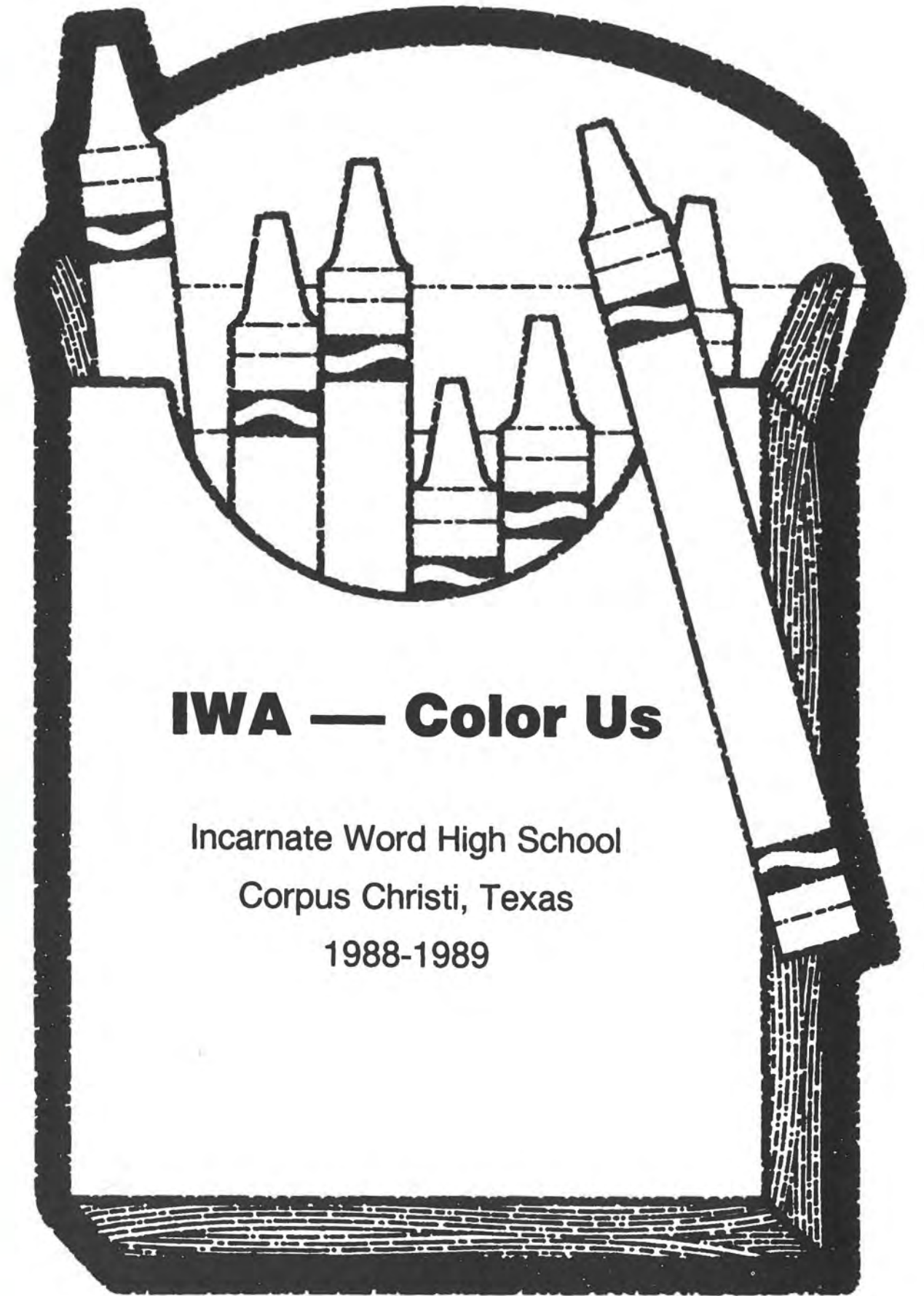

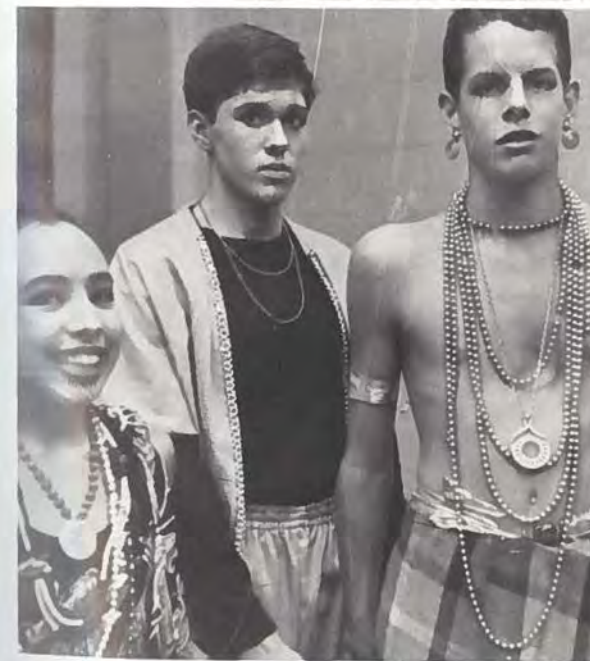

Germany

During the summer of 1988, seven Incarnate Word students — Ben Beadles (class of 1988), Dawn Bryant, Emily Foelker, Mike Grady, Paul McCluskey, Mary McNeill, and Shayd Tindall — spent three weeks in Germany on a student exchange program from June 14 to July 5. Dr. Michael Dubiaga and Mrs. Melva Peterson chaperoned the group.

