

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

For graduation from Servite High School, graduates from 2024 - 2026 are required to complete 270 academic credits.

A one-year course meeting daily earns a student 10 academic credits.

Starting with the Class of 2027, students will need 260 credits to graduate.

- Laboratory Science has increased the requirement to 30 credits.
- World Language has decreased the requirement to 20 credits.
- Computer Applications have been eliminated.
- Health as an individual requirement has been eliminated. (Will be included in the PE curriculum.)

COMPUTER SCIENCE PATHWAY

PATHWAY REQUIREMENTS:

- Summer before freshman year: Complete a Fine Art course.
- Eligible for or have completed Algebra 2/Trig by end of sophomore year.
- Completion of a capstone project by end of senior year.

Individuals will receive recognition and honors for successfully completing this pathway.

FORMATION

ATHLETICS

PRIORY LEADERSHIP
