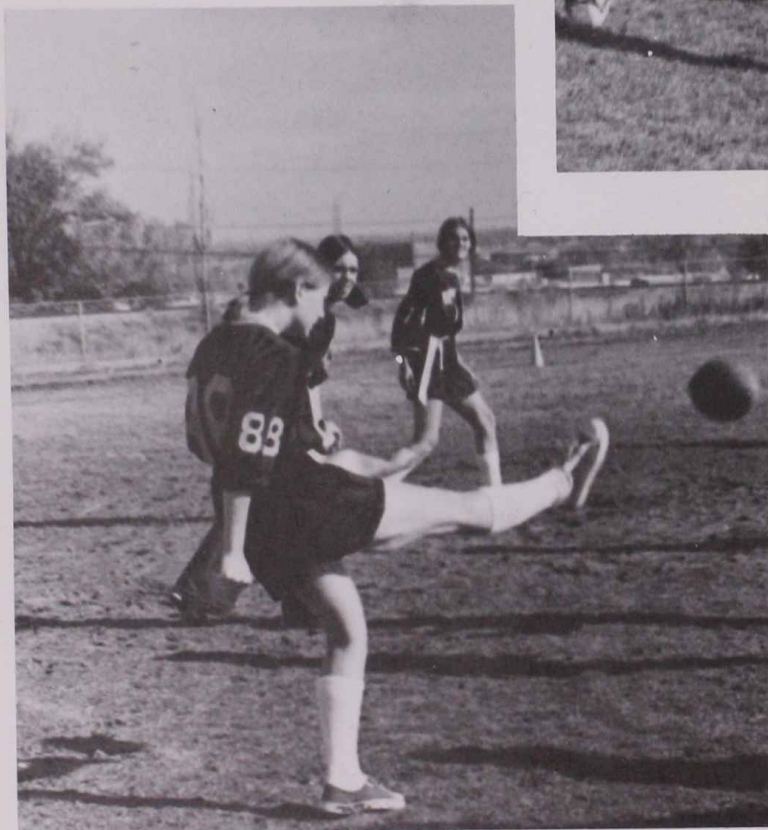

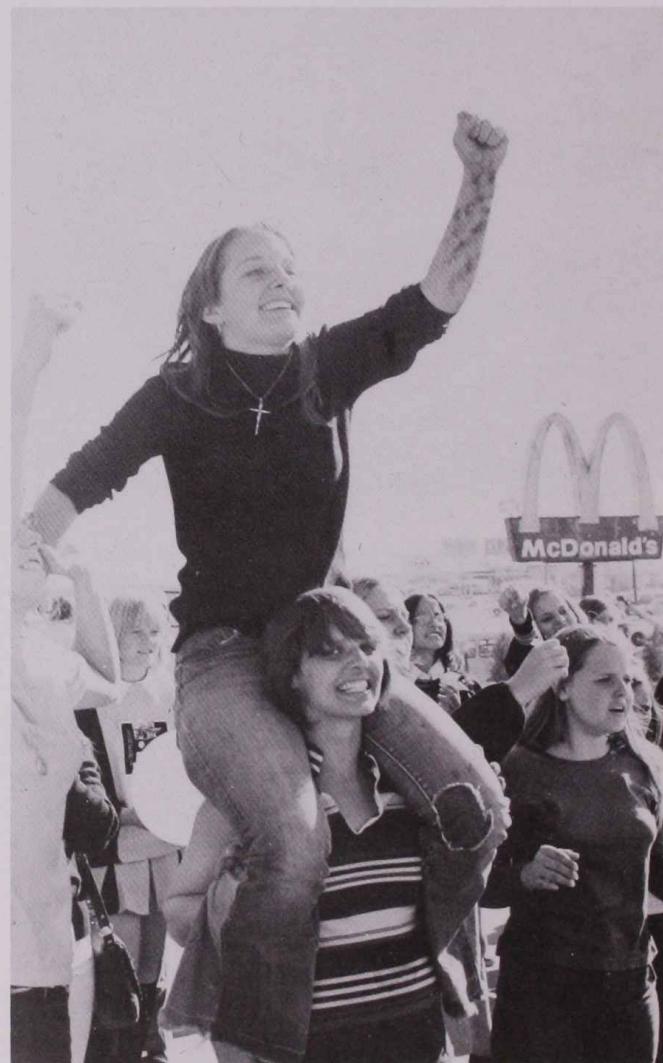

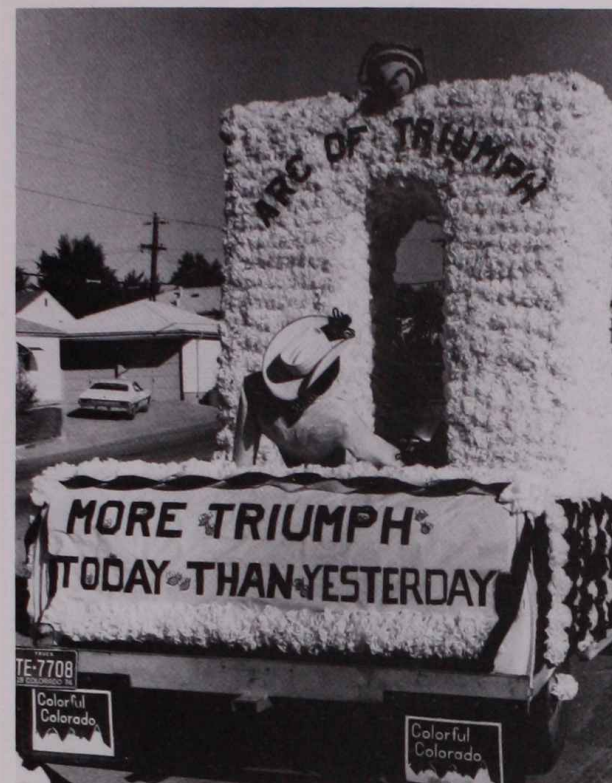

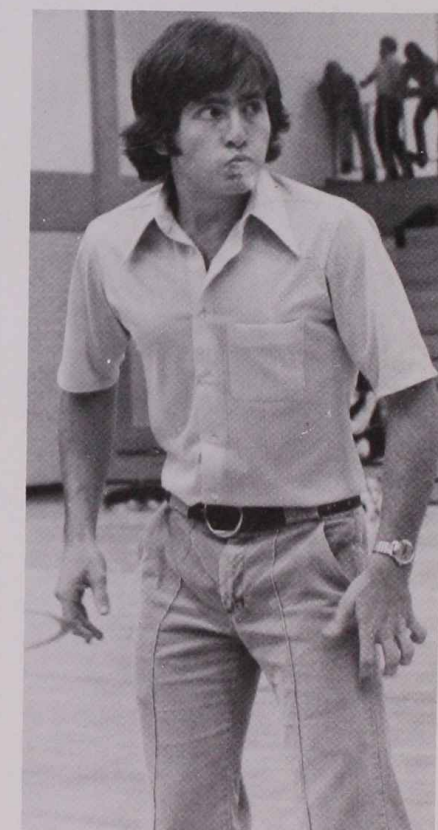

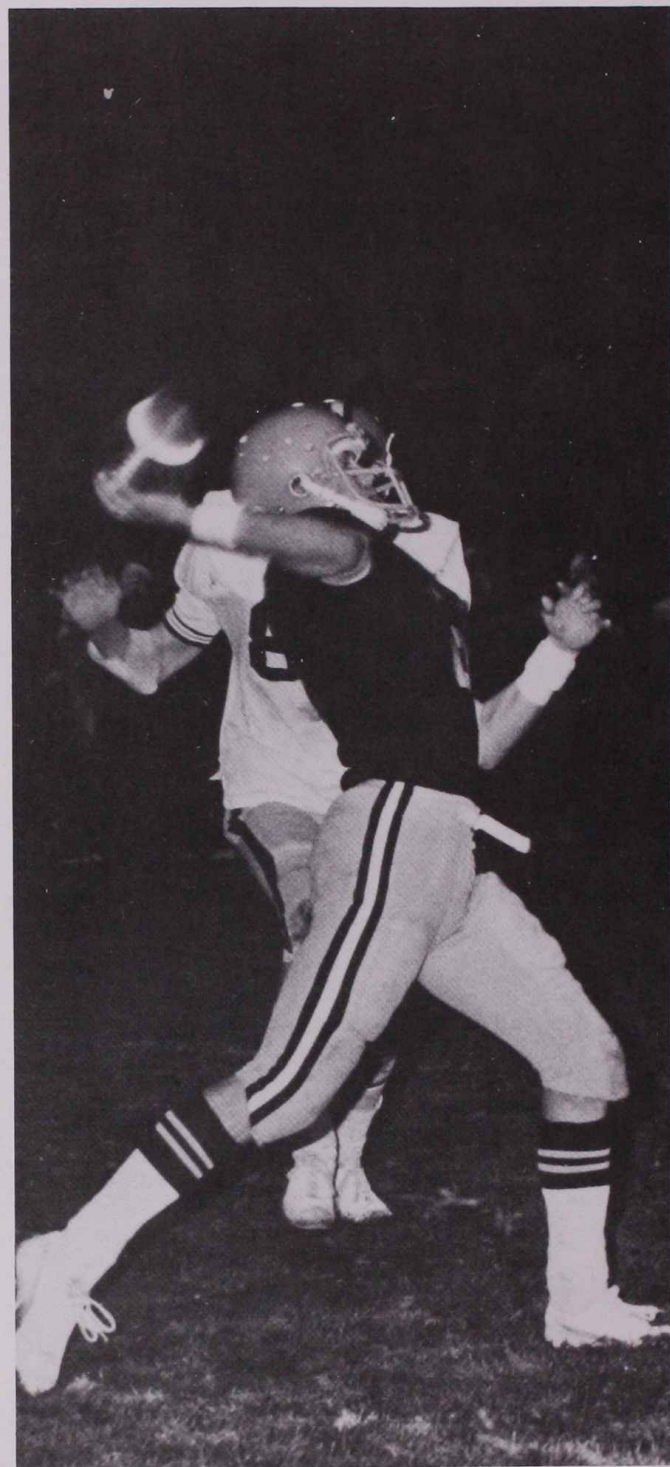

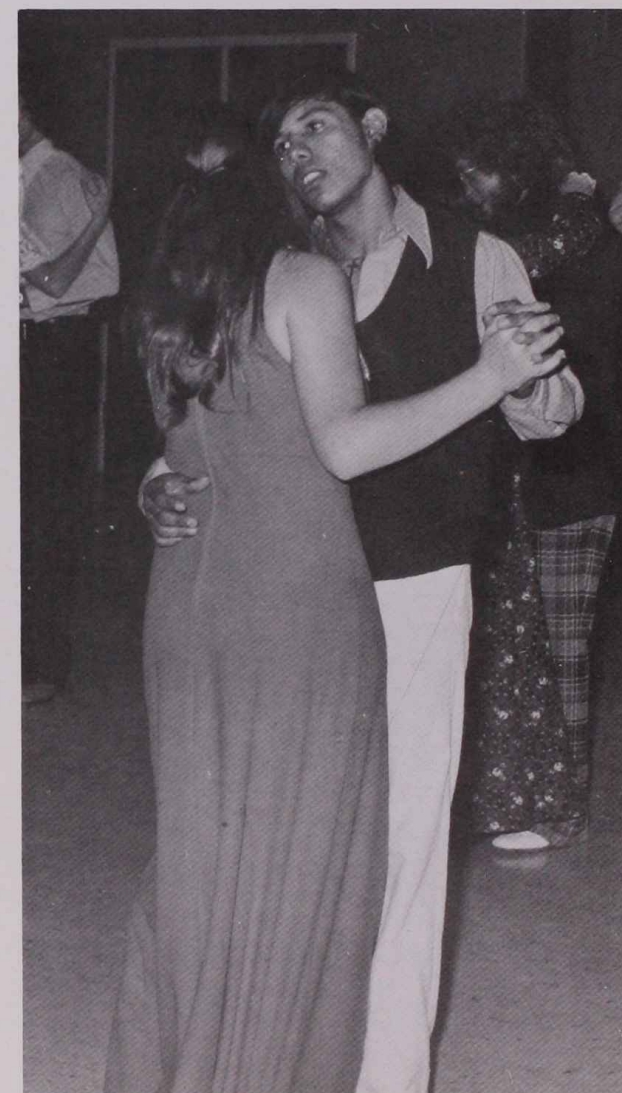

