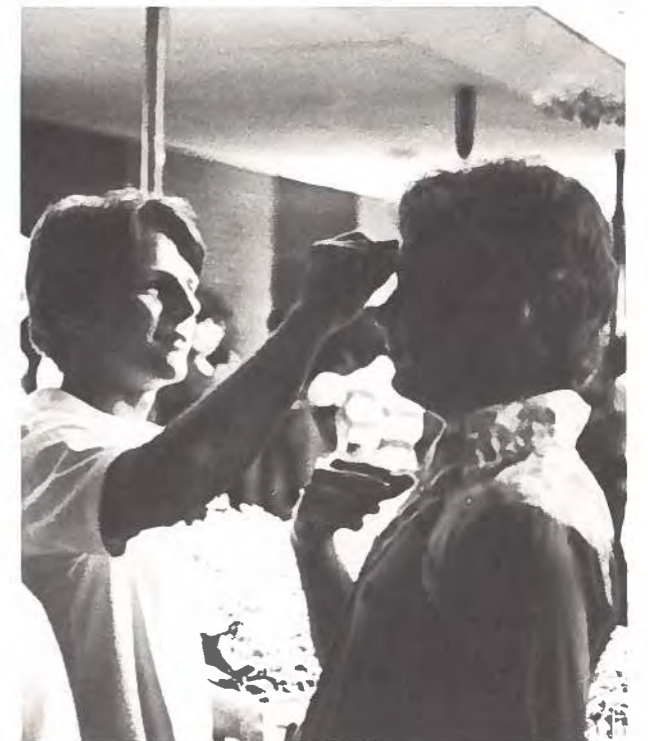

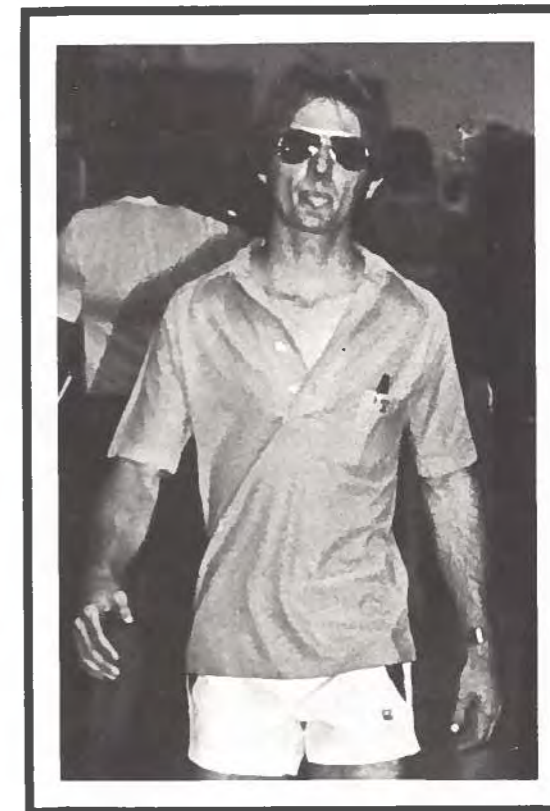