The group was based around the city of Cologne (Köln). From there, the group visited famous and historical cities such as Bonn, Aachen, Trier, and Heidelberg.

The adjustment from the American way of life to the German way of life wasn't easy. For example, the main meal of the day in Germany isn't supper — it's lunch. The legal driving age in Germany is 18, but the insurance is so outrageous that most people do not get their license until their early twenties. The drinking age in Germany is 16, but you need to be 18 to play video games. Another difference between our two countries is the autobahns. The only speed limit is defined as "however fast you can safely drive your car."

Overall, the trip was a unique experience which the whole group thoroughly enjoyed and recommends to everyone.

Amy possessed great courage which she exhibited every day. Despite her handicaps, she took part in almost everything we did at school. She came to school as faithfully as she could, even after she became blind and even when she was forced to use a wheelchair. She never took the easy way out; when we counted her credits last fall, we became aware that she had fulfilled the requirements of the advanced program. She took the SAT exam, even when the questions had to be read to her — and she scored extremely well. It was plain to be seen by all of us that Amy was a tremendously courageous young lady.

Unselfish as she was courageous, Amy sought no special favors for herself. She was very self-reliant, not one to indulge in self-pity. In the days when she needed to go to her reading machine in the library, she would quietly slip out of class, causing no disruption. Never taking unfair advantage of her situation, Amy would ask for the help of another student only when necessary. She was a model of one who accepted her circumstances graciously and unselfishly fulfilled her duties in life.

Amy was a staunch supporter of our school. Unable physically to be a cheerleader, she had a great desire to form a pep club to cheer at athletic events. At school game nights, she and her friends were sure to be among those dancing in the patio. The last time we saw Amy was on the day of Spring Thing, as she sat among the merrymakers. Amy was also supportive in her observance of school rules and regulations, even though she would have been given special consideration. It would be hard to find one more interested in and supportive of IWA than Amy.

A vibrant lover of life was Amy.



She will long be remembered for her cheerful greetings and smiling face. Despite her poor health, she wanted to be in the middle of activity. Even after she became blind, she telephoned a friend and suggested that they go to a movie. When Nick was admitted to the National Honor Society, she asked Heather to take her in her wheelchair to his classroom so that she could congratulate him. No wonder the students voted her "Schoolwide Favorite." The packed church at her funeral was abundant testimony that indeed she in her love for life was everyone's favorite.