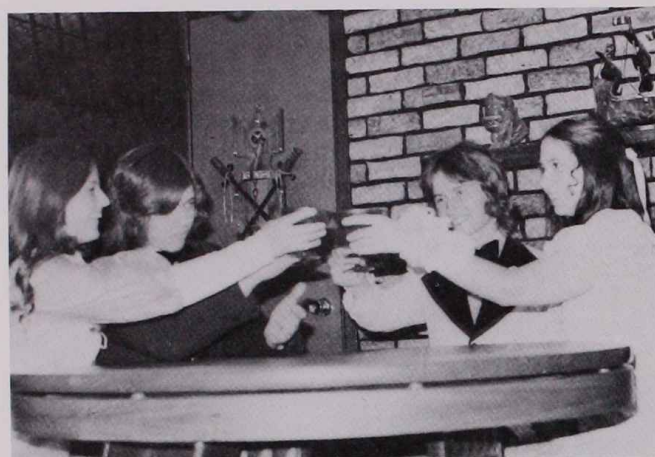

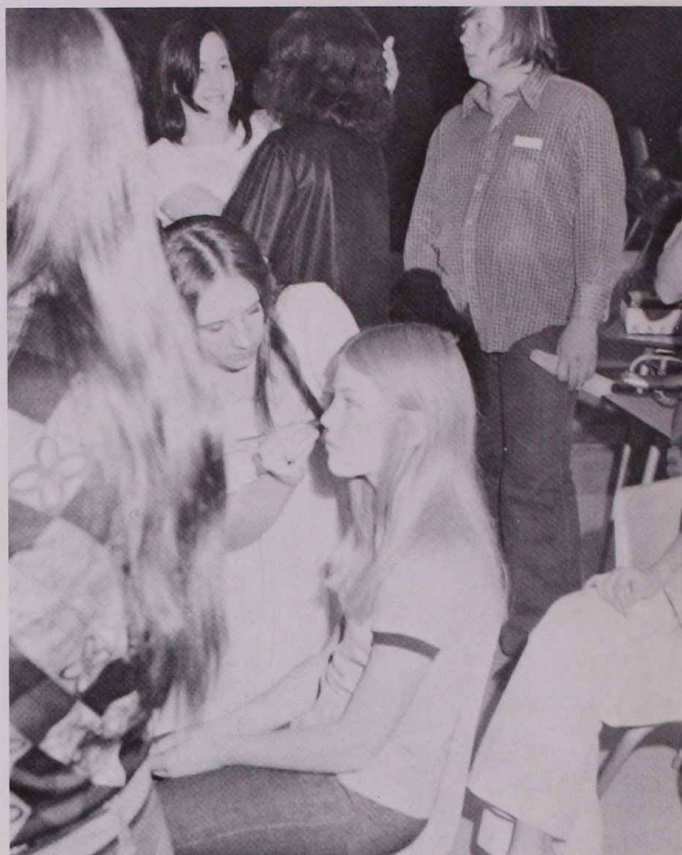
PIRATES OF PENZANCE

The Fine Arts Department presented the Gilbert and Sullivan farce, "The Pirates of Penzance," on April 17, 18 and 19.