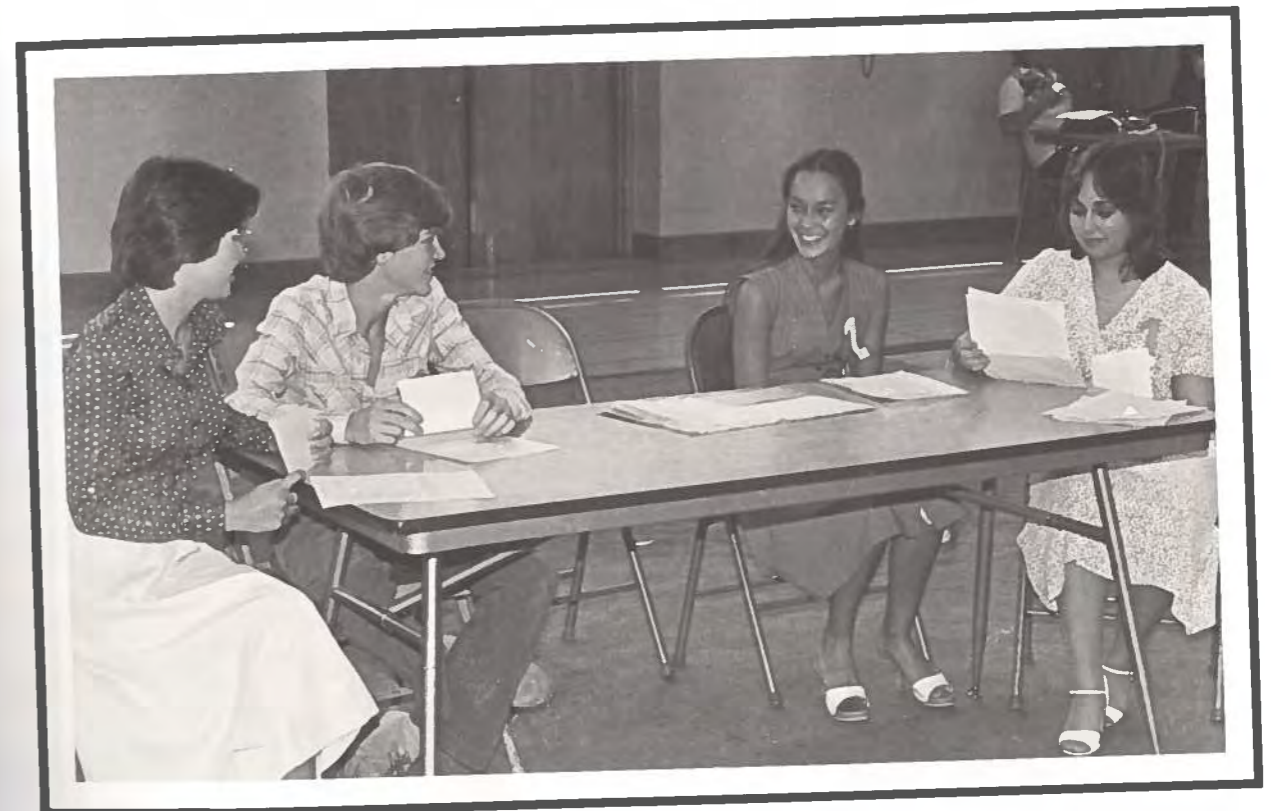

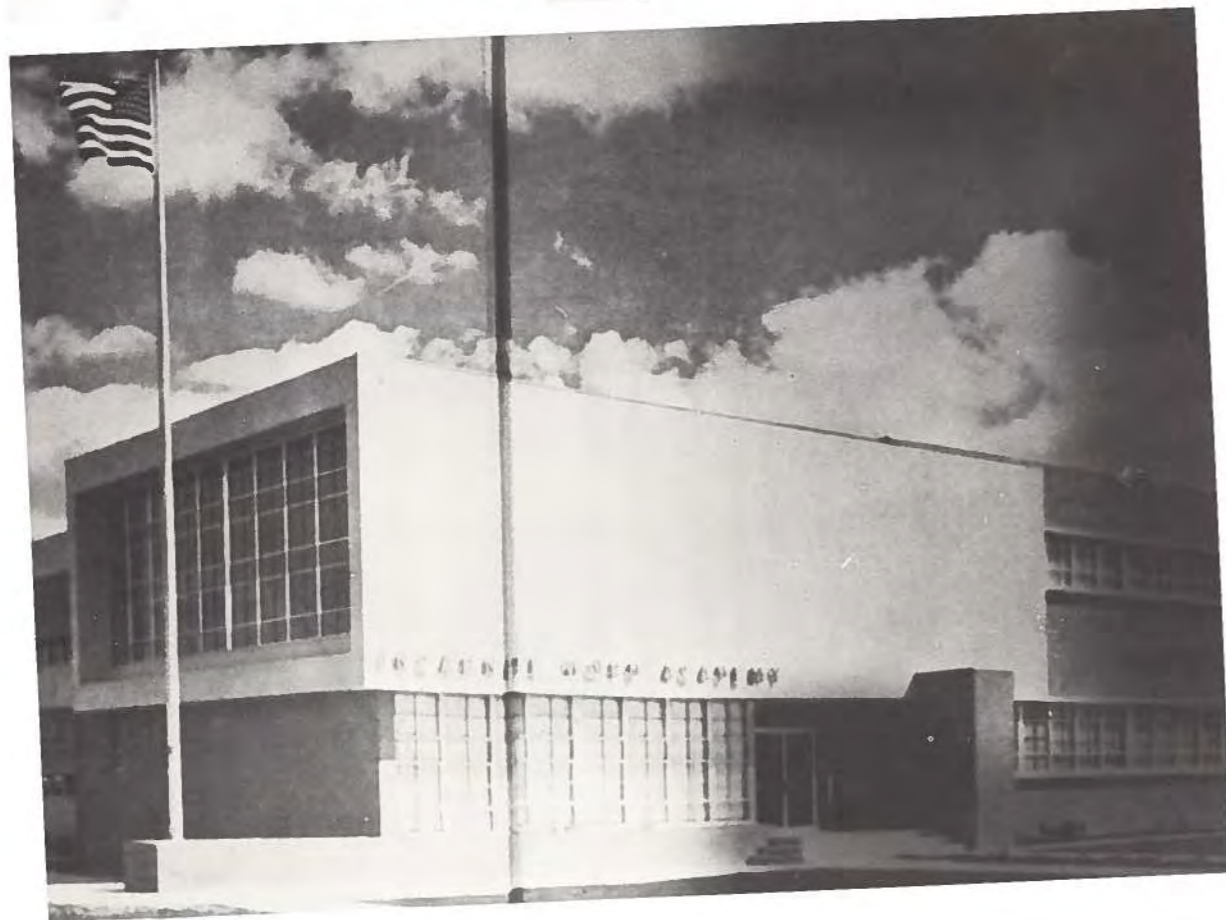

