District Plan for Safe Return to In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services

General School Health Guidance - Maintaining Safety for Students and Staff

- Individuals are encouraged to self-monitor for symptoms of illness. Individuals who are ill should stay home.
- Those with Covid-19 symptoms should remain home and get tested.
- Individuals with confirmed COVID-19 infection are excluded for five days. The individual must be fever free with improving symptoms to return. It is recommended that individuals with confirmed COVID-19 infection who return on day six wear a mask through day 10.
- Approved field trips will be supported to the extent transportation is available.
- Visitors are welcome in schools.

Hand and Respiratory Hygiene

- Hand hygiene – frequently washing hands with soap/water for 20 seconds or using hand sanitizer if sink is not available
- Avoid touching eyes, nose or mouth with unwashed hands
- Cough/sneeze into your elbow

Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation.

- Bringing in outdoor air through building HVAC systems will continue to be used as a mitigation strategy along with upgraded air filtration, cleaning, and sanitation protocols.

Appropriate accommodations for children with disabilities with respect to health and safety policies.

Special education and related services are provided to eligible students with disabilities ages 3 to 21 and to students who qualify for gifted services Kindergarten through grade 12, as closely aligned as possible to each student's Individualized Education Program (IEP). Infants and toddlers

with developmental delays or disabilities are served through Infant Toddler Services of Johnson County.