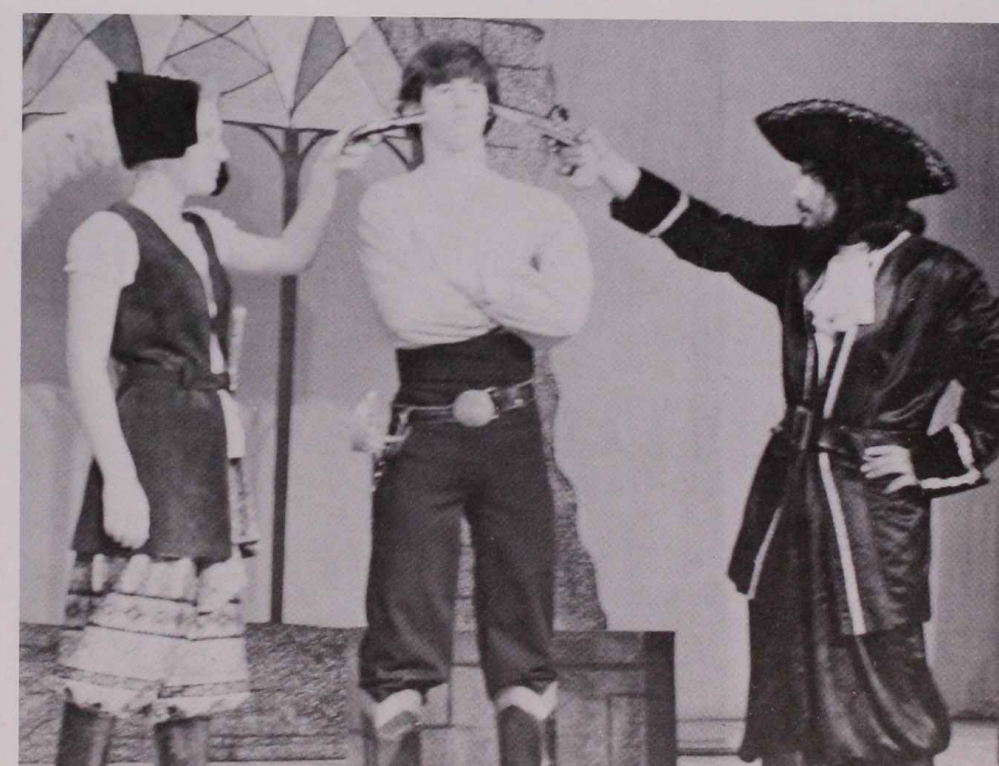

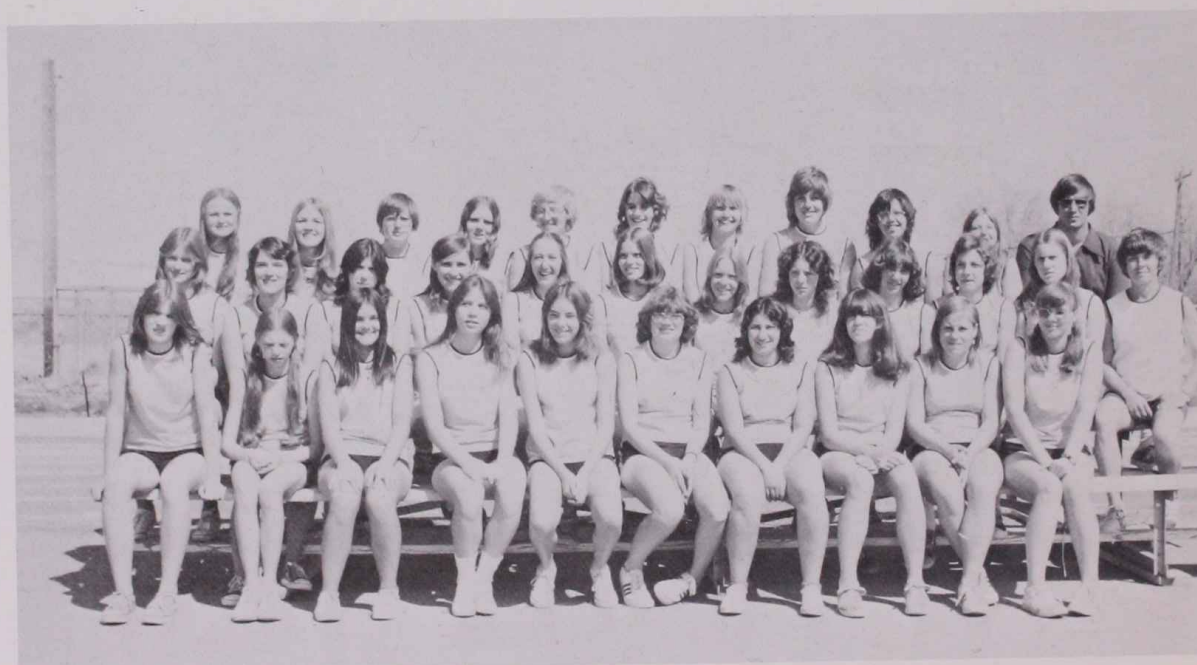
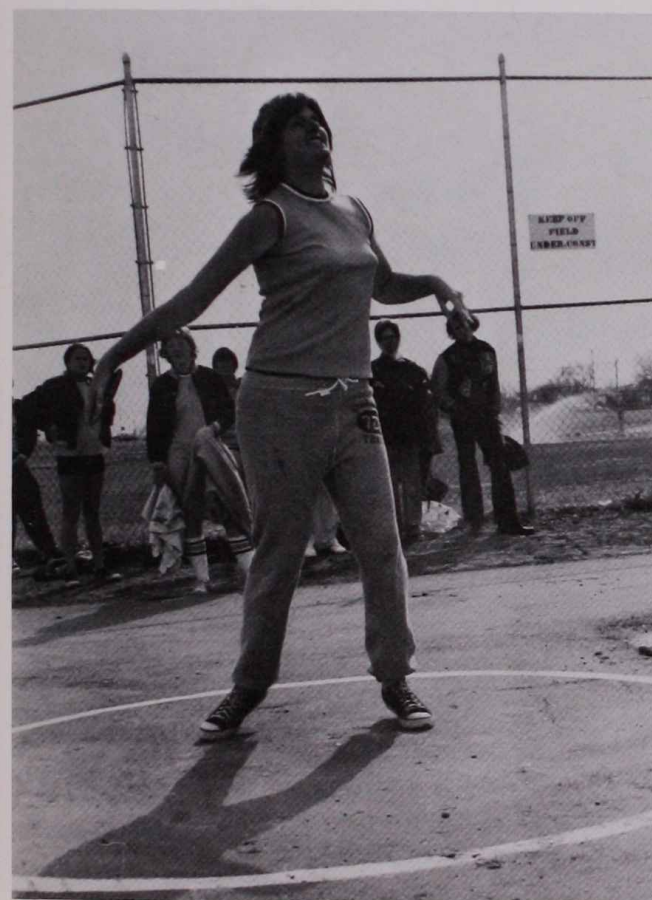
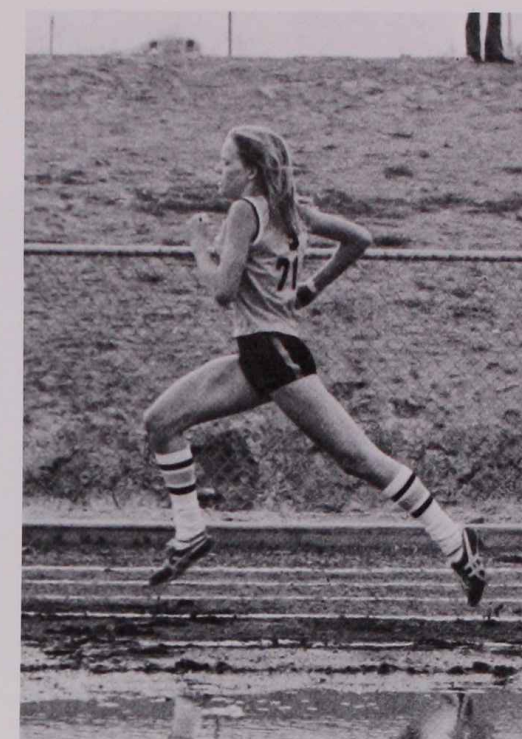
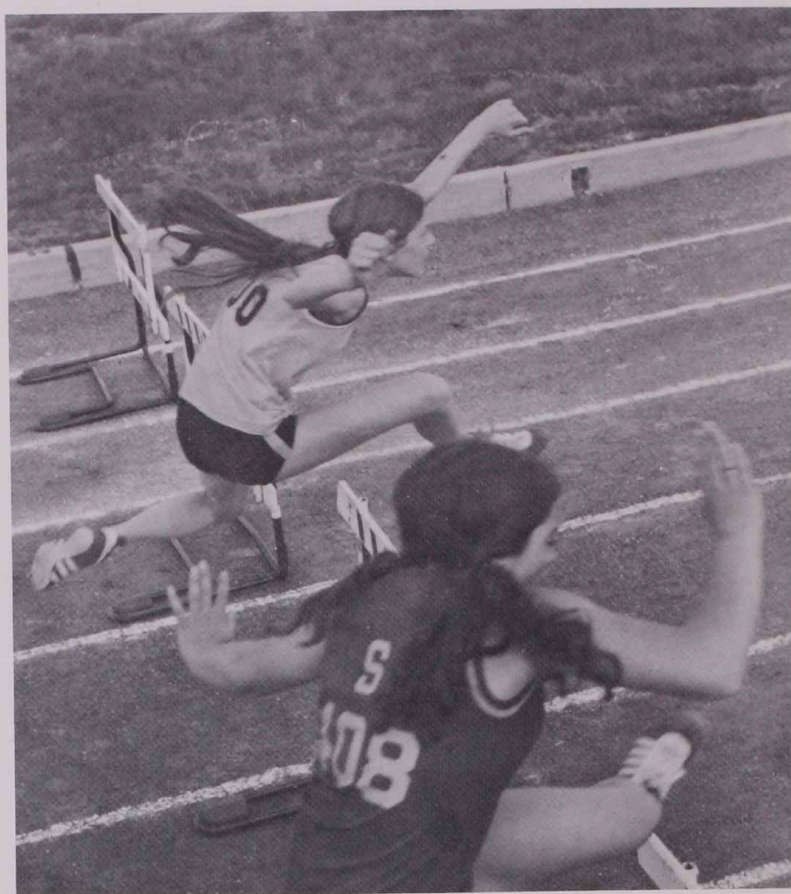
Castor set state record

BASEBALL

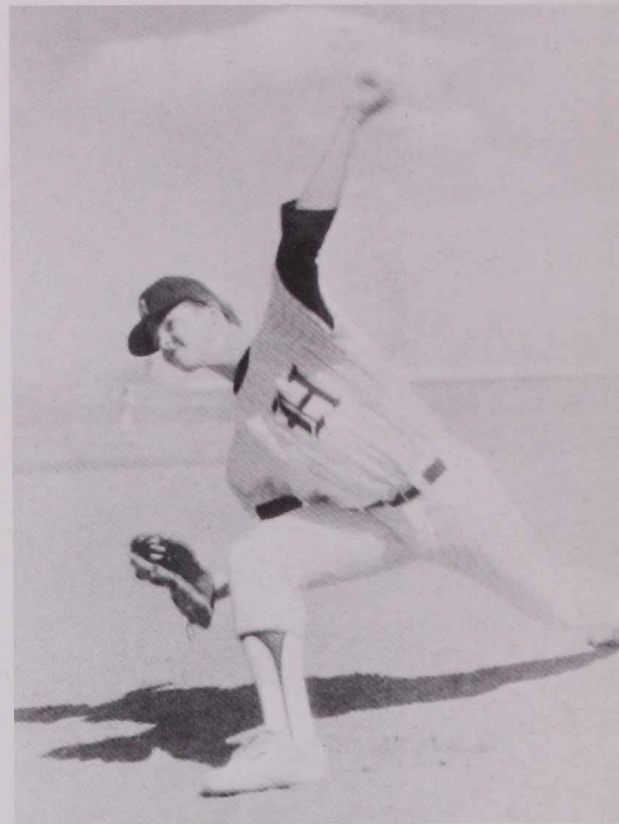
Highland compiled the first winning season of the last five years and was in contention for a playoff spot until the last week of the season.

