Many PHS students are engaged in very interesting and fulfilling summer activities, including dance, horseback riding, art, robotics, coding, and all types of sports.

One of our rising 8th Graders, **Ethan** (pictured above), has been pursuing his passion for flying and aircraft this summer with two very interactive experiences.

Ethan and his family recently returned from **Oshkosh**, Wisconsin, and the International Experimental Aircraft Association's 2023 Fly-In Convention, which features individual, commercial, and military aircraft, and is the largest such gathering in the world (approximately 200,000 to 300,000 attendees).

Ethan relates his excitement of flying in the ultralight aircraft shown above and also watching the nighttime airshow, which was, in Ethan's words, "All about fireworks! Planes flew through exploding fireworks and the planes were shooting fireworks from their wings and fuselages!"

Earlier in July, Ethan was one of 50 cadets and 25 staff in the Aerospace Education & Stem Academy (AESA) at **Edwards Air Force Base** in the high desert north of Los Angeles. This jam-packed seven-day experience began at 6:00 AM each morning with revelry and breakfast, followed by viewing and experiencing B-1 Lancers, B-52's and other military aircraft, seeing Air Force pilots gear up for flight, followed by lunch, classes on astronomy and space, dinner, and instruction about a range of space topics including model rocketry. Ethan, the cadets, and staff slept in the gymnasium of the on-base high school, dressed in camo fatigues each day, and experienced a slice of life in the United States Air Force.