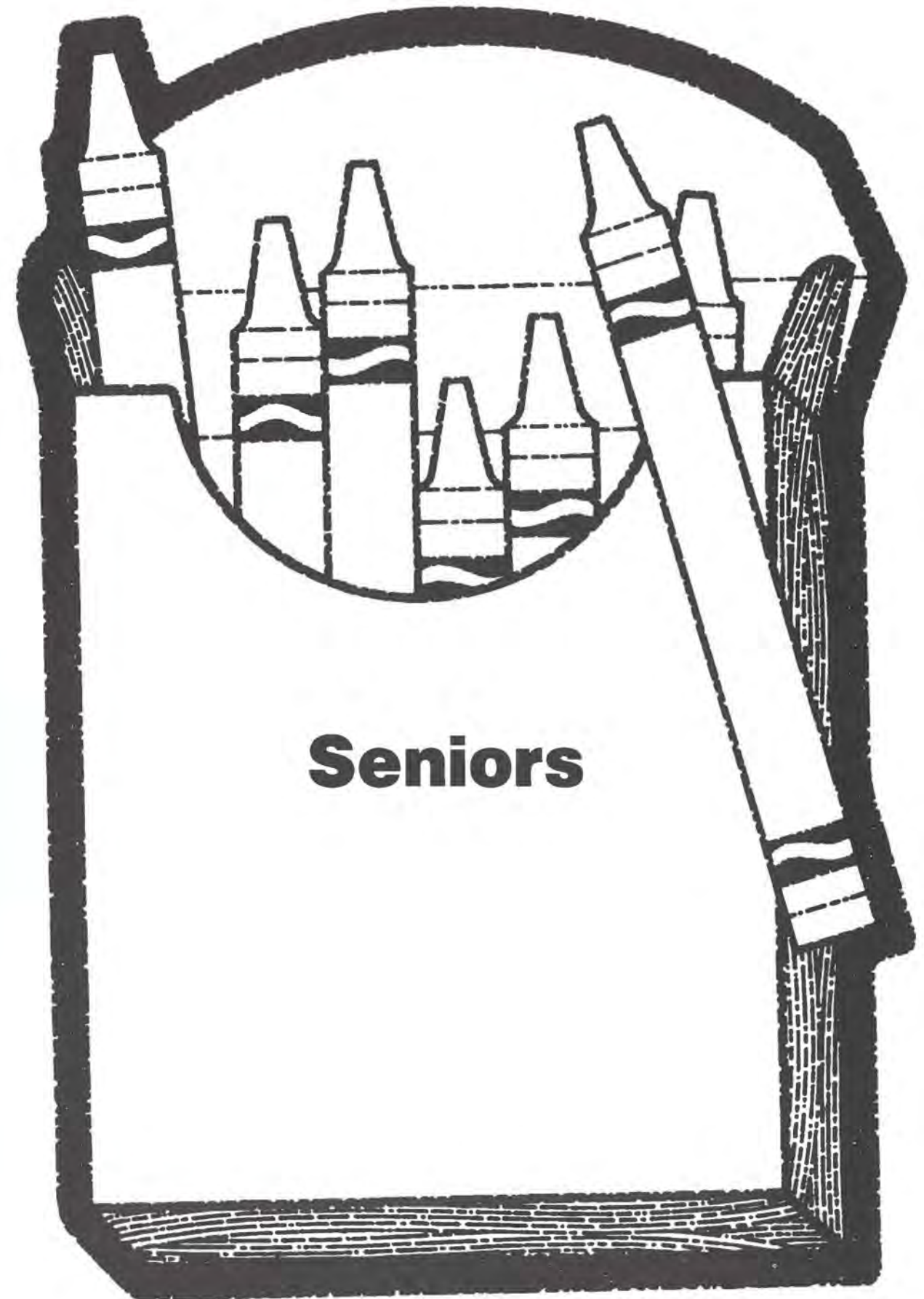

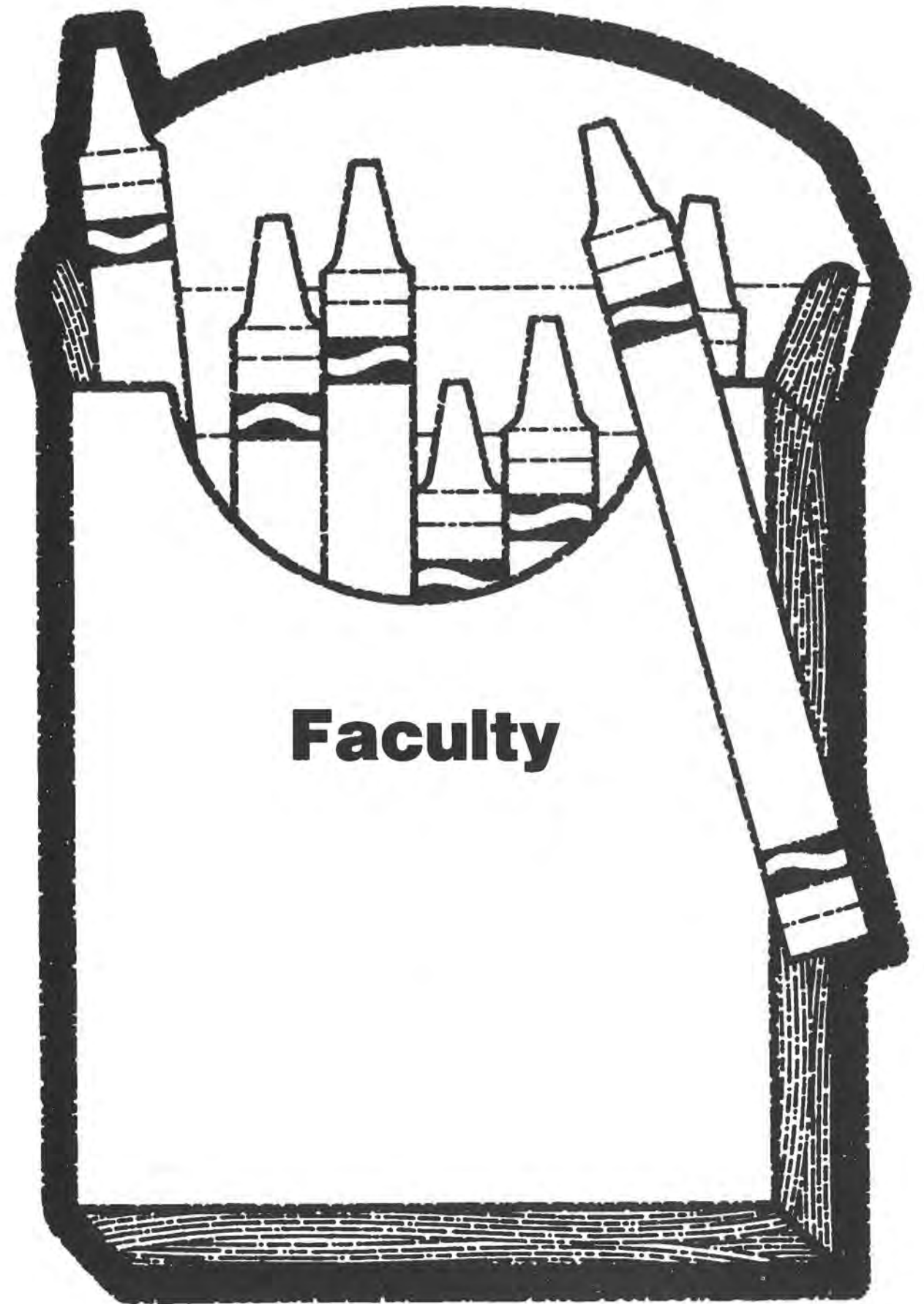
Color Us Talented.

Anderson Cancer Center. The program is run by volunteers from Texas and Louisiana, and is headed by Karen Harrison. To some, this may not seem so big, but out of all the many cards drawn by patients, thirty are picked to be voted on. Out of these thirty, only about fifteen are printed. The cards are not always printed the year they are drawn, either. Chris was nine when he drew his card, which displays great ability for so young an age. Chris claims no particular inspiration for the card design. He says that he drew the first thing that came to his mind when the people told him to draw a card. The card took Chris only two or three hours to complete. It was not hard for him to do, but was rather something to keep busy with while at the hospital. Chris is modest about his talent. He acknowledges other people's compliments, but can't really say how well he draws. In his opinion, however, he marks personal improvement within the last year or so. Chris, the only person from Corpus Christi featured this year, was recognized by local television and the *Caller-Times*. He was flattered, but felt self-conscious and somewhat embarrassed. At that time he was going through chemotherapy; and his hair was falling out and his face was puffy. These are both side effects. He feels, though, that "it added some background to the situation."