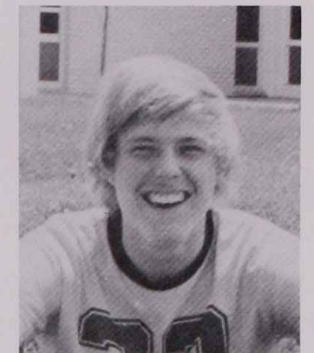

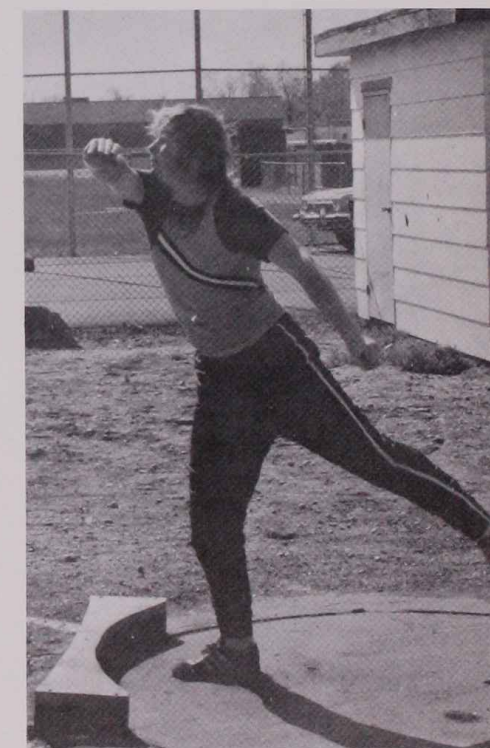

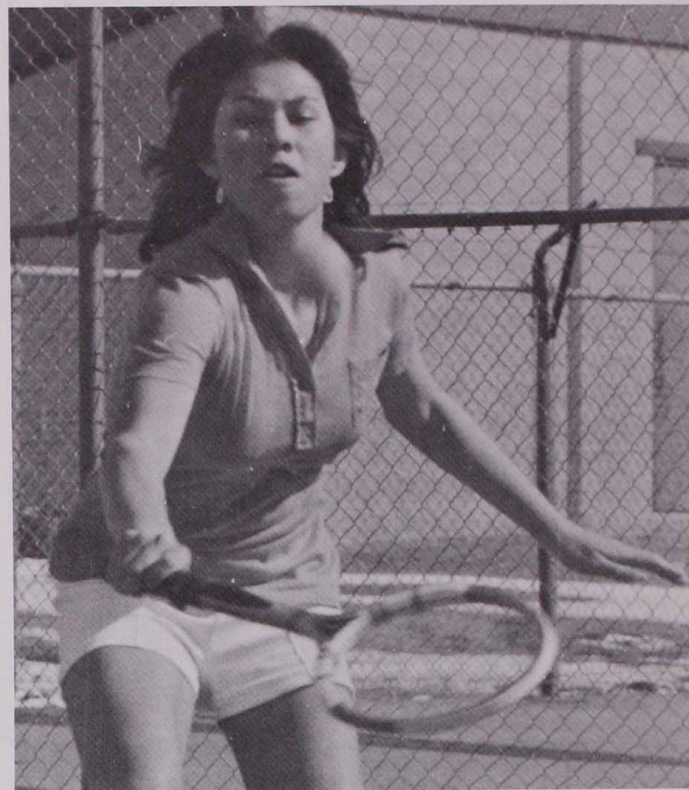

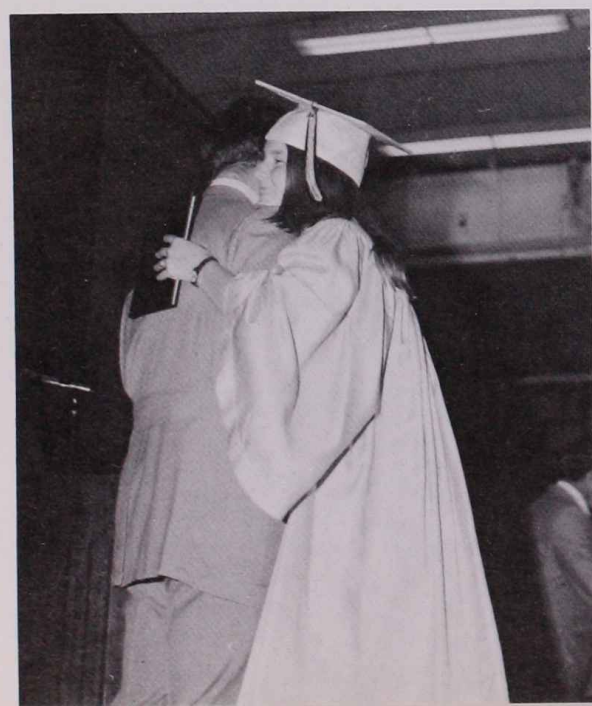
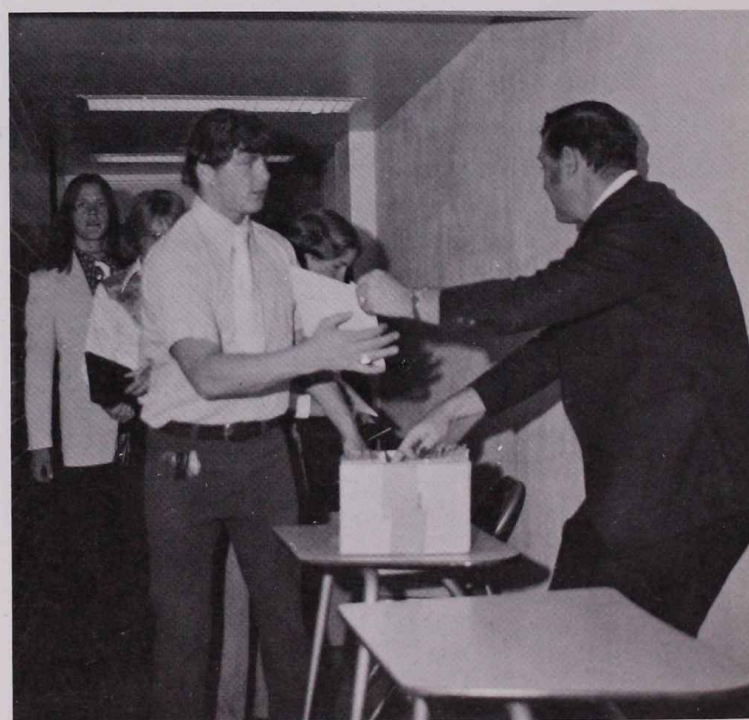
GRADUATION

Senior breakfast and graduation concluded four years of high school education and activities for the Class of '75.

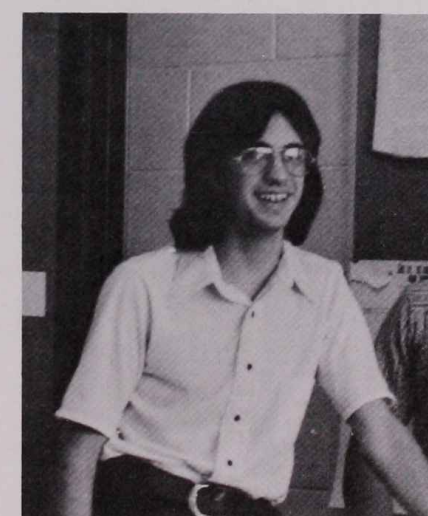
Presentation of awards highlighted the senior breakfast which was held at the Holiday Inn, May 29, at 11 a.m.

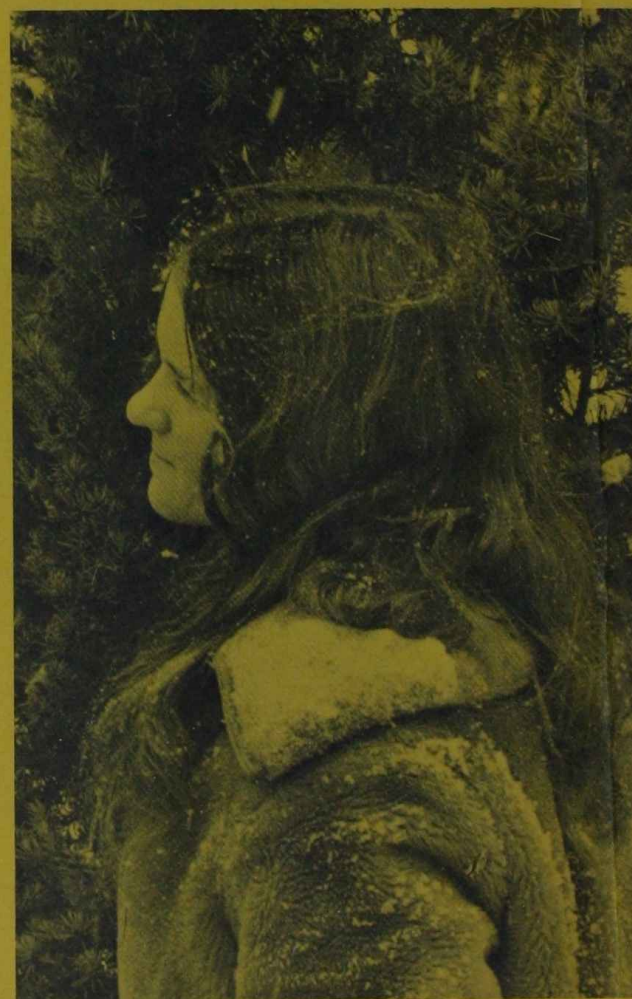
Mr. Cortese had about 20 students in his class, 18 of whom were working.

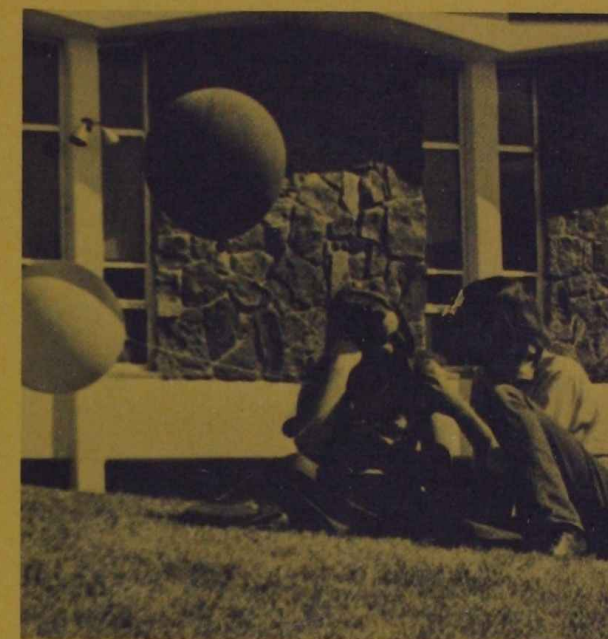
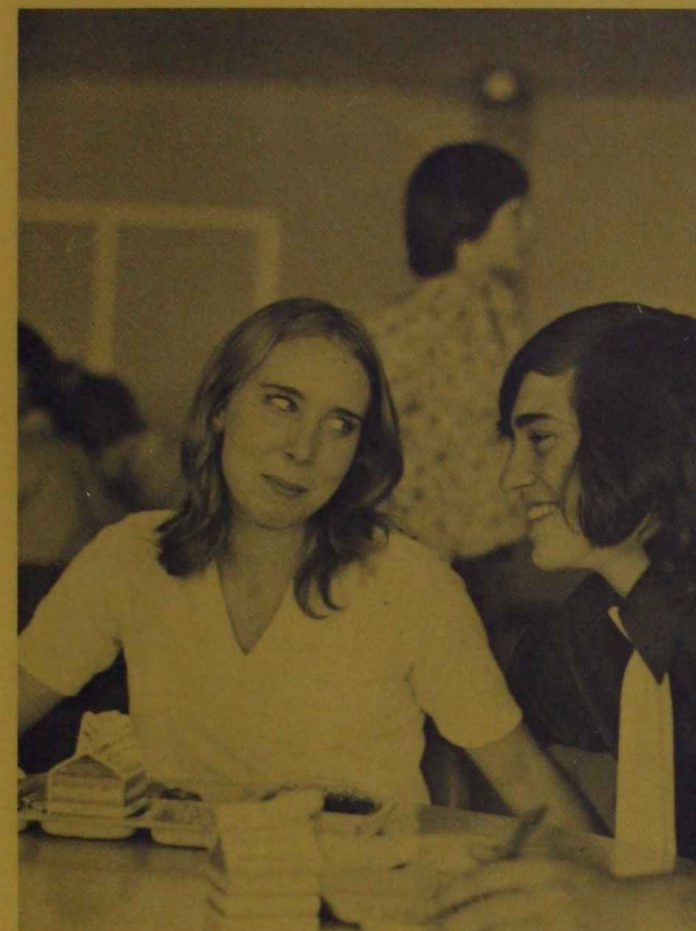