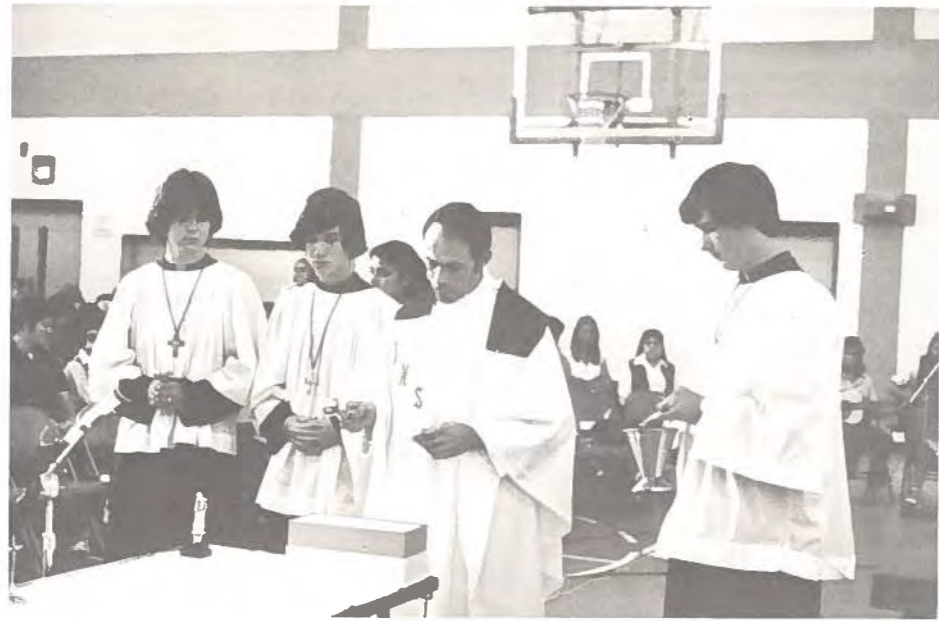

PASF members also attended the state convention in San Antonio.



