

St. Pius, Houston Takes Cavaliers for State, 21-7

By the flip of a coin, the Cavaliers won with right to represent district 3-AA in the play-offs.

In the quarter-finals the Cavaliers traveled to Fredericksburg to play the St. Mary's Indians. It was a hard fought game. With six minutes remaining, the Cavaliers trailed 13 to 0. Then inside the three yard line, Menchaca fumbled the ball, an alert Ben Delgado picked it up and scored a TD. He also kicked the extra point. Using long passes, the Cavaliers moved the ball steadily on the next drive. Menchaca drove across for the TD carrying three Indians with him. Again Ben kicked the extra point. With seconds to go, Sam Jones intercepted a pass, and that ended the game, the Gents 14 to 13.

The semi-final game was against Bishop Gorman of Tyler. The Crusaders played a hard game, and never gave up. But as the score shows, 28 to 8, they were outmanned.

In the finals, the Cavaliers met defending State Champions, St. Pius X of Houston. Seven interceptions and three fumble recoveries by St. Pius tell the story of the game.





McAllister holds a master's degree from Columbia University and a doctorate from the University of Texas. He is a member of the National Society for the Study of Education, The American Association of University Professors and Phi Delta Kappa.