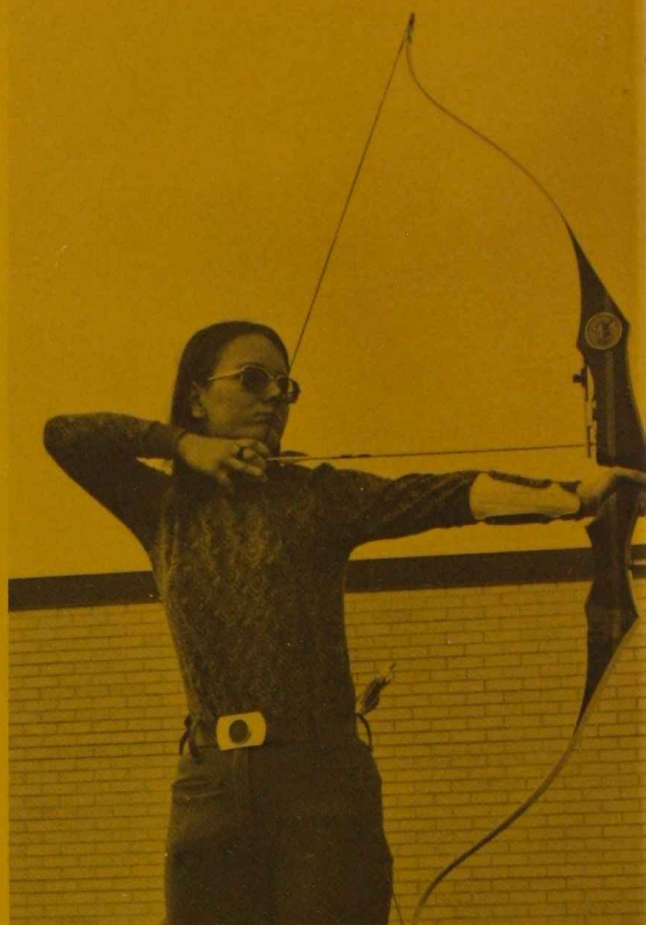
One student at Highland has an unusual interest.

Greg Cummings started gliding in 1972. He glides in Colorado, Arizona, California but mostly at the Colorado Springs' Air Force Academy.

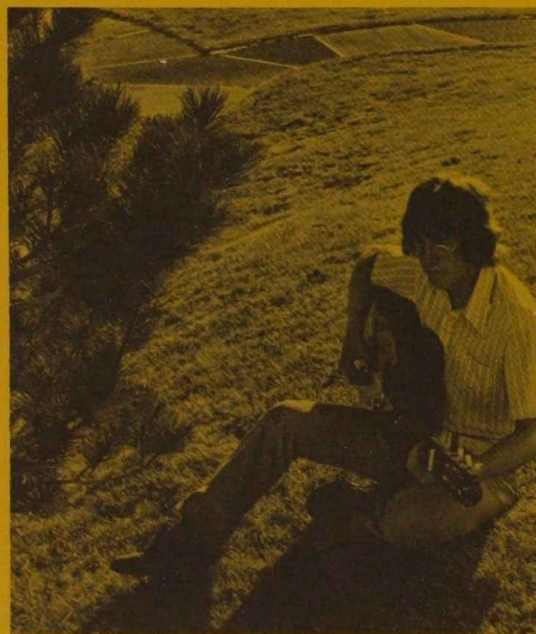

For Christmas the students decorated the school, went caroling, presented a one act opera and spread lots of Christmas cheer.

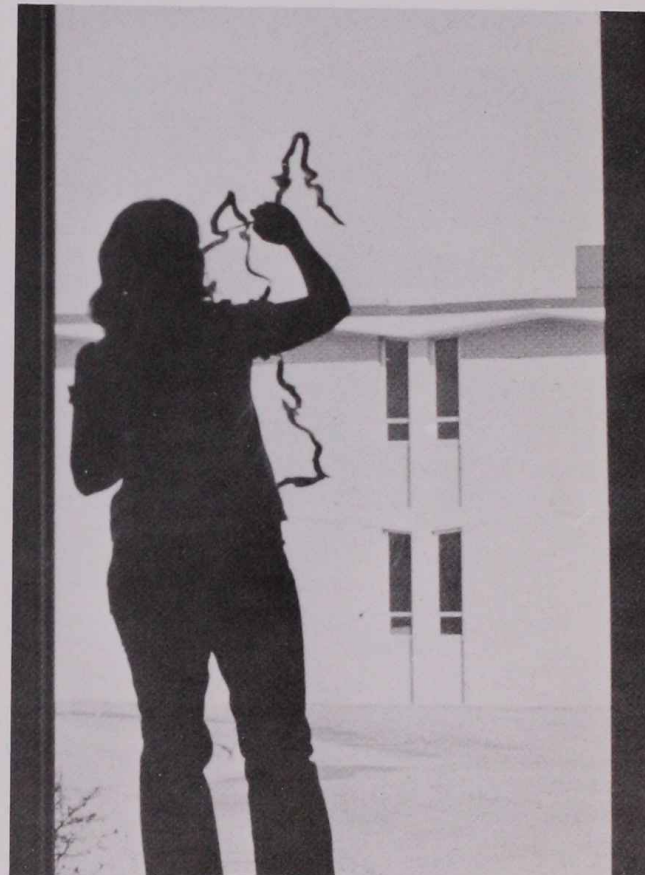
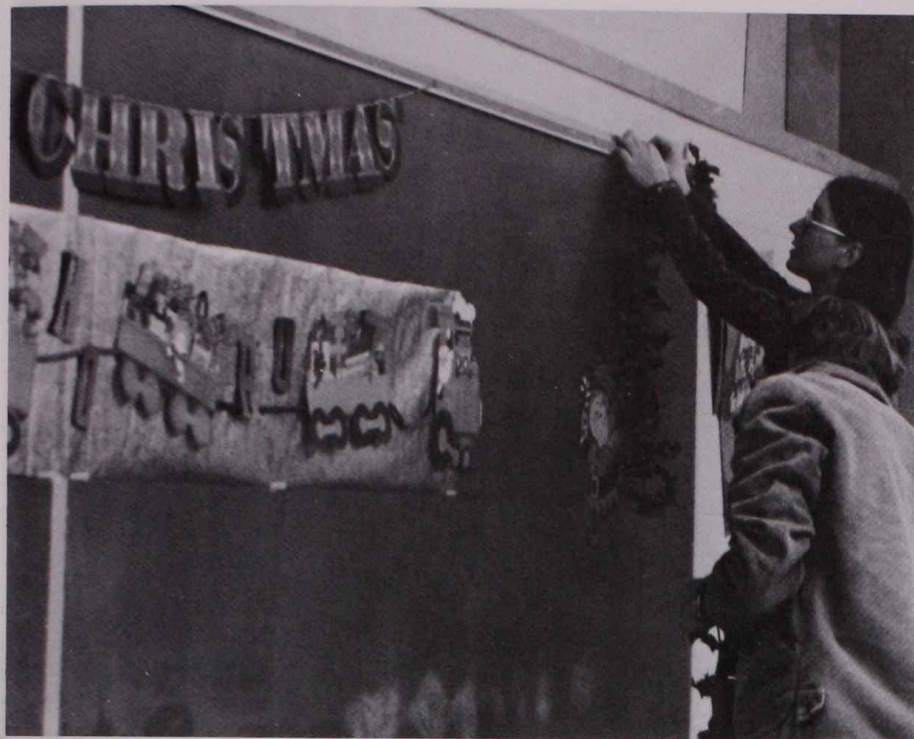
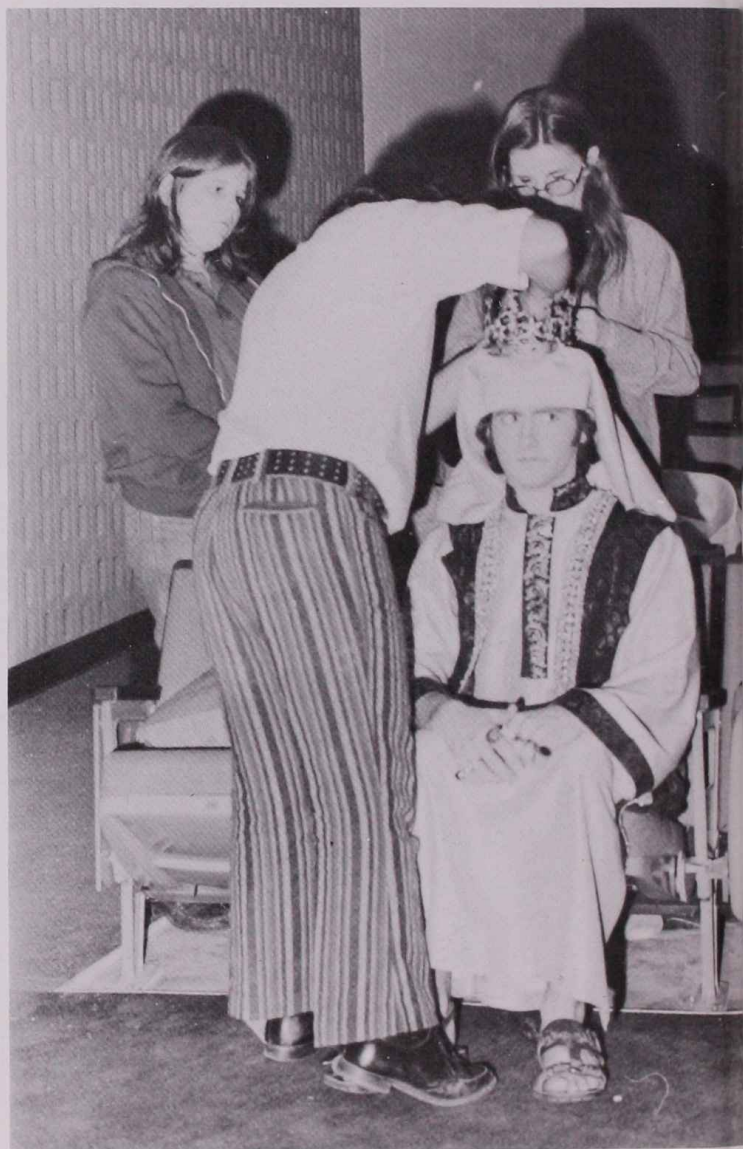

A Christmas assembly for the students was presented on the last day before vacation by the Show Choir, directed by Mr. Newton.

