear with school then anyone can. It just takes time management.

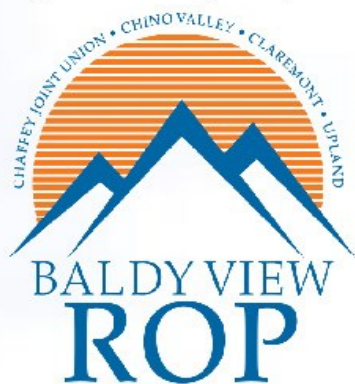

SPOTLIGHT ON THE STUDENTS

In September, members of the US Army who have worked as mechanics visited the Auto Technology class at Etiwanda High School taught by Instructor Jim Kennedy. His students were able to inspect an Army Humvee.



“Students got to get in, crawl under, and see the actual mechanical workings of the massive beast we use in combat. They were able to see a real example of the importance mechanics in the Army play to keep these machines running,” Instructor Kennedy shared.

An ongoing project in the Auto Technology course at Etiwanda is the creation of a ‘rat truck,’ which is a custom vehicle that imitates or even exaggerates early hot rods. Rat trucks and rat rods often have an unfinished look as the only parts that are used are the bare essential components that allow them to run.

Instructor Jim Kennedy is excited to watch his students use creativity as well as mechanical knowledge to bring the rat truck towards completion as a functioning vehicle.

“Rat trucks aren’t pretty but they are unique,” he shared. “The students are working on an old, beat up 1973 Chevrolet pick up. Everybody says it will NEVER run again. With the will and perseverance of eager students, we will bring this rust bucket back to life. This ongoing project gives the students the opportunity to experiment, get creative, and use their imaginations. They can change the plan up as they see fit. Creativity plays a big roll in the mechanical industry.”

New Baldy View ROP Course

One of the many qualities unique to ROP courses that cannot be found in other high school courses is the internship opportunity students obtain through Baldy View ROP's 'community classroom' component, available in a number of varied courses. Community classrooms provide students with the opportunity to gain real-work experience by interning at local businesses.

New to Claremont High School this semester is the Retail Marketing course taught by Instructor Jim Londagin. The course features a community classroom that allows students to intern at stores within the Montclair Plaza four days a week throughout the semester. Students spend one day a week in the classroom learning marketing strategies. Instructor Londagin also teaches Retail Marketing at Montclair High School where the course has been a great success and has had consistently full enrollment for the last nine years. He is excited to be able to teach the same course at Claremont High School where he also teaches the Baldy View ROP course Virtual Enterprise.

"We've had great support at Montclair High School for Retail Marketing and immediately have had great support here at Claremont," he said. "I'm really excited to be able to teach this here as it brings a different kind of course to the campus. It's the first course here that features a community classroom where students are able to intern outside the campus."

Mr. Londagin enjoys a strong relationship with managers at a variety of stores within the Montclair Plaza who are happy to employ Baldy View ROP students.

"It's really fun to go into the Plaza each year where managers are excited to have ROP students. They ask 'Is it time yet?'" he continued.

Many of the students taking the course at Claremont expressed similar reasons for enrolling. Several have been looking for work but have had trouble getting their foot in the door due to large applicant pools. As young applicants who have not had the chance to gain work experience yet, the Retail Marketing course provides them with an opportunity to get job training and build their resume.

Claremont Junior Ean Hafner, who previously took Virtual Enterprise and wants to study business in college, enrolled for exactly that reason. Already adept in the art of promotion, he convinced two of his friends to enroll in the course as well.

"It's a great experience so far. I'm interning at Tilly's and really enjoy the atmosphere and working with customers. We're stocking displays, shifting and organizing products like shoes, and keeping the store neat with folded clothes and properly stickered merchandise. I wasn't having any luck getting a part time job but now I'm going to have experience," he said.

Other students shared that they took the class to gain more experience working with people.

Junior Lauren Lannan, who is going to begin taking psychology classes at Mt. San Antonio College during her senior year in high school, said the course has already provided her with eye-opening experiences working with difficult situations.

