Students work afternoons to learn *marketing and distribution*

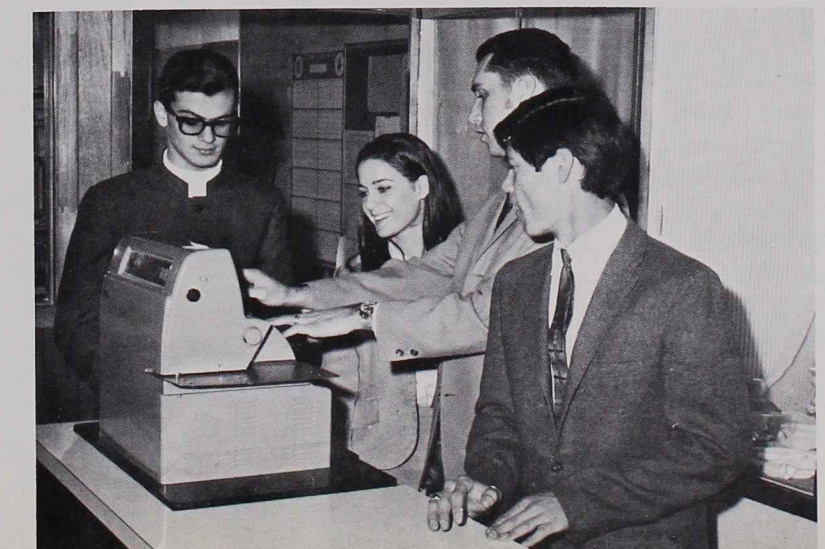

Frosh activities climaxed by assembly

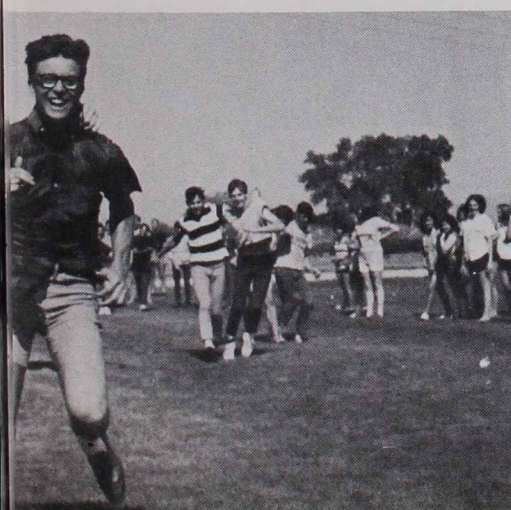
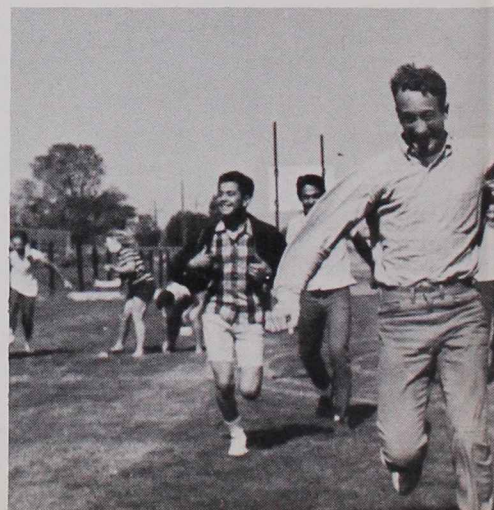

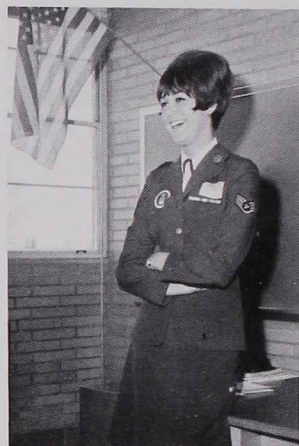




Cross country trek proves beneficial

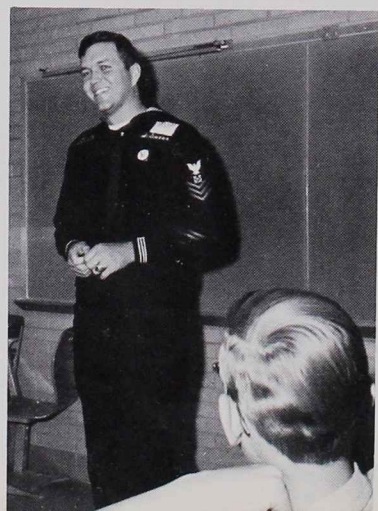

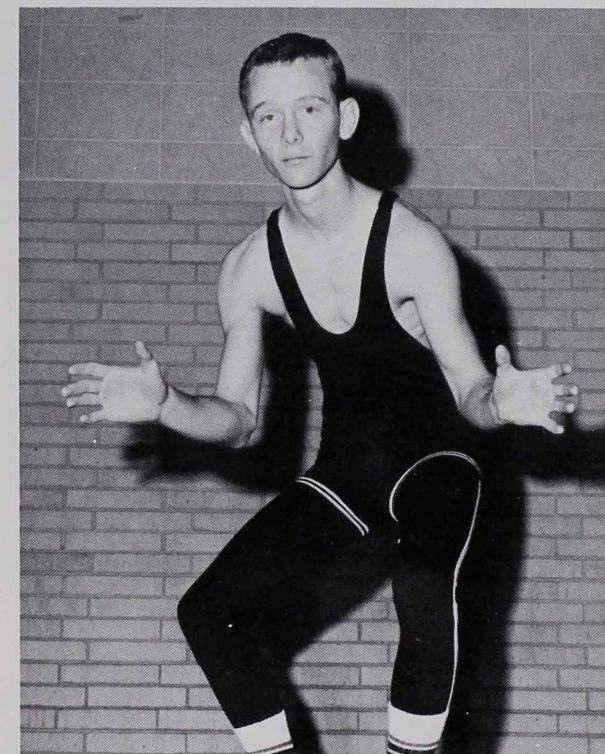
Experienced grapplers boost team standing