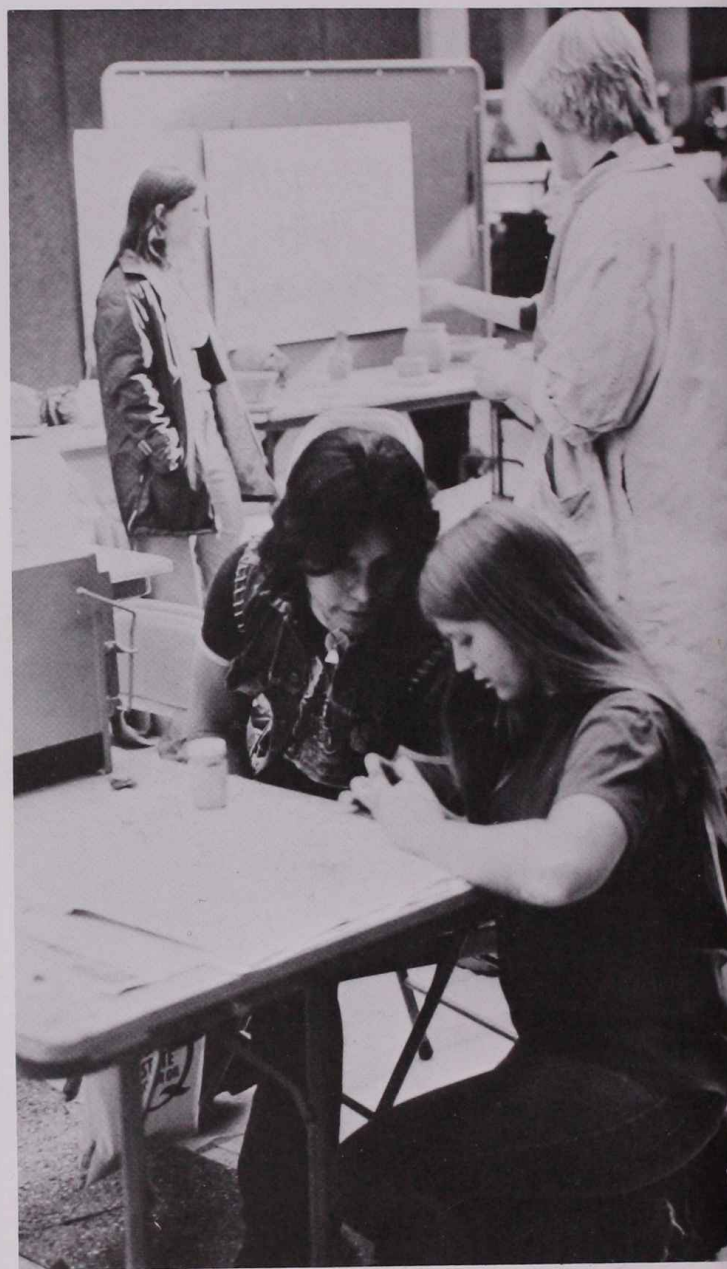

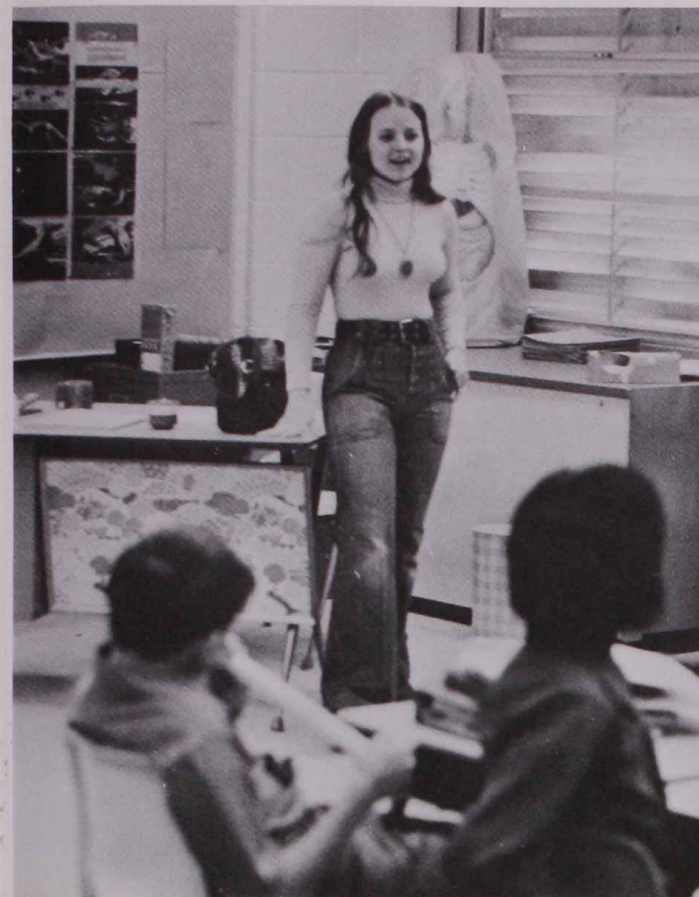
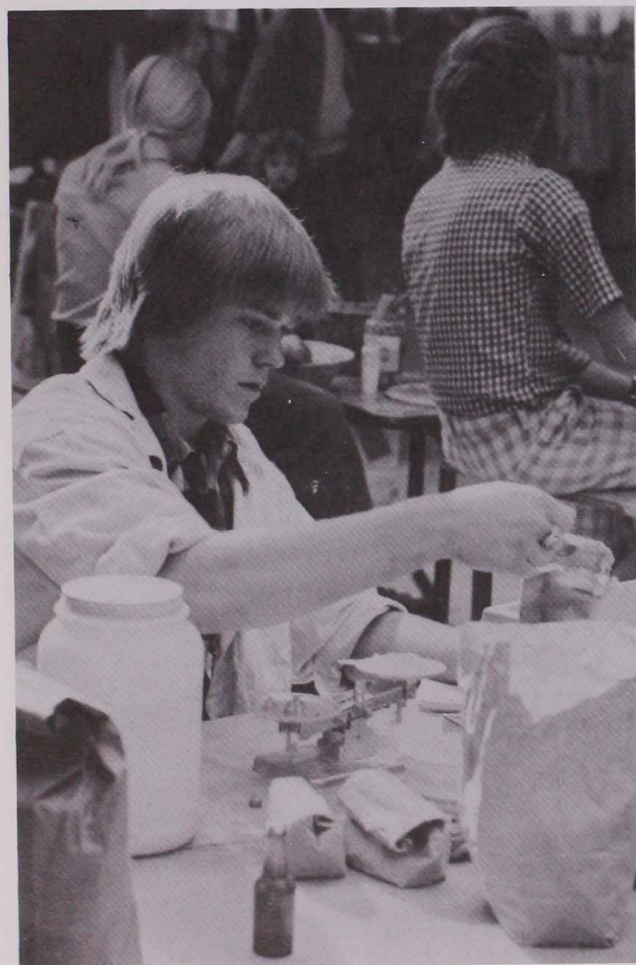

WIND ENSEMBLE HONORED

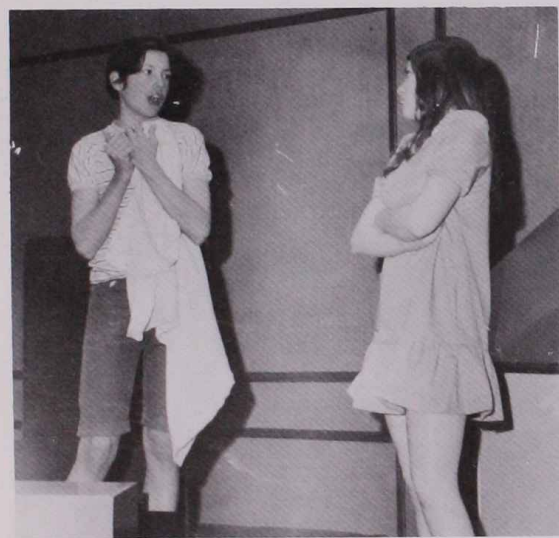

The selection of the Highland Wind Ensemble was based on taped tryouts. The Ensemble competed with 118 other schools for this honor.

