





Magic moments by night 18Pt



Bring us up so that We will not always need you.










Wrench handlers get a grip on things






Color Day








Career Day gives kids the facts

If you like working with numbers, here's a good problem for you. Take a student body which averages 800 people. Figure 30 minutes of time per person for counseling about a specific career. Your job, now, is to come up with an answer in terms of what is wasted and what is gained. The answer is as follows: an average of 400 counseling hours or 66.66 working days or 13.33 weeks or 3.33 months is wasted. 
Accomplishments give rise to new image


Experienced grapplers boost team standing


Ealcon cagers prove tough competitors


Golf









Job-related classroom experience effective approach to vocational guidance