For the first year in its history, Driscoll Children's Hospital sold Christmas cards as a fund raiser. These weren't normal Christmas cards, however. The artists were patients at the hospital. One of our own seniors, Amy Laudadio, was one of the artists. All the patients at the hospital were asked to submit a drawing to a committee. The committee chose eight drawings to be made into cards; Amy's was among those few. The money made from those cards was used to benefit the children at the hospital. Amy is very modest about her ability to draw, but does boast that one day she'll have her own fashion line!

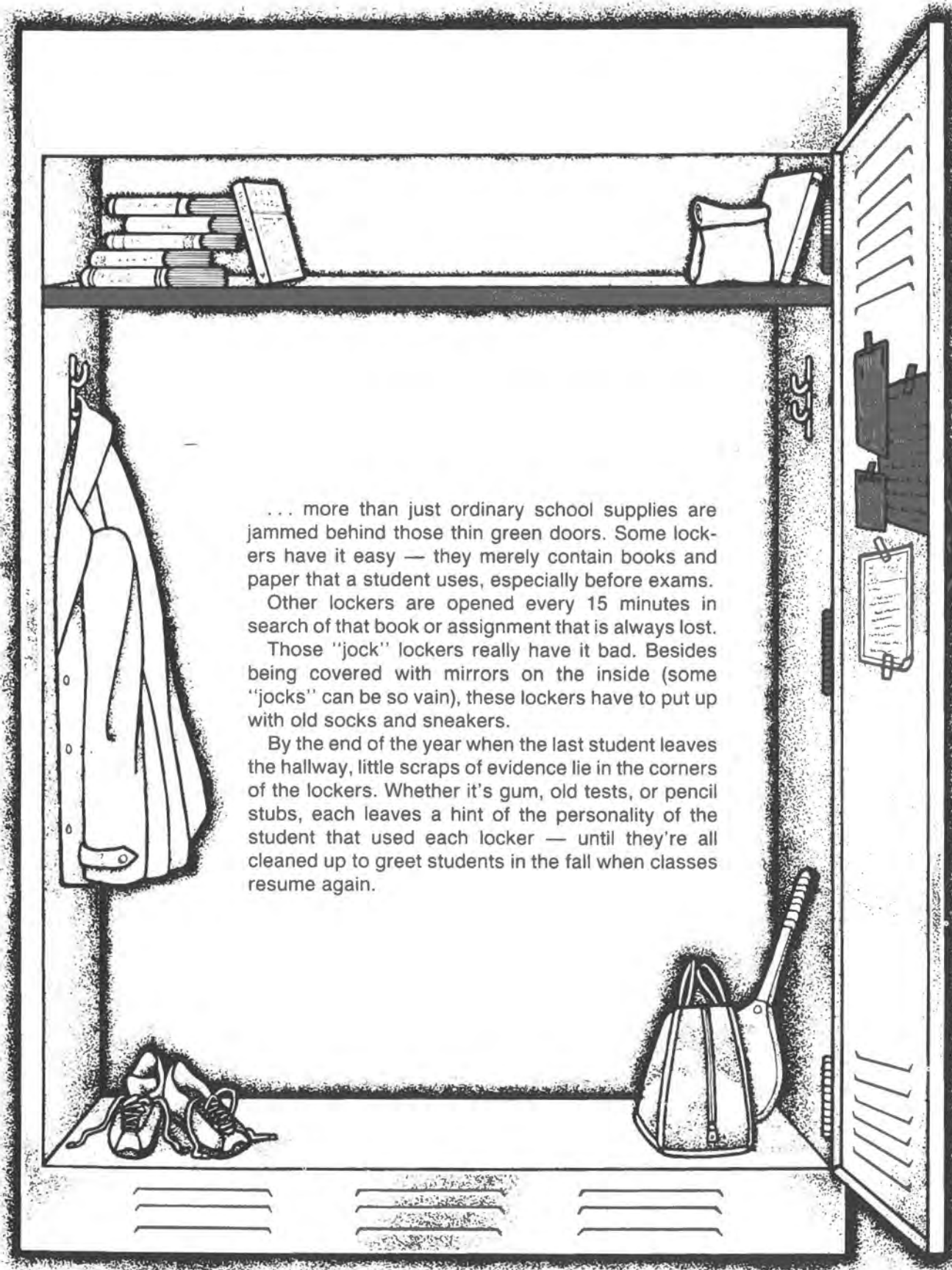

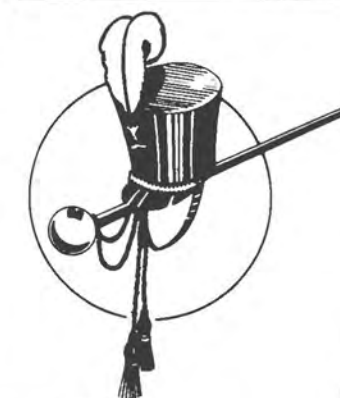

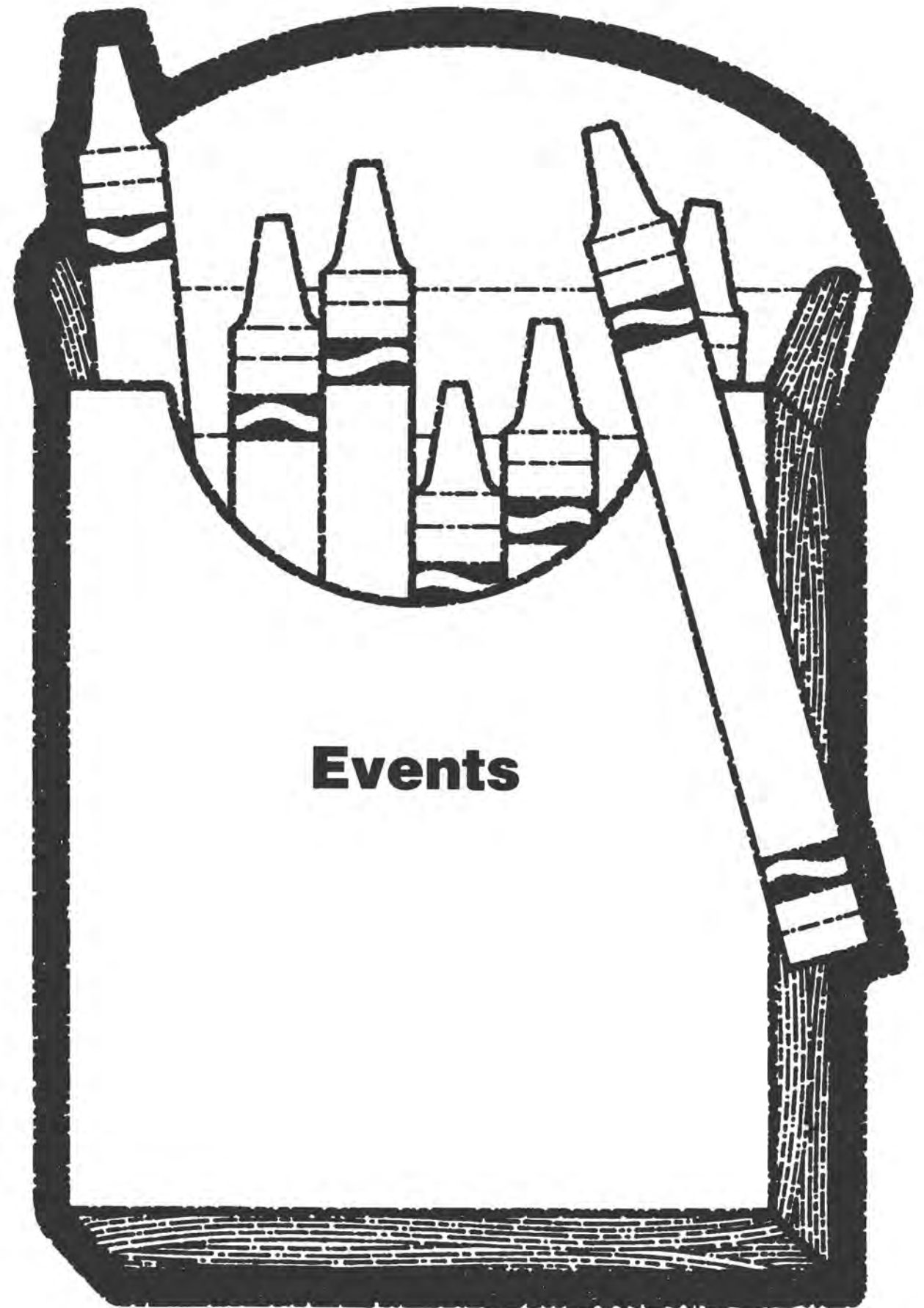




It's over.

