#### SCHOOL SUPPLIES

# Marcus Whitman will be providing the basic school supplies for all students this year.

If your student wants to purchase their own supplies below is the list of supplies they will be needing.

#### UPDATED ELECTRONIC DEVICE POLICY

Electronic Devices/Personal Devices (cell phones, tablets, ear buds, handheld game systems, etc.) will be kept out of sight from the 8:05-2:45. Every classroom in the school has a telephone. Telephones can be used by students with teacher permission and supervision for school-related business and necessary contact with parents/guardians.

To assure delivery of messages to students, parents/guardians must call at least 30 minutes prior to the closure of school. Except in cases of emergency, students will not be called from class to use the telephone. Personal messages from unauthorized persons will not be delivered by school personnel.

Students are not permitted to exchange cell phone messages with anyone during school hours - voice or text. At staff discretion, students may be allowed to message a parent/guardian during non-academic time. Students in violation of this policy will be subject to the following actions:

#### Electronic Device Violation Responses

- 1. 1st Infraction/Warning: If a student is found using an electronic device during class time or in restricted areas, they will be directed to put away the device immediately. That same day, a message will be sent to the parent/guardian informing you of the first infraction.
- 2. 2nd Infraction: In the event of a second infraction, the student will be required to take the electronic device to the school office. Furthermore, a message will be sent to the parent/guardian, detailing the second offense.
- 3. 3rd Infraction: Should a student be found in violation of the policy for a third time, we will request parent/guardian presence to pick up the device from the school. This measure is intended to reinforce the importance of adhering to our electronics policy.
- 4. 4th Infraction: A fourth infraction will result in the student being required to check their device into the school office at the beginning of the day and collect it at the end of the day. This process will continue until further notice from the school administration.

Coming in the 2023-24 school year!


