

Auto Shop is a class of boys whose interests lie in the field of auto mechanics. In this class, boys are taught the basic functions of a car.


























After four weeks of hard work and practice, the seniors and juniors finally met on October 12 for the annual Powder Puff game.


The juniors scored the first touchdown with a fine run by Brenda James. Brenda Huntington scored the two points after the touchdown to put the juniors in the lead 8-0.

Brenda James couldn't be stopped and went on to score two more touchdowns for the juniors to put them on top 20-8.








The Frosh had been warned since their first day of school, "Beware of Welcoming Week." They laughed and joked about it all the way up to Monday, October 10.




# Cross Country


## Freshman




