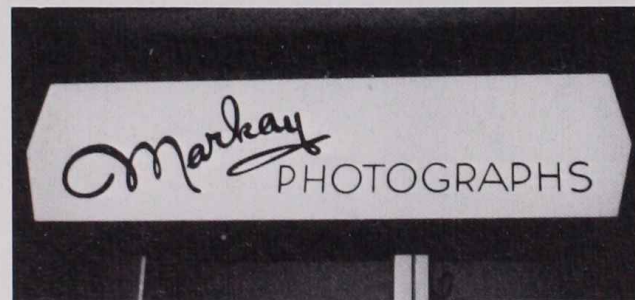




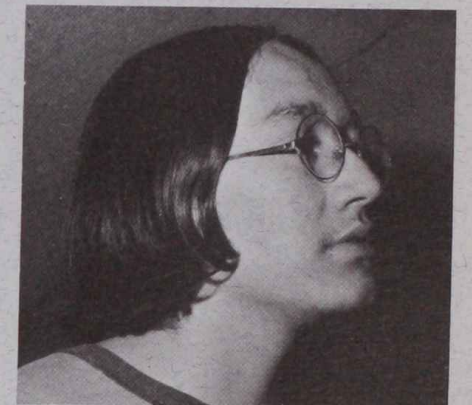
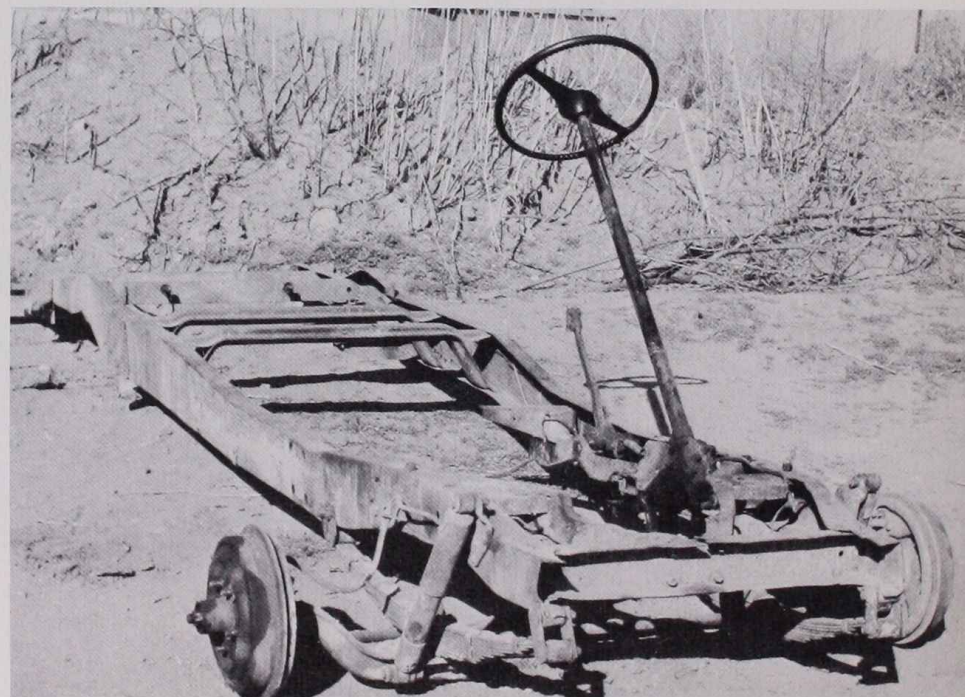


