GIRLS SOCCER – Never has a “Senior Night” gone as well as the celebration Crockett County’s soccer team pulled off Monday evening.

With five seniors on the squad, four of them scored goals and the other posted a defensive shutout as the Lady Cavaliers hammered Haywood 9-0 to boost their season record to 2-1-1.

Coach Stan Jamscek’s club jumped to a 4-0 first-half advantage, substituted liberally throughout the game, and even moved some defenders into offensive positions to give them a chance to get on the scoreboard. Ironically, it was a freshman – Rebecca Waddey – who got the party started by blasting in a kick from close to 25 yards out.

Once she opened the floodgates, seniors Charity Greenhill, Ester Procopio, and Kristin Lewis followed with goals to provide the 4-0 edge at the intermission. In the second half, Waddey kicked off the scoring again, and then junior defender Daniella Rios netted a pair of goals in succession. Junior Stephanie Joyner joined the parade after that, and then senior defender Casey Thornton capped off the night with her goal.

Meanwhile, on the other end of the field, senior goaltender Hannah Johnson only had to make one save in the entire contest to post the shutout as Crockett kept the ball on its offensive side almost the entire time. Six different Lady Cavaliers recorded assists in the game: Procopio, Lewis, Joyner, freshman Emme-Grace Martin, sophomore Cristal Martinez, and junior Dalia Aguirre.

MIDDLE SCHOOL SOFTBALL – Crockett' diamonders, after a week of heat-related cancellations, swept a doubleheader from Dyersburg Middle School, clobbering their opponents 14-0 in the first game and 10-4 in the second to improve to 5-2 on the season.

The Lady Cavs used a 17-hit attack in the opener, keyed by a 4-for-4 performance by third baseman Madison Stitts, who also drove in three runs, and a 3-for-3 effort from shortstop Wesley Thornton, who knocked in four runs and had a pair of doubles. Fallon Beard and Addie Hoover also delivered three hits each, and Emmalynn Medlin pitched a one-hit shutout, striking out nine in just four innings.

In the nightcap, Emilee Chandler did not allow an earned run and also went 2-for-2 at the plate with two RBIs as Crockett won again in four innings. Reagen McCoy scored three runs for the victors despite not having an official at-bat after walking twice and being hit by a pitch.

First baseman Ariana Mosier drove home two runs and Caroline Neal posted a hit and a walk in her two plate appearances. CCMS will travel to South Gibson on Wednesday and host Westview Thursday evening.

MIDDLE SCHOOL SOCCER – In a game that came down to penalty kicks, Crockett edged Trenton 2-1.

Trailing 1-0 in the 53rd minute, Crockett pulled even on a goal by Ruth Gourley, and the game remained deadlocked through two overtime "Golden Goal" periods.

That forced a penalty kicks situation, and Lady Cav goaltender Hannah Wede stepped up to make four saves. For Crockett, shooters Kamila Juarez and Amy Mena netted goals to claim the win for the Cavs.

The Lady Cavs are scheduled to host Three Oaks Tuesday evening at 5:30.