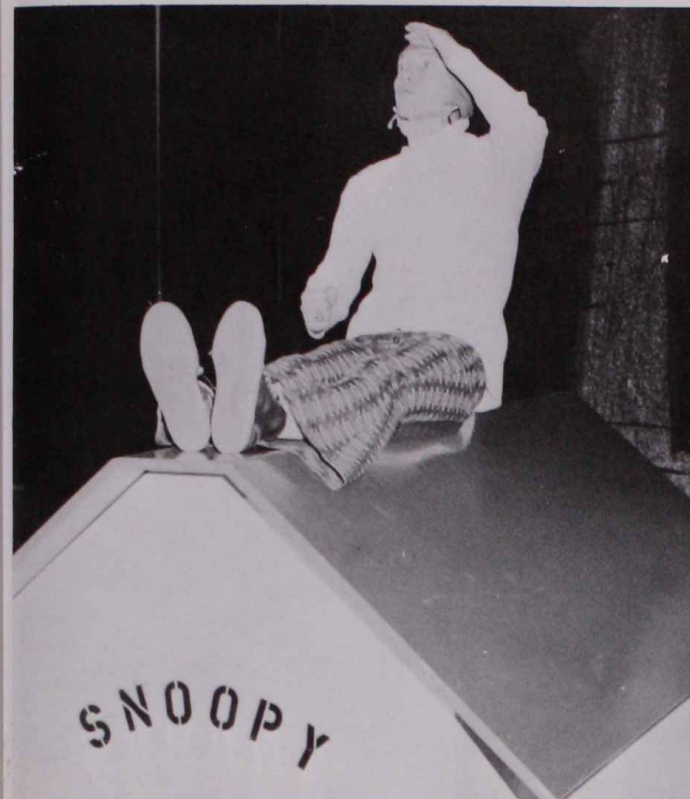
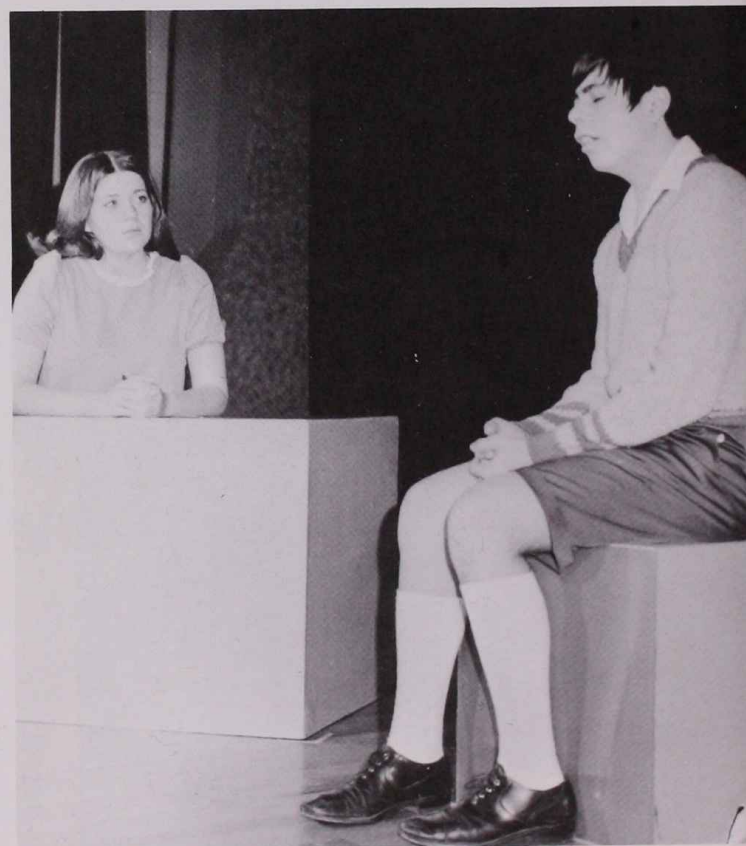

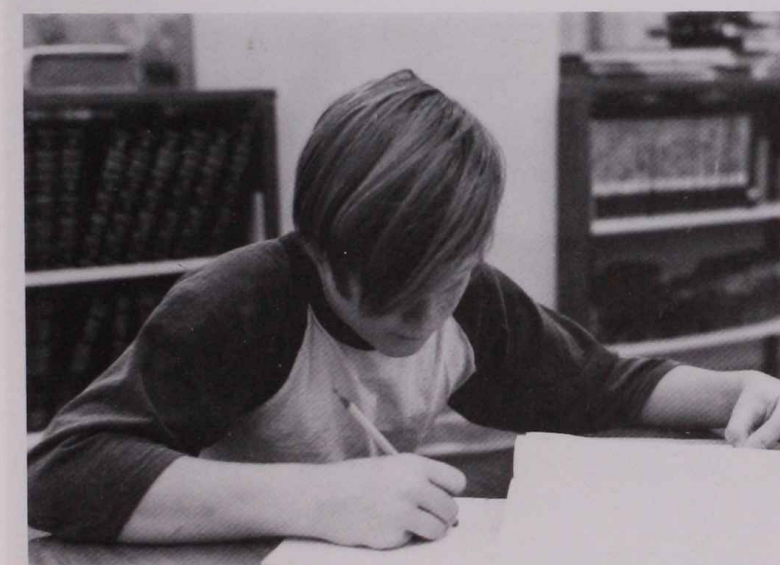
The guidance counselors recruited a "magical machine" this year that helped students find career information.

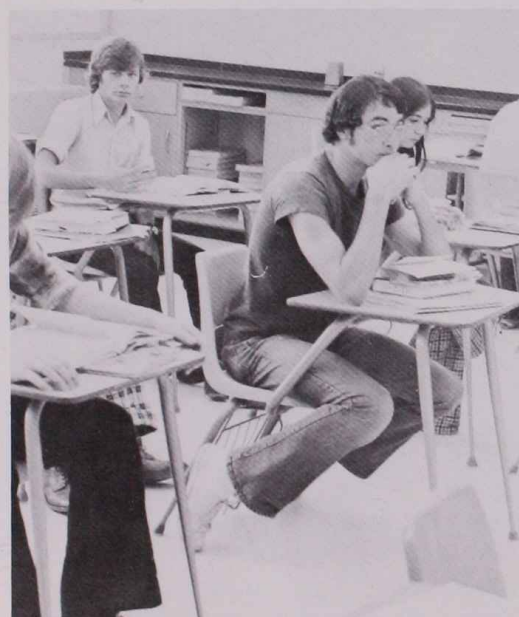
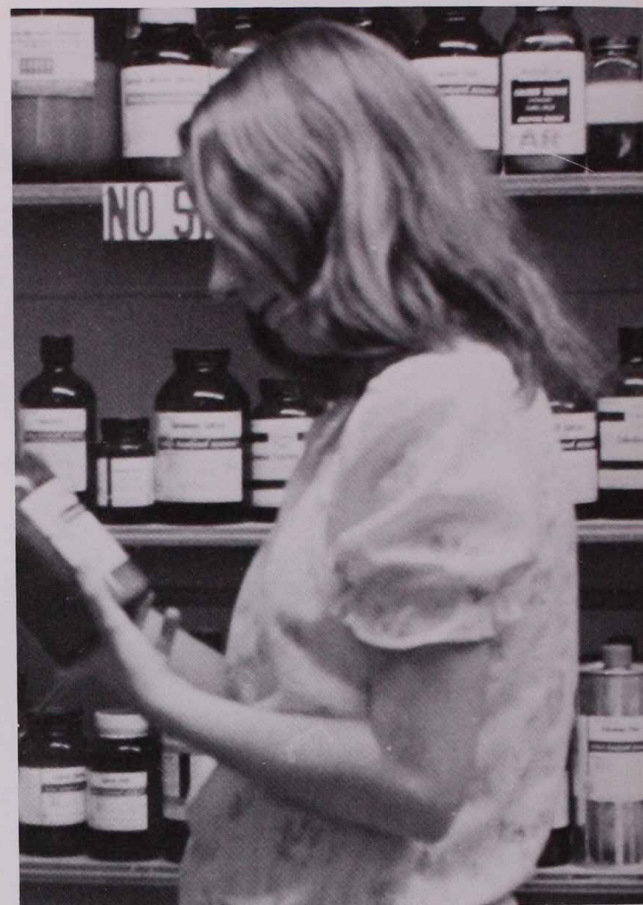
silent sustained reading

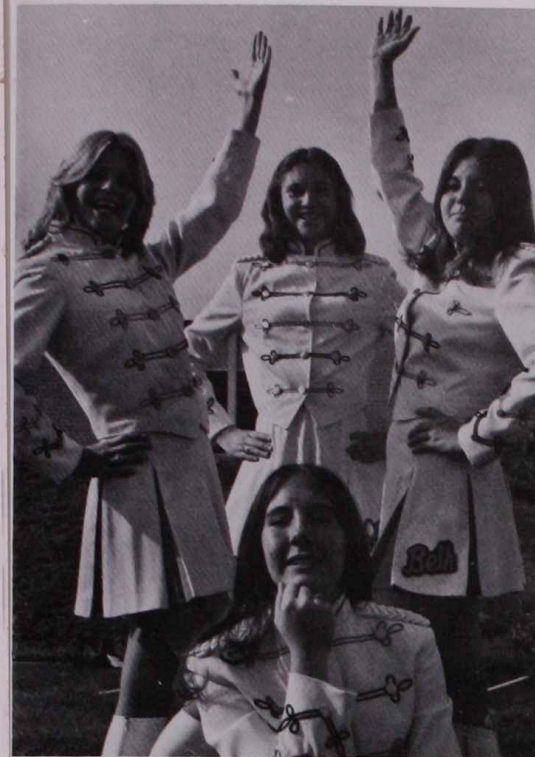
Superb performing year

The Highland Bands had a superb performing year.