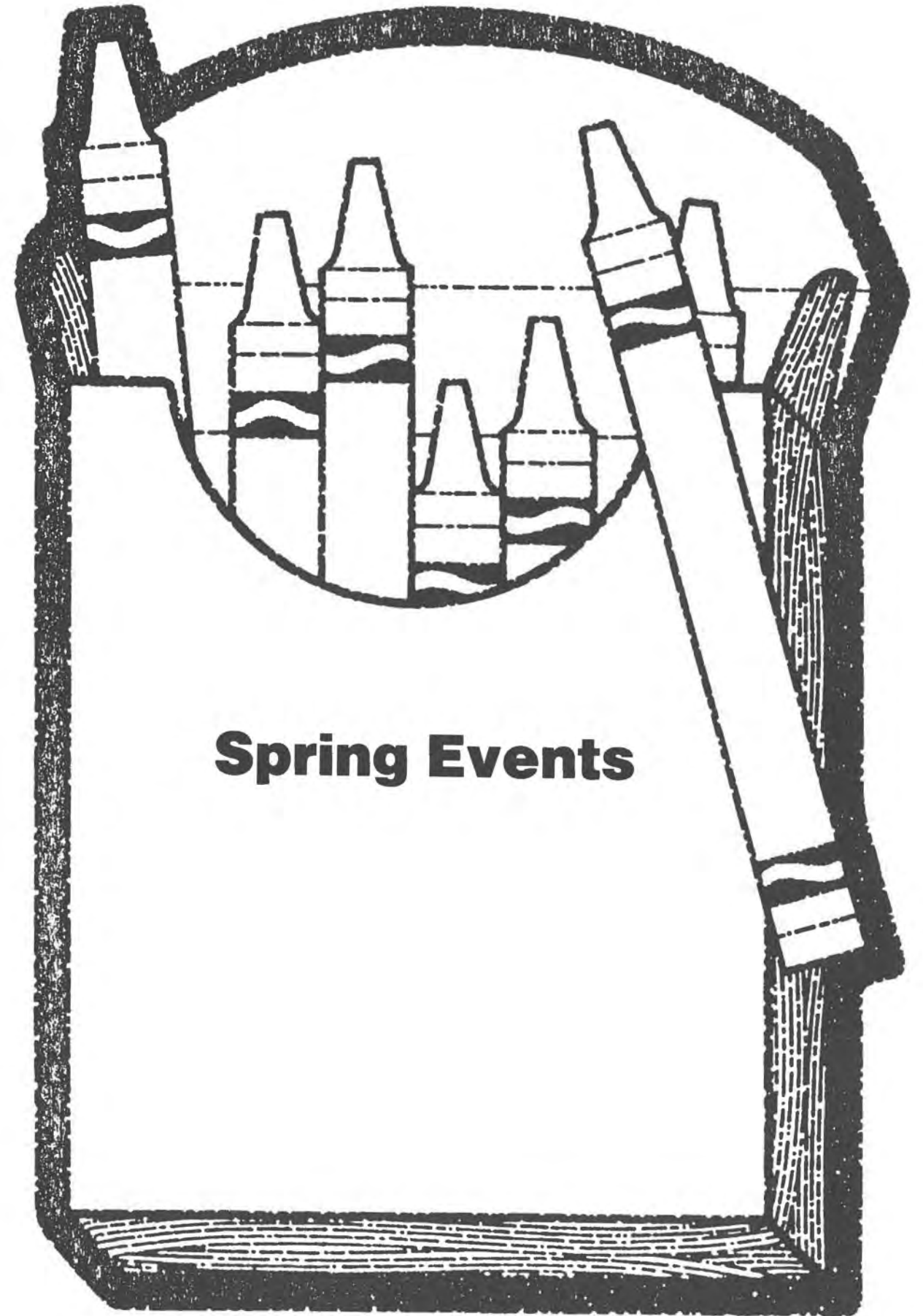
Highlighters

The Class of 1989 will always be remembered as a high-spirited group of young people, making the best of their high school years.