## Hangouts

## Homecoming Spirits Soar

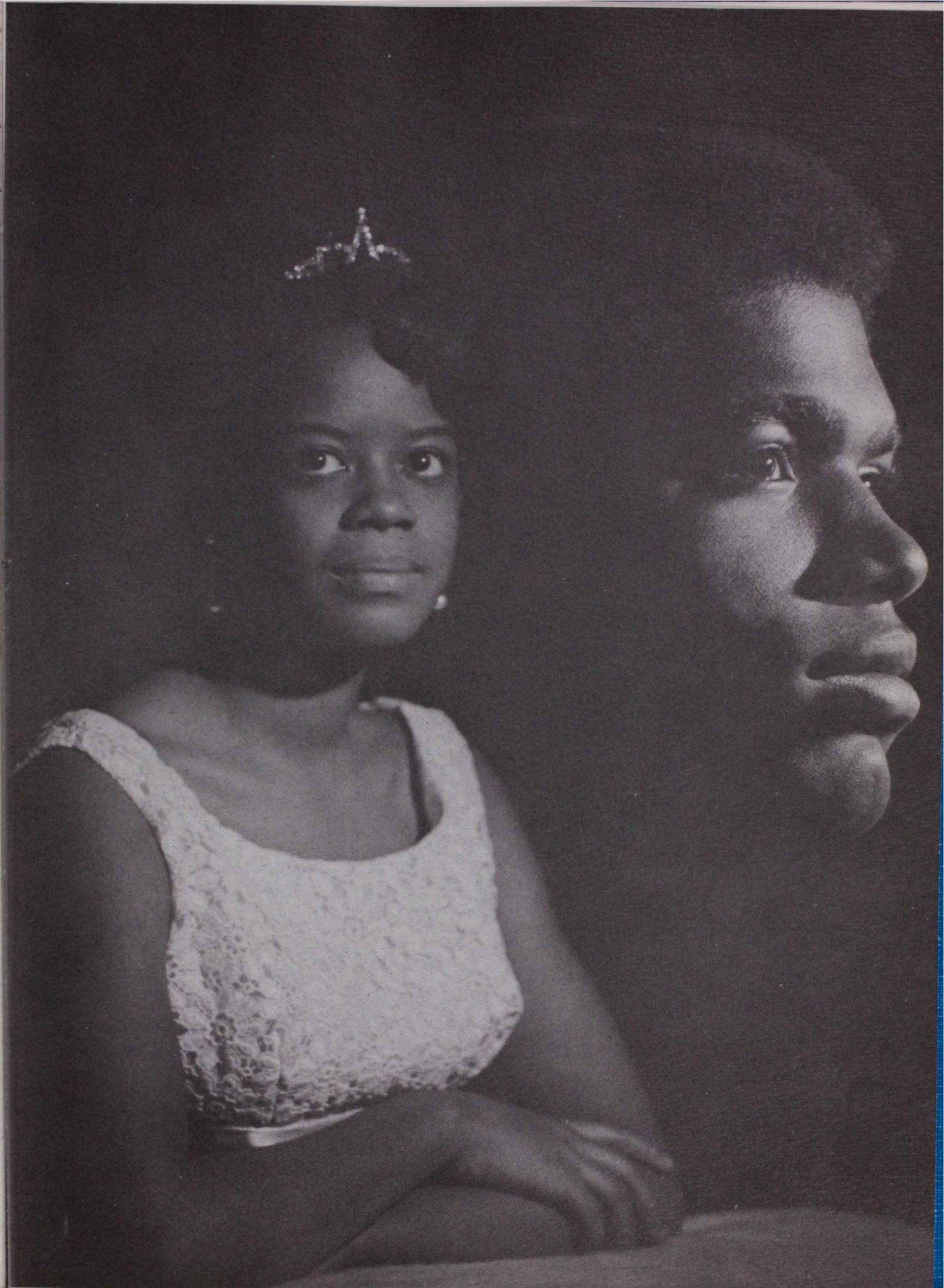


### *Determination and uncertainty . . . key words for Homecoming*

### Seniors run away with juniors' pennies

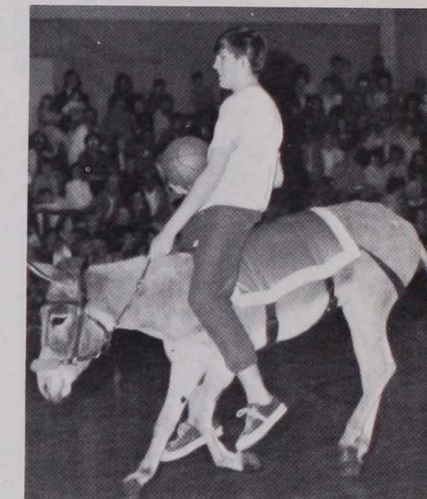
