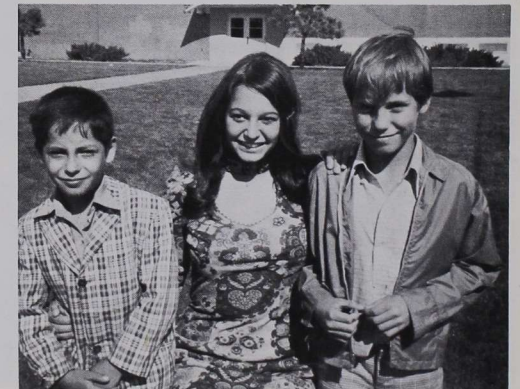
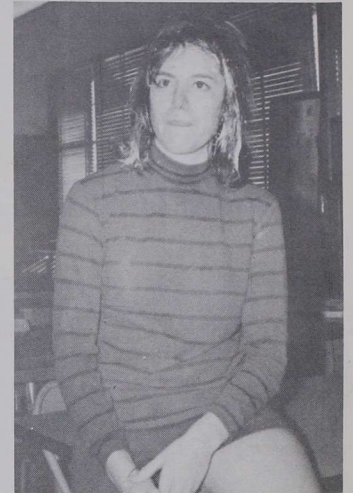

## *We've Only Just Begun . . .*

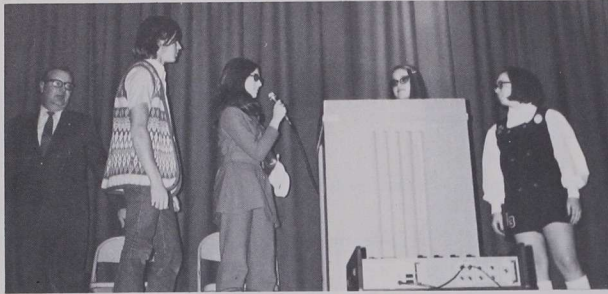

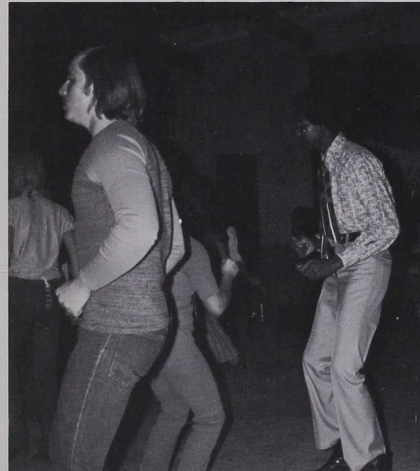

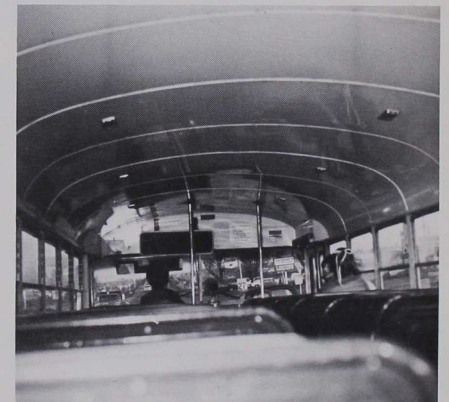