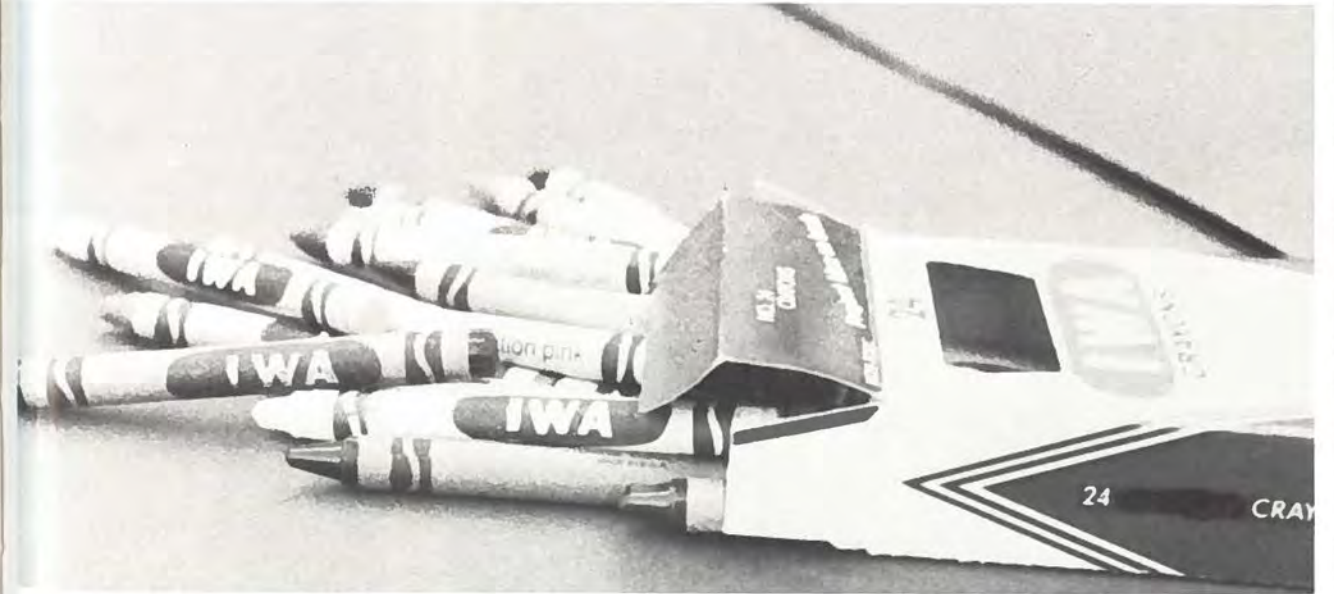