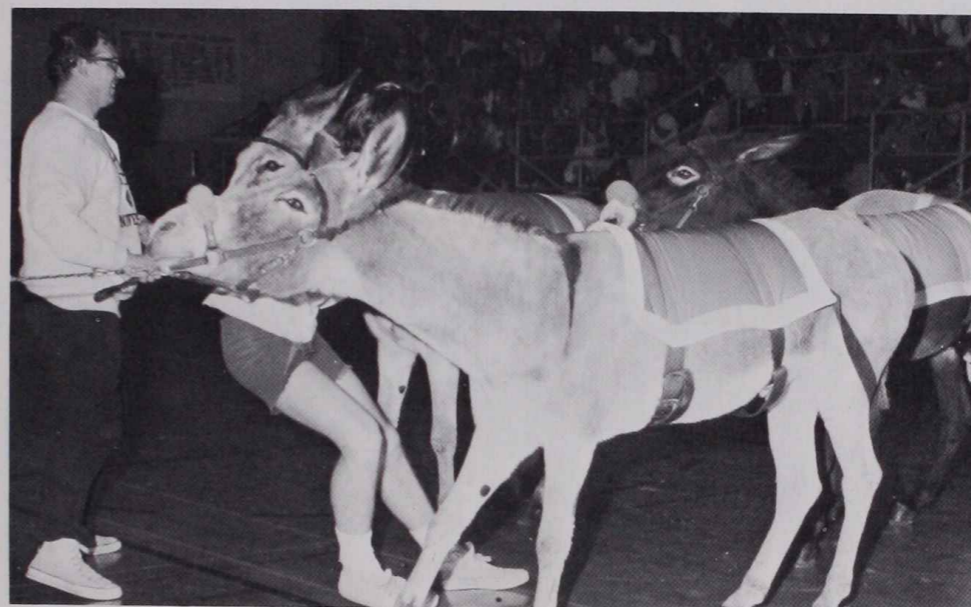
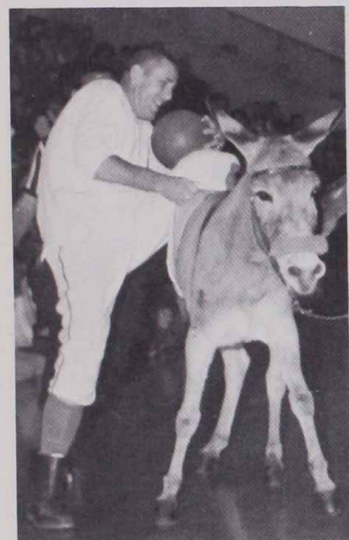
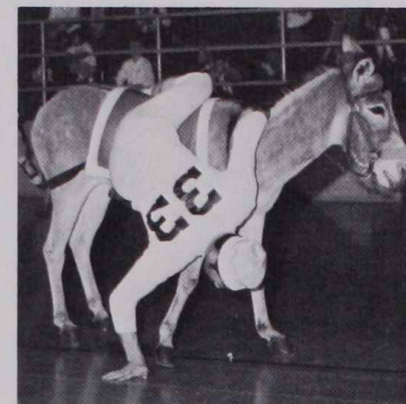
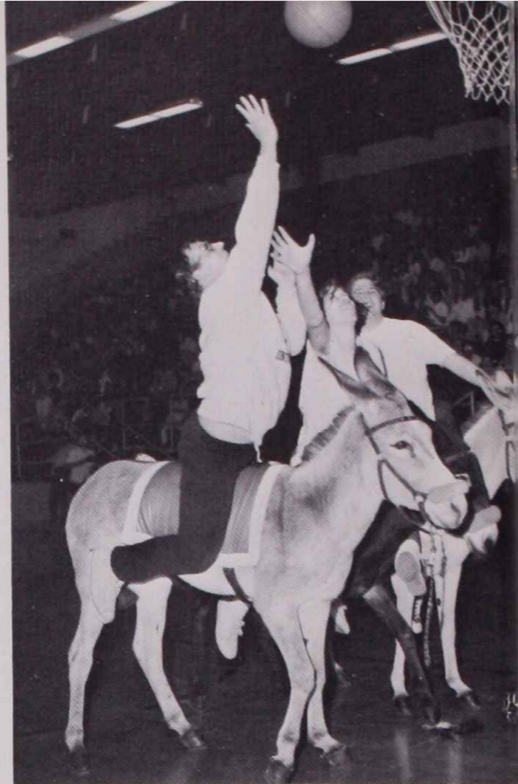
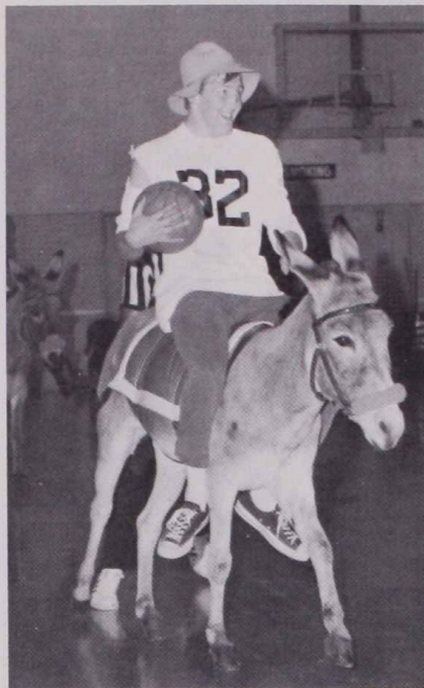
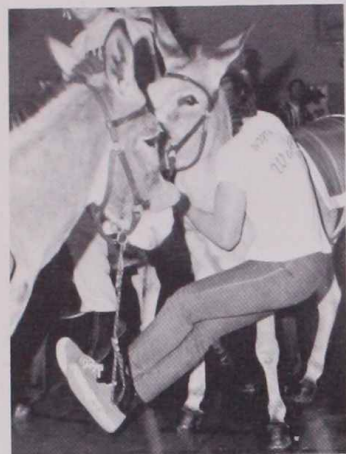