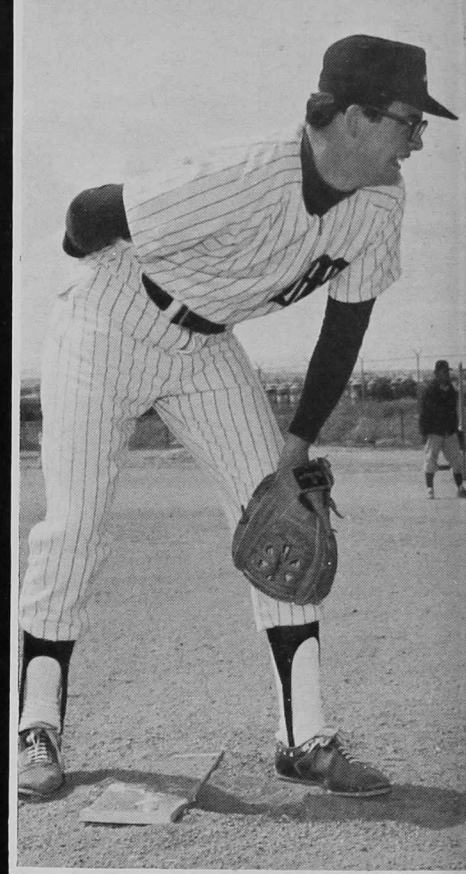
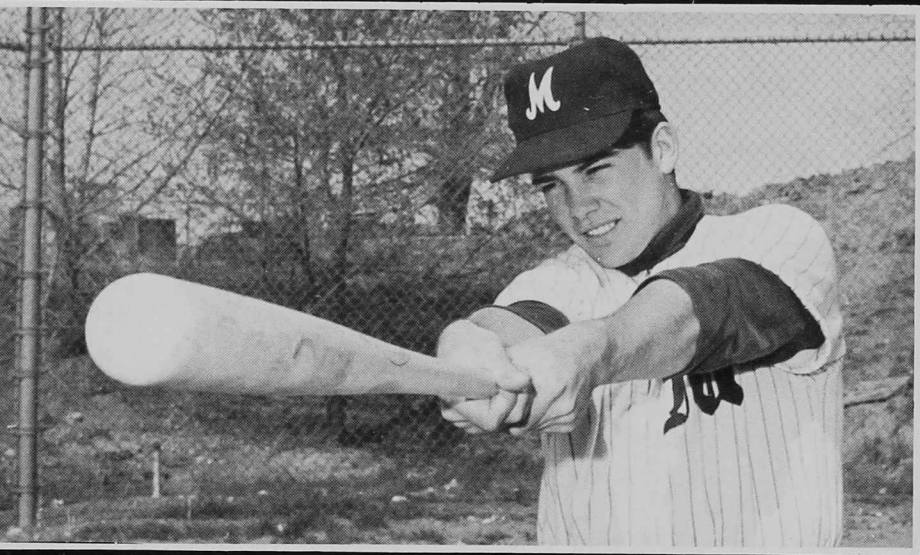


Boys Gymnastics

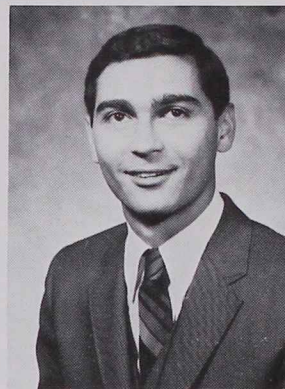
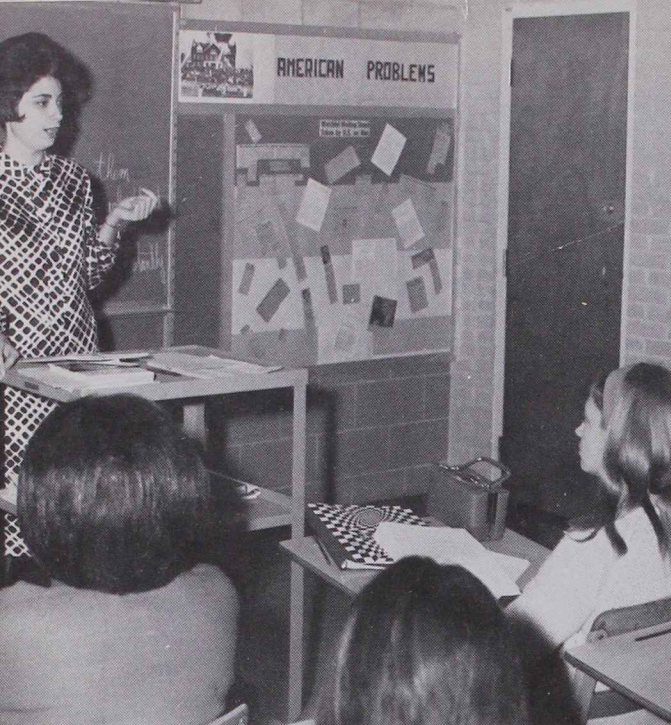




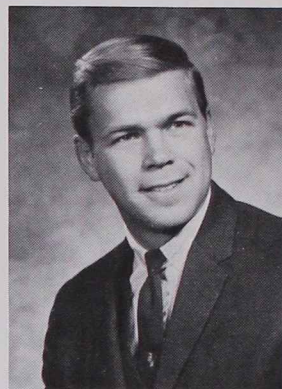
Job-related classroom experience effective approach to vocational guidance