"The internship part of this class is what grabbed me and that's why I enrolled," she said. "Already I've had to learn about working with people. Sometimes customers are unhappy about situations and I have to be able to be respectful even if they're not being that way themselves. It's a big learning experience."

Retail Marketing is also taught at Etiwanda High School by Instructor Lonzie Johnson. All Retail Marketing courses include community classroom, are a semester long, and are offered in the fall and spring semesters.

ALUMNI CONTINUING THEIR EDUCATION

Upland High School grad Robert Flores is currently going to school at Chaffey College where he is working to earn his Associate Degree to become an aviation mechanic. He is also preparing to earn his Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) certification and has longer term goals of graduating with a Bachelor of Science in Aviation and to own an airplane. While Robert's current educational path and goals are clearly defined, it is the result of his life taking a turn after enrolling in the Baldy View ROP course Airport Careers.

"ROP turned my life upside down. I wanted to be an automotive technician, but while taking Airport Careers I realized that working in the airline industry was what I really wanted to do," he said.

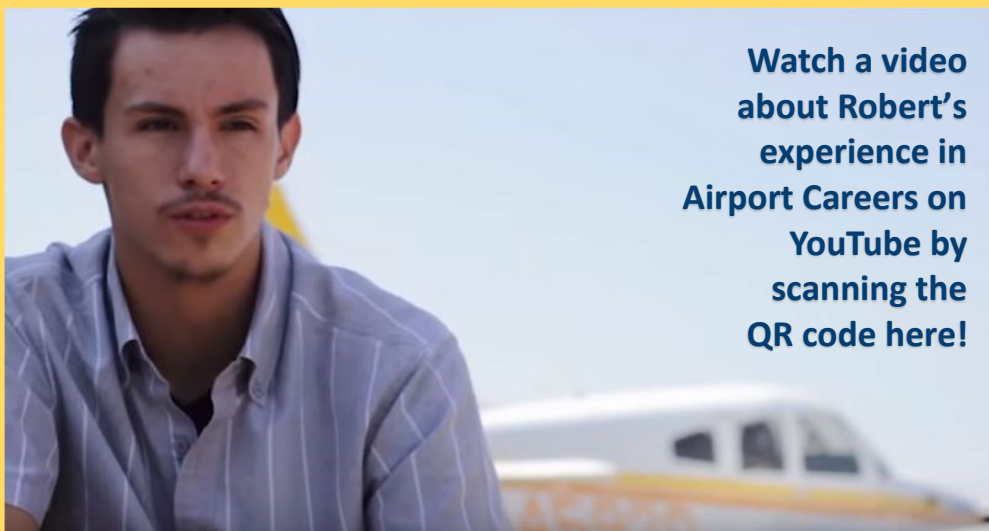
Robert took auto tech classes all four years in high school and hopes to collect classic cars when he gets older. Though he has no love lost for working with cars, he says that this ROP course opened his eyes to job opportunities he had never considered were available.

"The course really showed me that there are great job placements available for airline mechanics. It also prepared me in how to actually get hired. We had assignments in class to interview airline industry professionals. I interviewed an airline mechanic and an aviation professor. Talking to them helped guide my decisions towards my future."

Robert shared his gratitude for Instructor Pat Campbell, a long-time Baldy View ROP instructor who continues to find internship placements for her students at the Ontario Airport where the course is held.

"Mrs. Campbell really cares about us and I've learned from her guidance that the world is what you make of it. No one will just hand you something, but that you need to push hard so that your dreams become reality."

Airport Careers is one semester and is offered in the fall and the spring semesters. Class meets at the Old Terminal at the Ontario Airport Monday through Friday from 4pm to 7pm and includes a community classroom internship.