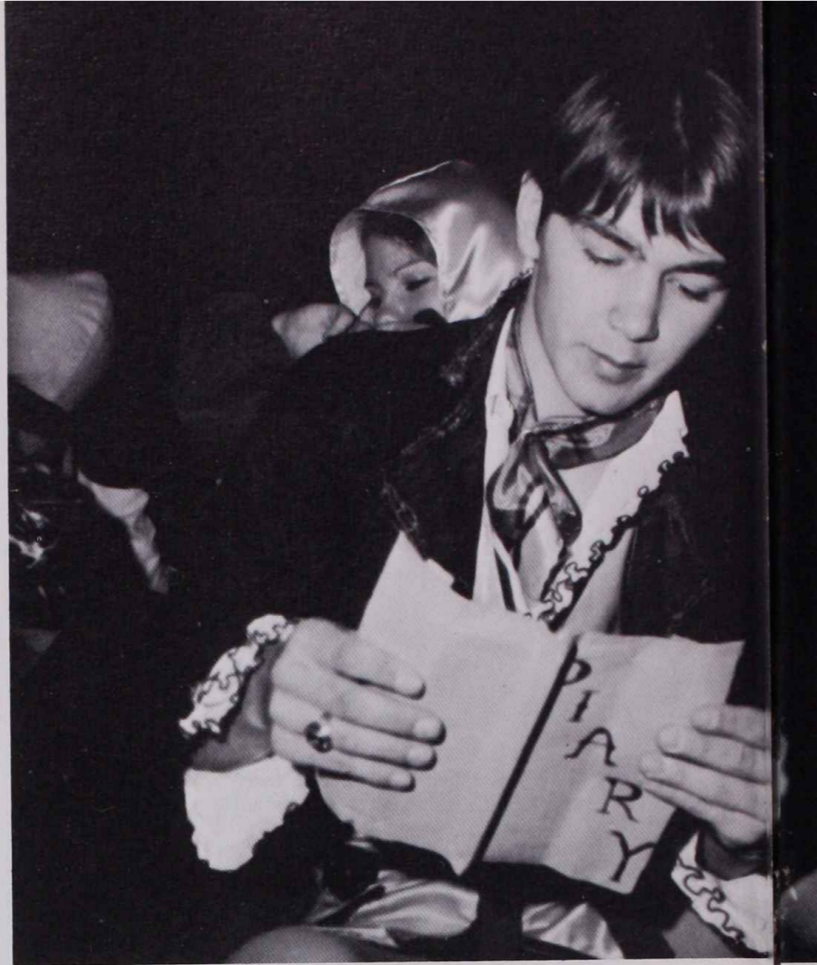
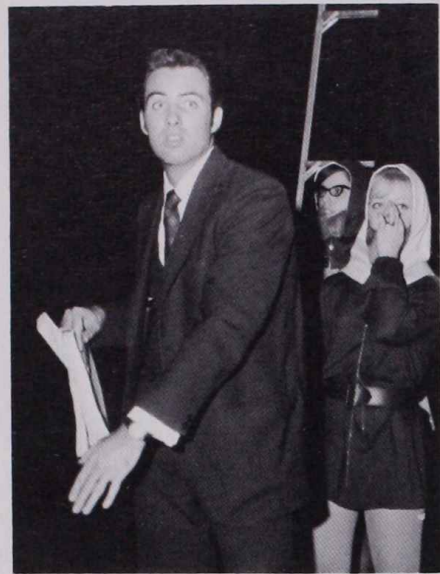




