

COMPREHENSIVE SAFETY PLAN

The Baldy View Regional Occupational Program Commission recognizes students and staff have the right to a safe and secure campus where they are free from physical and psychological harm. The Commission is fully committed to maximizing campus safety and to creating a positive learning environment that includes strategies for violence prevention and high expectations for student conduct, responsible behavior, and respect for others.

The Superintendent or designee shall oversee the development of an ROP comprehensive school safety plan that is applicable to each school site. (Education Code 32281)

Annually the Commission shall review the comprehensive Baldy View Regional Occupational Program (ROP) and/or school safety plan(s) in order to ensure compliance with state law, commission policy, and administrative regulation.

The Commission shall approve the plan at a regularly scheduled meeting.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that an updated file of all safety-related plans and materials is readily available for inspection by the public. (Education Code 32282)

By October 15 of each year, the Superintendent or designee shall notify the California Department of Education of any classroom sites that have not complied with the requirements of Education Code 32281. (Education Code 32288)
