

MANUFACTURING PATHWAY LEADS TO CAREER READINESS

Centennial High School launched an expansion of its manufacturing classes, creating a pathway to entry-level jobs that pay high, livable wages. Students gain real-world experience thanks to partnerships with local industries that are helping pave the way to preparing students for careers in the trades.

A FEW HIGHLIGHTS FROM OUR SCHOOLS

- Anonymous, weekly staff shout-outs recognized Middle School peers for their work.
- New educational early childhood programs developed for students and parents.
- Centennial High School's Manufacturing Pathway program provides opportunities for students in career and technical education.
- The Centennial Area Learning Center and Pines School focused on Social Emotional Learning curricula which included student behavioral expectations.
- Through Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports (PBIS), students at Centerville Elementary feel loved and accepted and understand their school's values and expectations; student assemblies returned to Rice Lake Elementary to celebrate progress in making the school environment a better place for all students; Centennial Elementary students learned respect and safety.
- Blue Heron Elementary established a weekly social emotional tool to introduce common language and skills.
- Teachers and students at Golden Lake Elementary focused on AVID writing strategies in the classroom, building a portfolio by grade for teachers to share and use in classrooms. The school also focused on vertical articulation, developing a common language, expectations, and consistency for learners.

Centennial Elementary's new mascot, Champ, is helping build culture and community (and fun!) in the school.