# Powder Puff Game

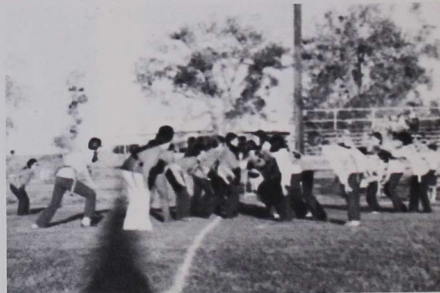

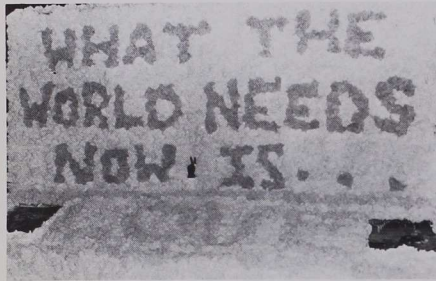

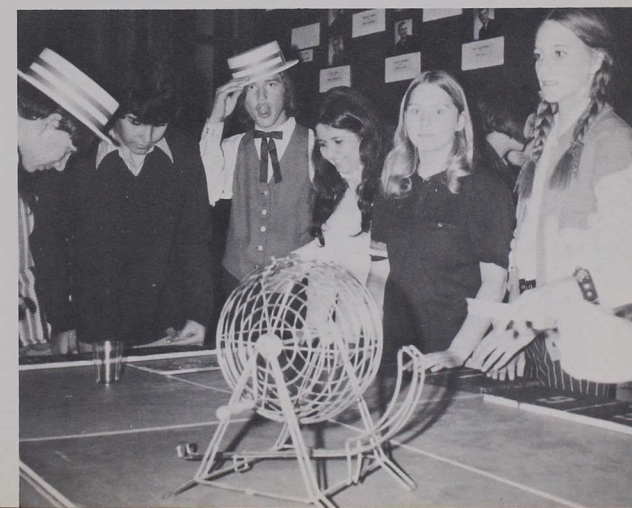




# School Spirit Week

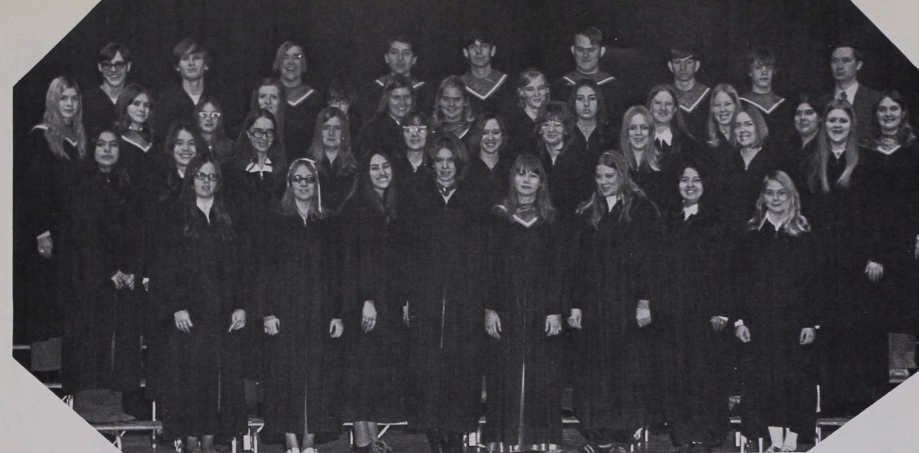

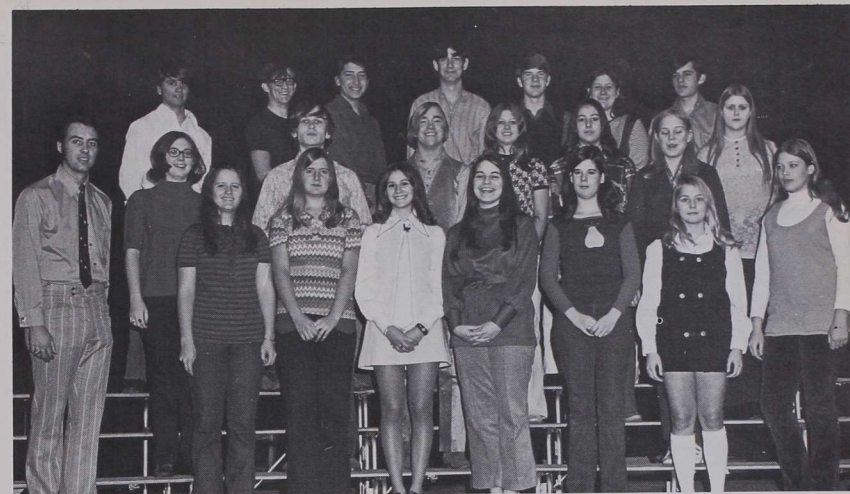