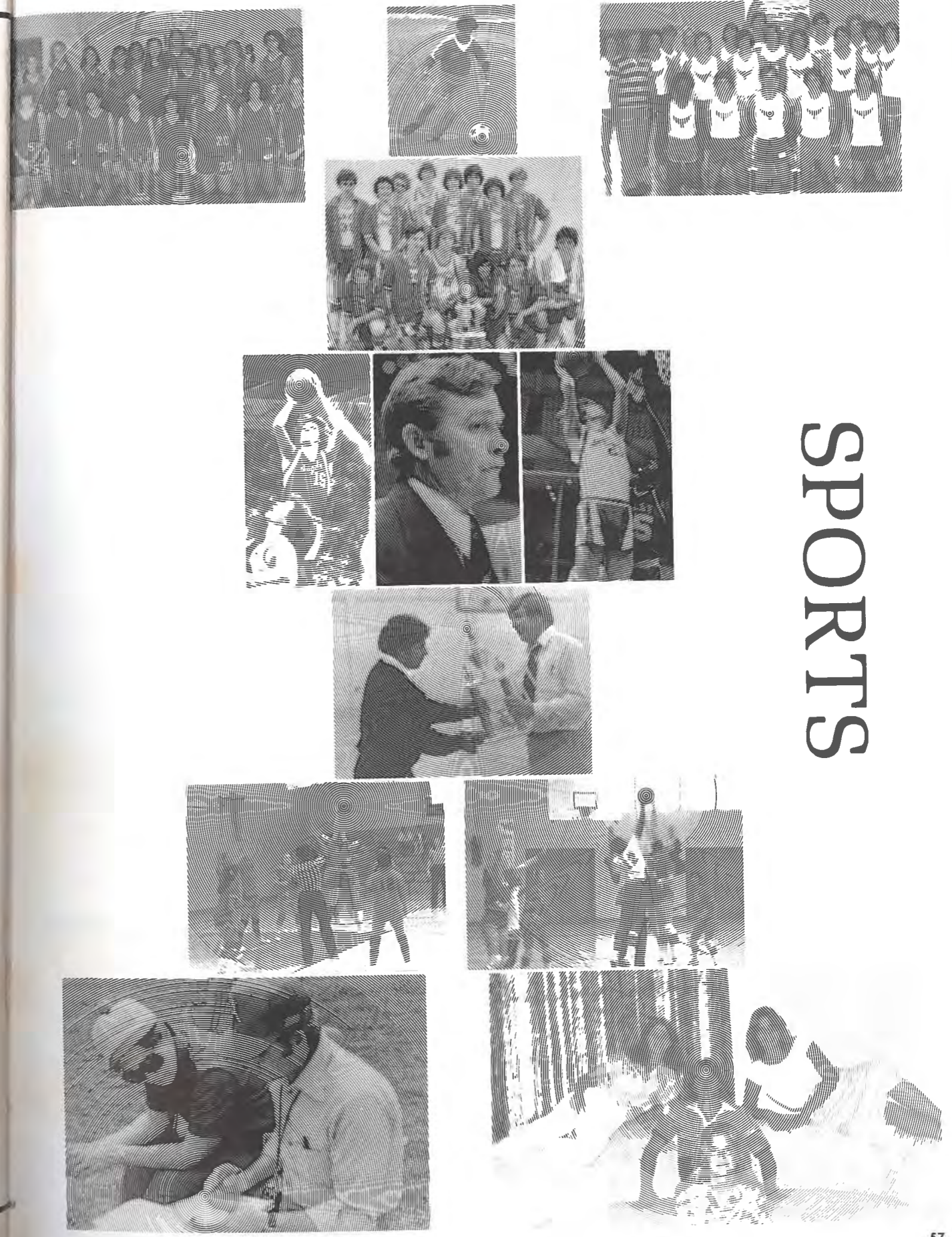

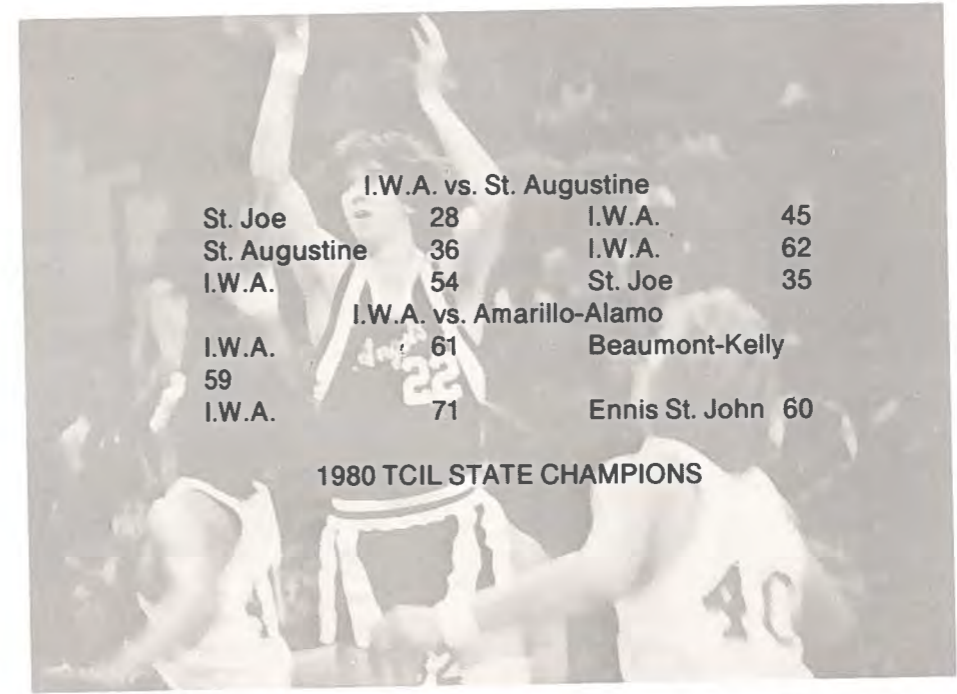