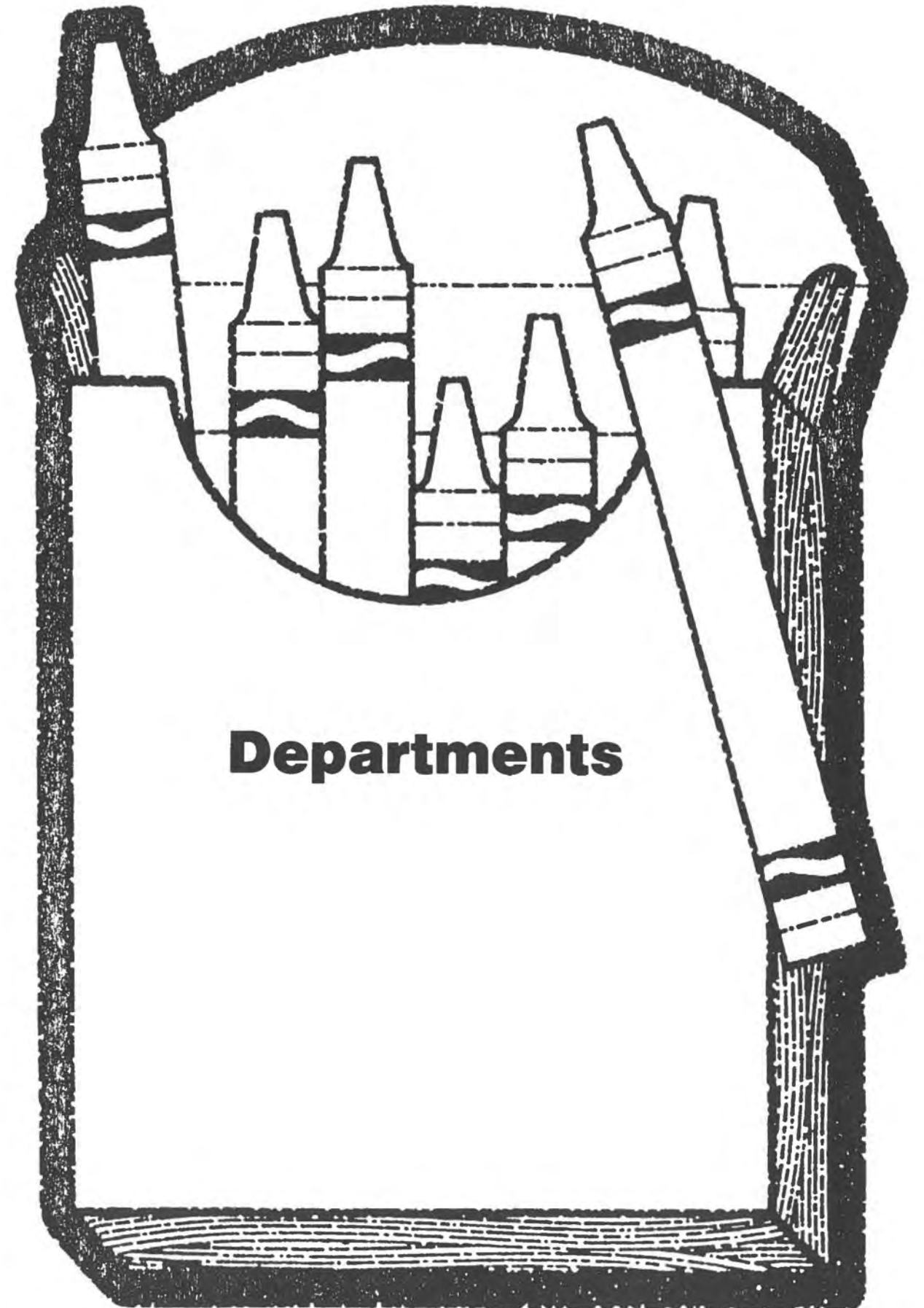

Counseling

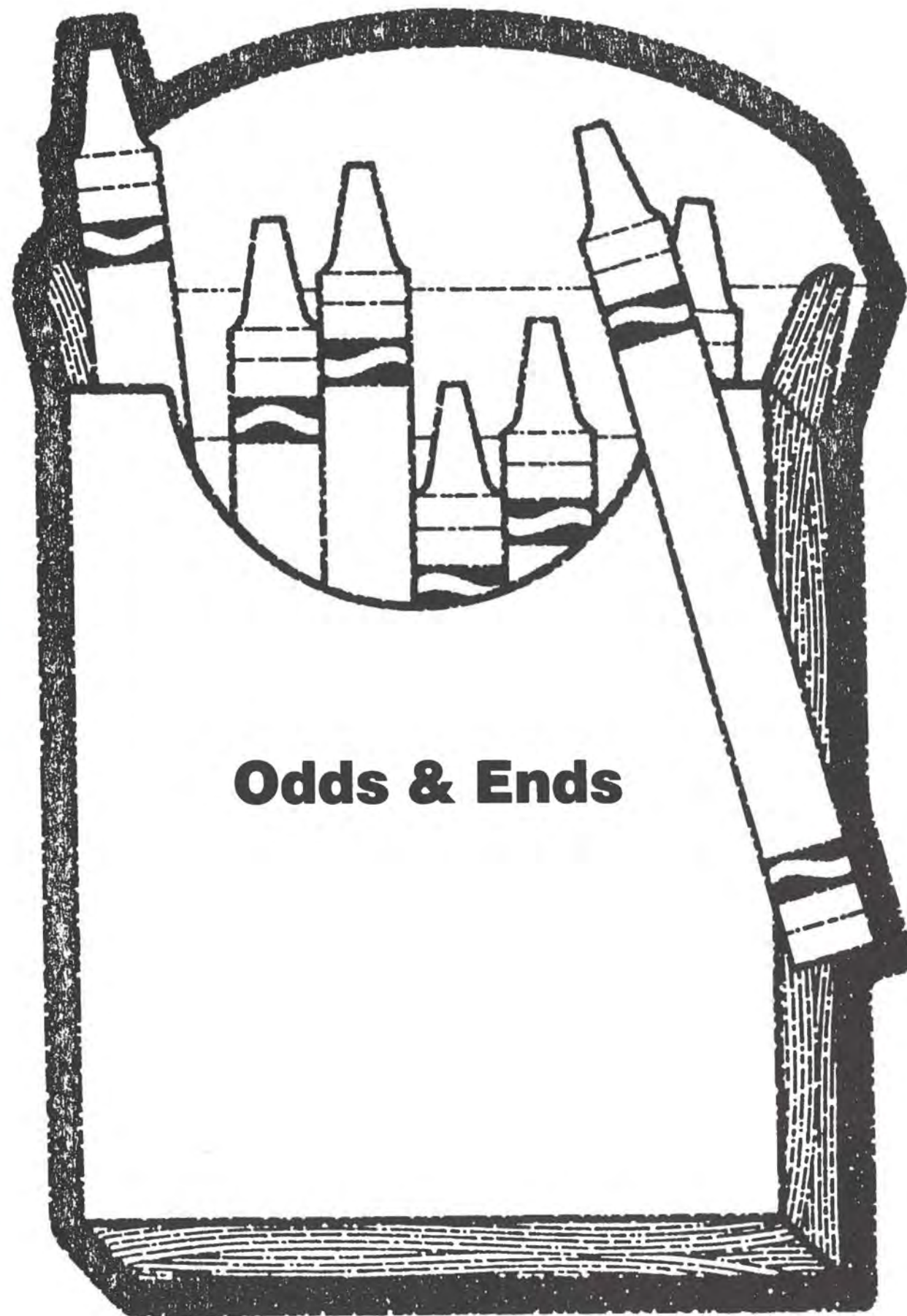

