SCHOOL MEALS AT HMS Breakfast: Breakfast is free for all students.

Lunch: Students with PAID meal status will be charged \$3.00 for lunch. Students with FREE or REDUCED-PRICE meal status will receive lunch at no cost.

Charging for lunch will begin the first day of school. Households should submit a <u>free and reduced-price</u> <u>meal application</u> as soon as possible to determine eligibility and avoid unpaid meal charges. Hamden Public Schools uses the secure and convenient <u>MySchoolBucks</u> meal account and payment system. CHROMEBOOKS & CHARGERS It continues to be busy in the library media center. By the end of school tomorrow, Mrs. Kraemer and Mrs. McCulley will have assigned every seventh grade student a Chromebook and a charger. Our eighth grade students should have a Chromebook, and new students will get one this week.

Chromebooks must come to school charged every day. There

are no "loaners" for students to use during the school day. Parents, please work with your child to establish routines for charging the school Chromebook every evening. If they forget their Chromebook at home or do not charge it, they will miss out on learning experiences. If a student lost his or her charger, they can purchase a replacement for \$25. Parents and teachers will work together to teach and reinforce Chromebook expectations.

HMS GRADING PRACTICES

When teachers grade an assignment or assessment, their purpose is to determine how students are performing with grade level standards and give feedback to students, as well as their parents. Aligned with our goal to create a positive, equitable learning experience for all of our students, we are committed to following a common grading practice across both grade levels and all disciplines. Ms. Coogan, school principal, will review the revised grading practices during Open House. In addition, we will share reminders in our weekly newsletter.

All HMS teachers of the same content and grade level have set up their PowerSchool gradebooks with clear categories and percentage breakdowns, such as Assignments (60%) and Assessments (40%). Teachers will score or evaluate 10-15 assignments/assessments each marking period. When they give an assignment, they will clearly state the due date. Students can submit a missing assignment within two class periods. Please note: If a student does not submit an assignment within two class periods, the grade is a zero. Teachers will evaluate assignments/assessments and enter grades in PowerSchool within seven school days from the due date. Teachers are committed to communicating performance with students and parents, especially if a student is earning a cumulative average of 69% or below in a timely manner. Teachers will also remind students of opportunities to improve grades, including completing missing assignments and utilizing opportunities for retakes on assessments. Our teachers are committed to meeting these responsibilities.

Student Responsibilities

-Be present and prepared for school and each class every day. -Actively engage in learning experience, as outlined in the Dragon Pride Classroom expectations. -Complete and submit assignments on time.

-Request, complete, and submit the HMS Retake Reflection Form to the teacher within two classes from receiving the **assessment** grade, as needed. -Monitor PowerSchool. -Advocate for extra help when struggling. -Attend office hours, as needed.

Parent/Guardian Responsibilities -Ensure your child is present and prepared for school every day. -Monitor your child's attendance. -Create and monitor a Parent Portal account in PowerSchool. -Review PowerSchool updates with your child and discuss progress and next steps.

-Teach your children to respectfully advocate for help, as needed. -Communicate with your child's teachers or team.

-Embrace opportunities to meet with your child's teachers, including conferences and family engagement events.