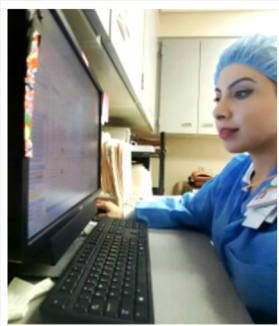
Course in Development

It was not Jessica Vasquez’ idea to take ROP courses in high school, but she enrolled as her mother encouraged her to do so. The Ayala High School grad was deeply interested in music and went on to earn her Bachelor of Arts in the field. She had taken two Baldy View ROP courses in the medical industry in high school and shared that these courses changed her life as she later discovered strong employment opportunities within healthcare.

“My mother told me I needed to prepare for a backup career in case music didn’t pave my future with gold. It was ROP that equipped me with skills right out of high school. I became CPR and First Aid certified, I learned medical terminology, anatomy, and basic administrative skills that allowed me to obtain jobs in healthcare,” she said.

Jessica’s ROP courses provided her with an internship opportunity at Chino Medical Center where she had direct contact with patients.

“As a nurse’s assistant, I gave sponge baths, took vitals, and even got to see a live birth. It was rewarding!”

The internship gave Jessica a strong resume directly out of high school where she went on to not only earn her Bachelor’s Degree, but serve in medical-related jobs including positions as an office manager and case manager.

“As a recent high school graduate, I was able to have actual work experience and a resume! I owe it all to ROP,” she said.

She did not stop with the training that her ROP courses provided and has since earned her Master of Science in Healthcare Administration from CSU Bakersfield. She currently works as the Peri-Operative Coordinator for Bakersfield Memorial Hospital in Surgical Services.

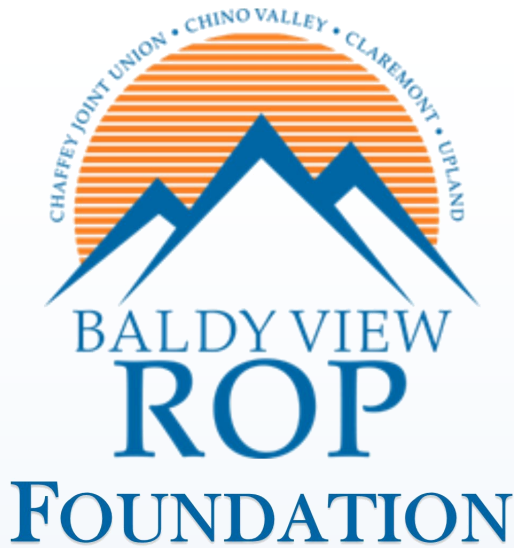
Today, Jessica is an advocate of ROP and encourages parents to get their children enrolled in ROP courses in their communities.

“Right now, many students graduate with little to no work experience. Why do we allow high schoolers to graduate without equipping them with some type of skill to prepare them for the real world? ROP courses train students with skills so that their first jobs can actually be in career industries they’re interested in. I tell every parent to enroll their children in ROP,” she said.

Jessica added that the types of jobs students obtain after taking ROP courses are diverse. She shared that some may find part-time work in an industry they’re interested in while they continue their education, while others may get the start they need in an organization that can lead to a full time career.

“ROP gives student the upper hand,” she said.

Jessica’s career goals are to eventually work as a CEO for a medical center. She would also like to remain involved in ROP by one day becoming an instructor.

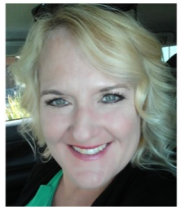
College Day Corona Elementary School

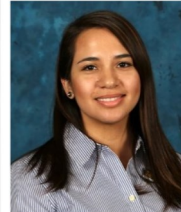

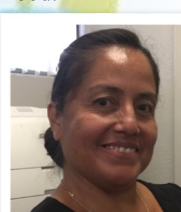

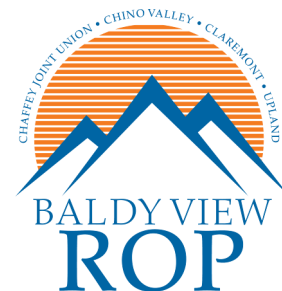