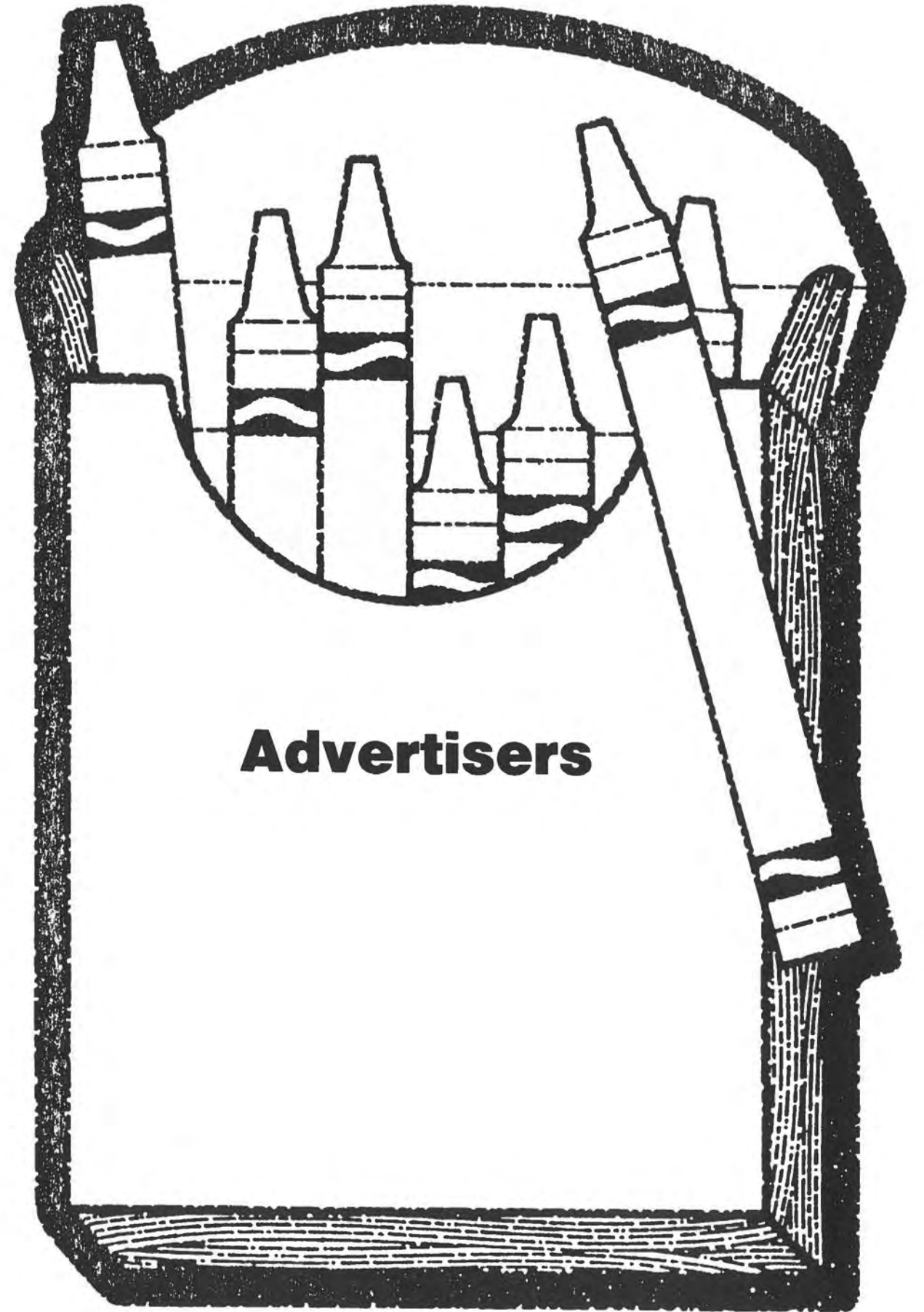
