## **VOLLEYBALLERS WIN DISTRICT OPENER**




Above: Sadie Hoover (2) prepares a serve during the second set.

Crockett frankly had little trouble with the Lady Chargers, winning the first two games by lopsided margins and breaking open the third game when Brooklyn Haynes got on a good service run, paired with a variety of slams from Evans and Cherry.

Evans, who's been working her way back into the lineup after an injury prior to the season opener, was particularly dominant Monday night, taking sets from the likes of Bailey Ann Whitby, Haynes, Lynden Cole, Brennan Morris, Kinleigh Lamb, and Sadie Hoover and blasting away mercilessly from the center position.

Cherry, West, and Deonna Cole all had their moments as well, and the steady pounding tended to make the rallies short and sweet, in the home team's favor. Rawson was able to substitute freely and allow several reserves to gain some experience.


The Brighton match will have a junior varsity duel at 5 p.m., followed by the varsity contest around 6 p.m., at the conclusion of the JV contest.
