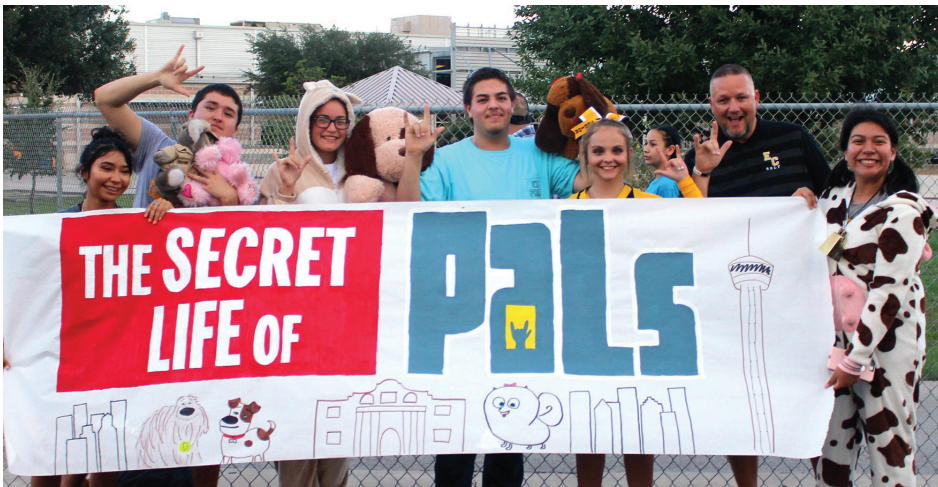
"PALS for me is great because you become a family with all the other members," Jayden Brewer said.

October 20, 2018. East Central FFA with 19 FFA members traveled to San Marcos, Texas for the Texas State University Invitational Contest. The trip to San Marcos provided the East Central FFA the opportunity to showcase the outstanding work being accomplished at home in developing their Leadership Development Programs for contest. This was the first contest for the new school year.

In the Creed Speaking Event, speakers recite the FFA Creed by E.M Tiffany and answer questions in front of a panel of judges. This event is divided into two age categories: Junior (Freshman level students) and Senior (10th through 12th grade).

In the Sr. Creed Speaking event East Central FFA took home 2nd and 4th place honors. Johanna Durham, a 11th grader was 2nd place. Krista St. Cyr, a 10th grader was 4th place.

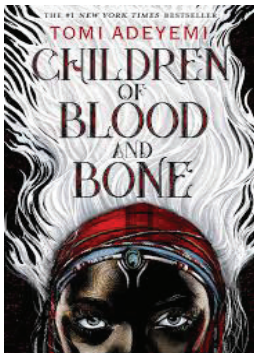
## Awesome Extraordinary Books

Ever wanting to read a book, but never know what to read ? Well here are the most popular teen books trending right now.



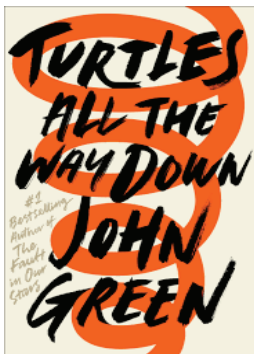
### Book # 1: *The Hate U Give*

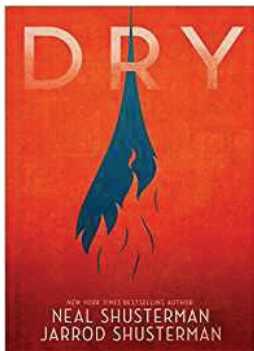
### Book # 2: *Children of Blood & Bone*

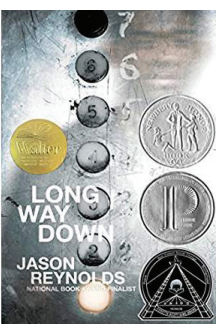
### Book # 3: *Turtles All The Way Down*