### Donkeys prove to be stubborn mules

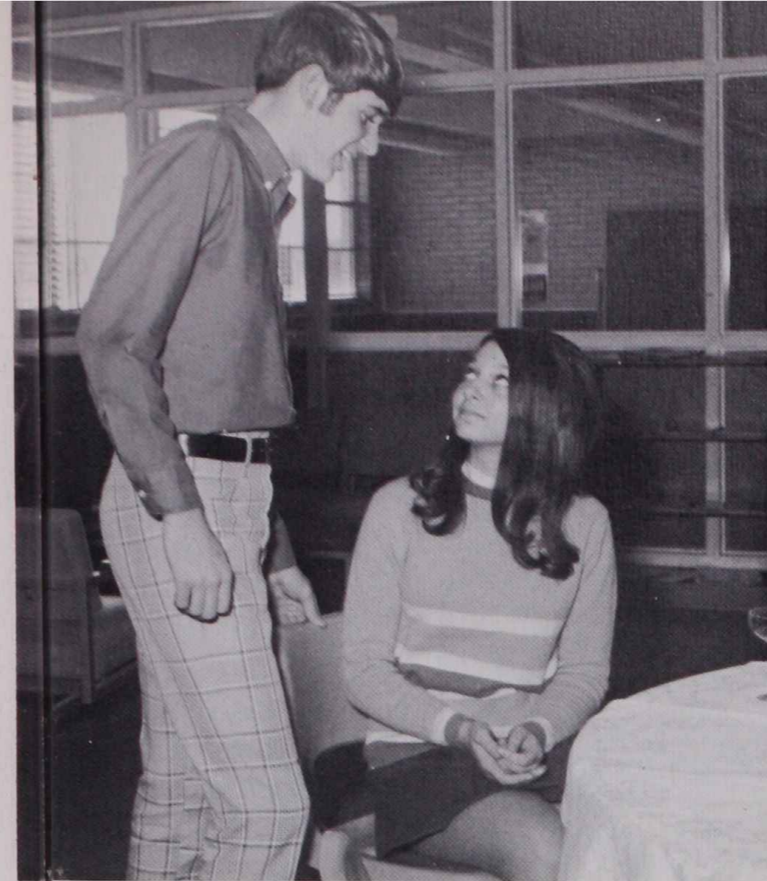


## Spanish Club
