We have selected two applications to move forward with on PSCCN's Postsecondary Transition Demonstration Project. The first being a partnership between Fife School District, Clover Park School District, and Clover Park Technical College. The second will be a partnership with Bethel School District.

Last Chance for the Ellison Education Grants

Applications Due by March 27th

Applications are now being accepted for the "Ellison Education Grants". Grants are intended for K-12 public school teachers in Washington State. The Ellison Foundation has awarded 52 grants and \$218,000 to Washington State teachers over the past four years. The Ellison Foundation will award grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$10,000 in the spring of 2021 for use during the 2021-2022 school year.

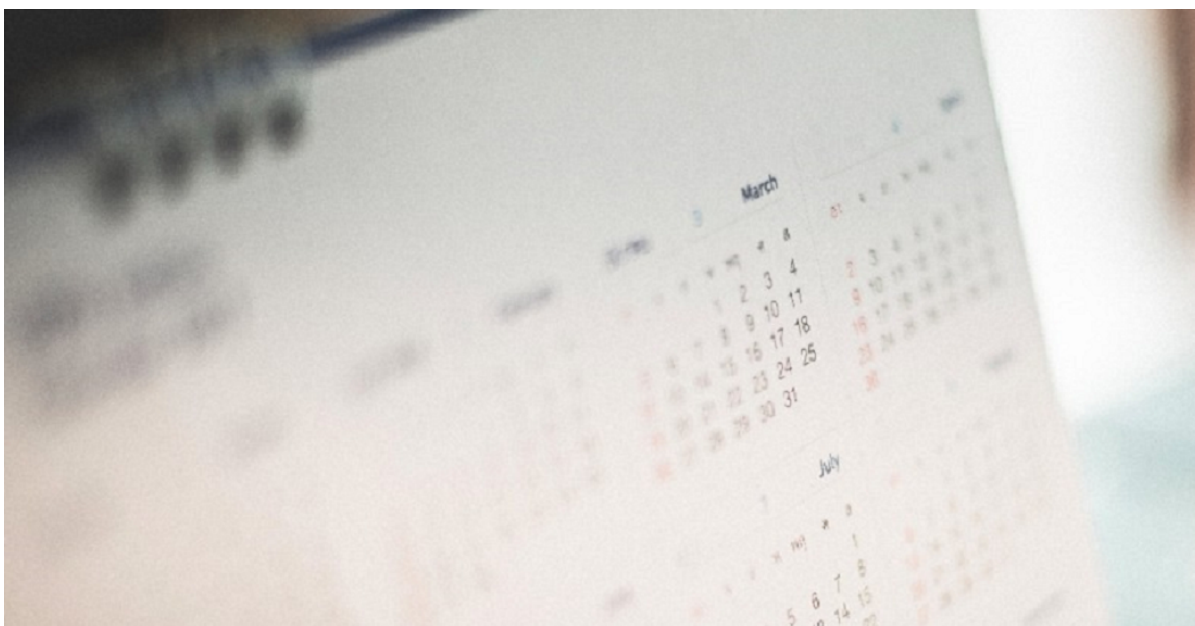