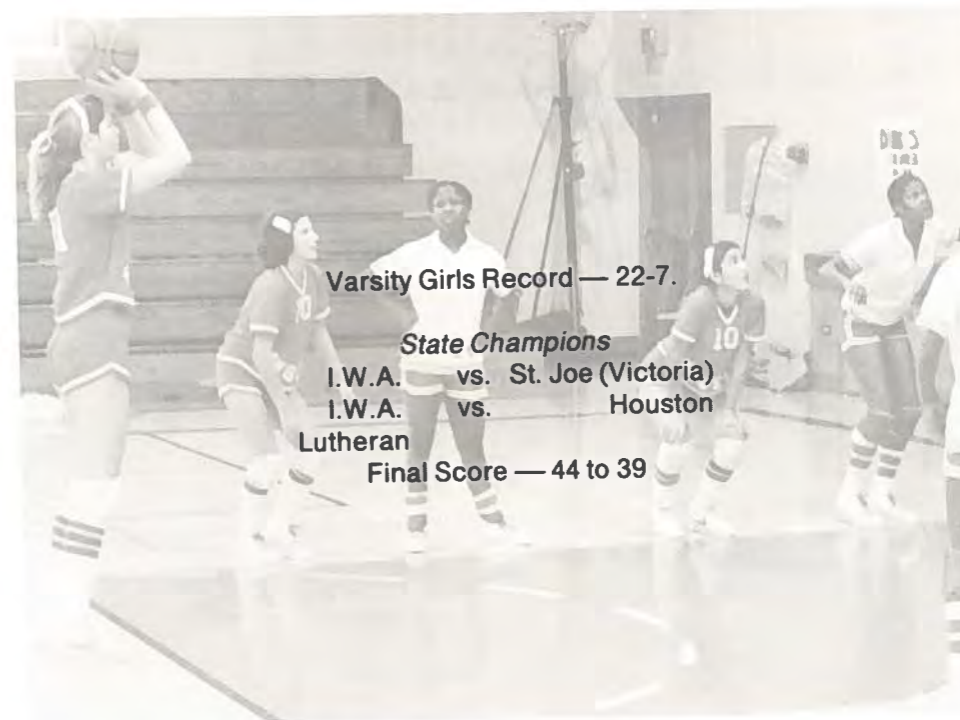

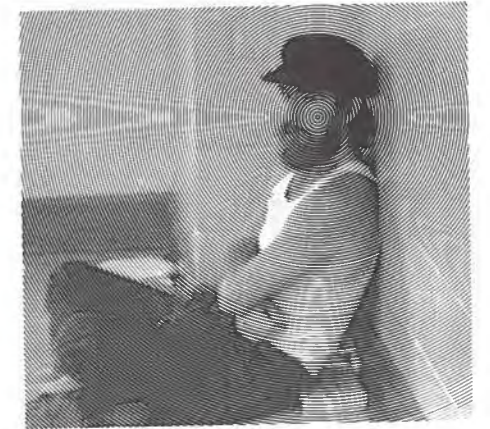
