Criterion for Maintaining Membership for National Junior Honor Society

Chromebook Information

 - The District's Chromebook Policy and Acceptable Use Agreement are being revamped and updated.
 - Scholars and Parents/Guardians will need to acknowledge and agree to the conditions set forth in the policy and agreement.
 - Chromebooks will be distributed to 6th grade scholars at the beginning of the school year.
 - Since District-owned devices are linked and managed by a mobile device management
 system, scholars are <u>not</u> allowed to use their own personal devices at school.



Cell Phone Protocol



Throughout the school day, cell phones:

- Must be turned off and kept out of sight during school hours.
- _ <u>MAY NOT</u> be used to accept or make calls.
 - <u>MAY NOT</u> be used to receive or send text, picture or video messages.
- Scholars <u>MAY NOT</u> use any cell phone functions (social media, messaging, calculator, games, etc.) at any time without teacher or administrative approval.
 - <u>MAY NOT</u> be used to call a third party and request they come to school without administrative approval as this violates our school safety policy and creates unnecessary situations that disrupt the educational environment.

Use of Cell Phone & Electronic Devices*

- Use of cell phones, earbuds, headphones, Apple watches, and all other electronic devices are not permitted during the school day, unless authorized by a teacher or administrator.
- Failure to comply with the above procedure will result in immediate confiscation without warning by faculty, administration, and/or security.
 - First Offense- the device will be taken and can be reclaimed in the Main Office at the end of the day, depending on the reason the device was confiscated.



- <u>Second Offense</u>- the device can <u>only</u> be reclaimed by a parent or guardian.
- All Other Offenses will be considered insubordination and result in disciplinary action.

 - Although not required, if a 6th grader has a current physical, please provide it to Nurse Goodness so she is aware of any health needs or concerns.
 - \circ If a 6th grader requires an inhaler for asthma or an Epi pen for food allergies:
 - Please provide a note from your child's doctor stating he or she may self-carry the medication, or
 - If both the parent/guardian and doctor are not comfortable having the child self-carry these medications and want them kept in the Health Office, please provide a doctor's note indicating this.