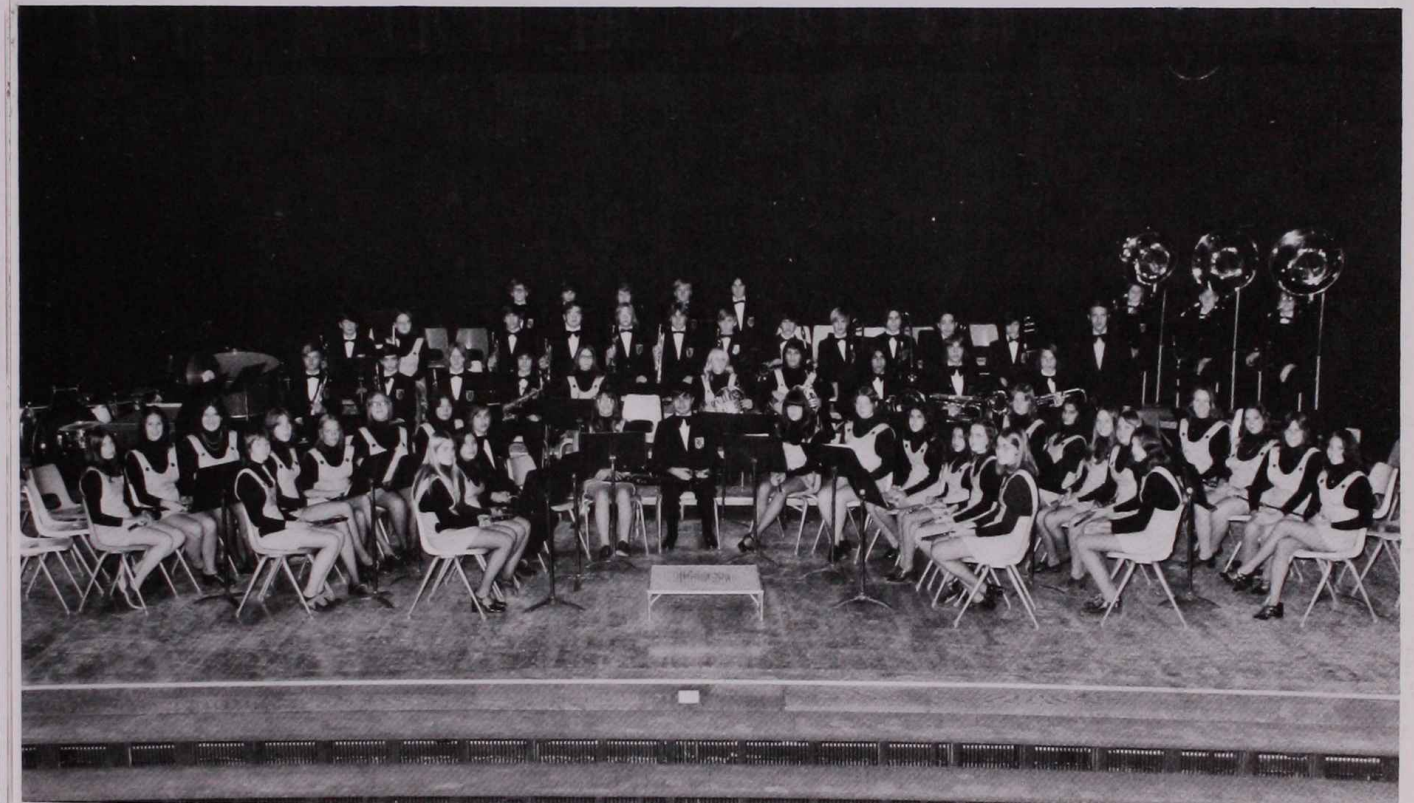

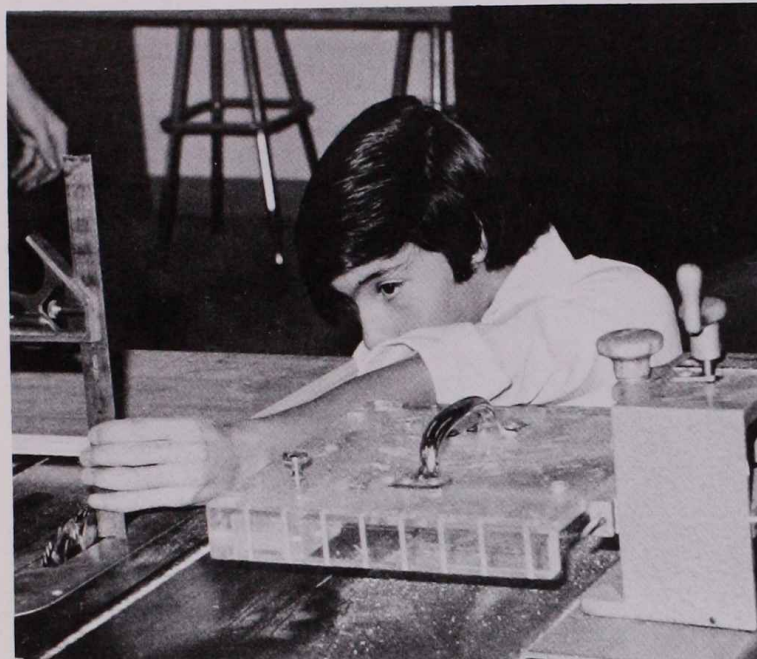

The wing was completed during the summer of 1974 and was ready for use at the beginning of the school year.

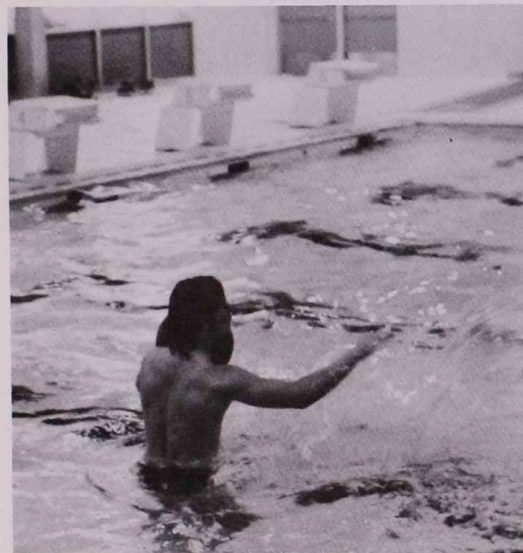

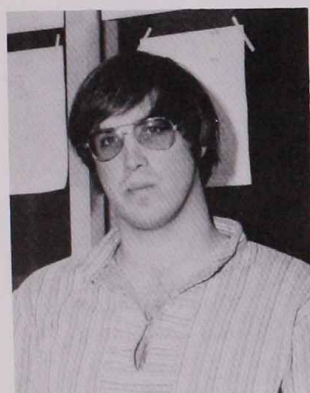

In the League Meet, they took second place out of 12 teams and in District, fourth place out of 12 teams.

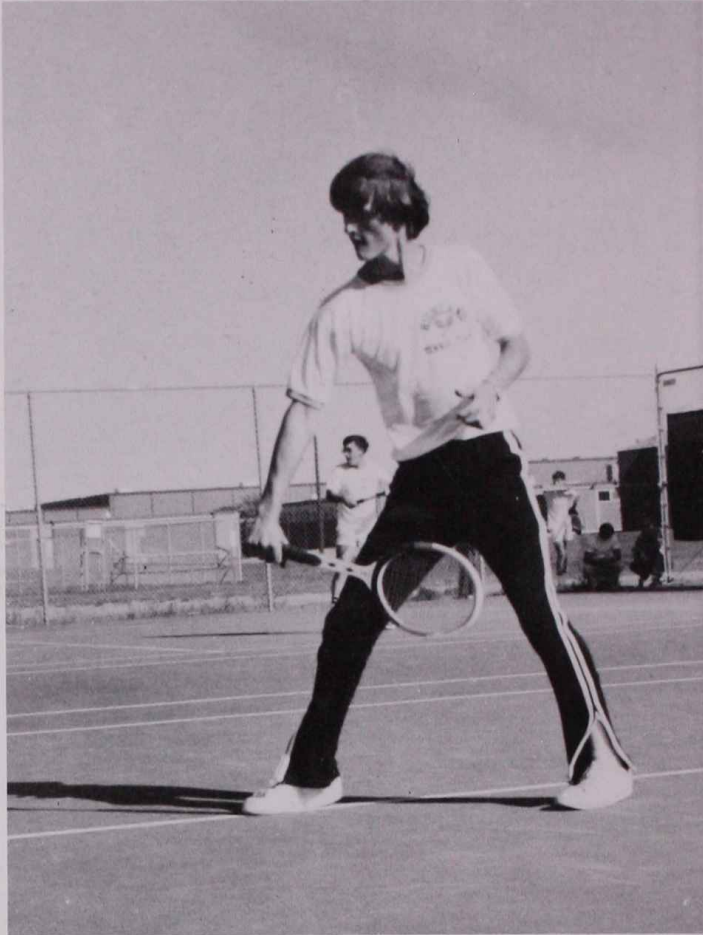

Captain Heather Langthorn headed the first girls' Fellowship of Christian Athletes which was formed to bring together the coaches and athletes.

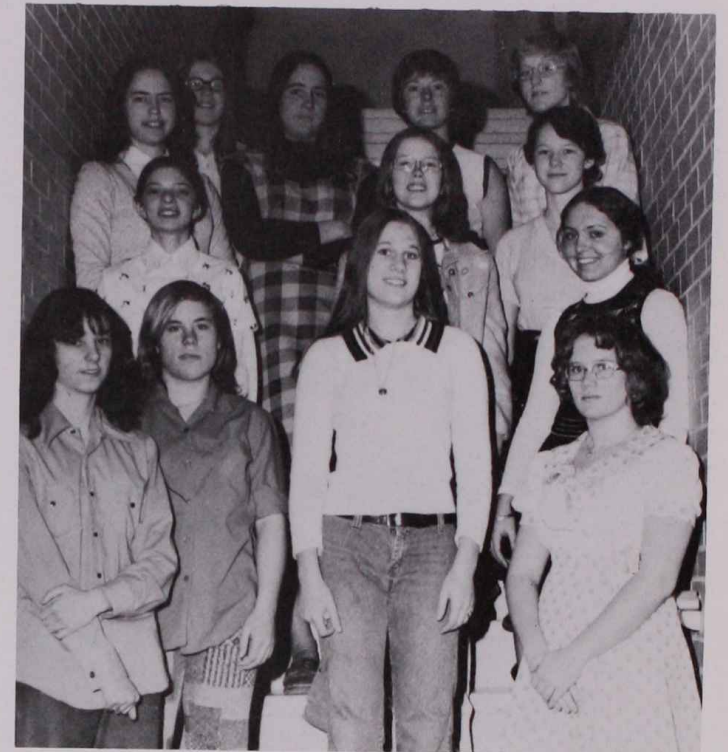
All the sports were included in the organization. The girls met every two weeks to discuss common problems.

The group had two successful canned food drives for Thanksgiving and Christmas. In addition they held a turkey raffle in order to buy two turkeys for needy families.

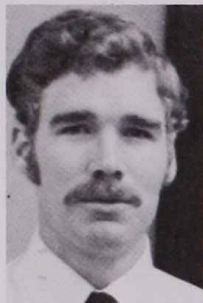

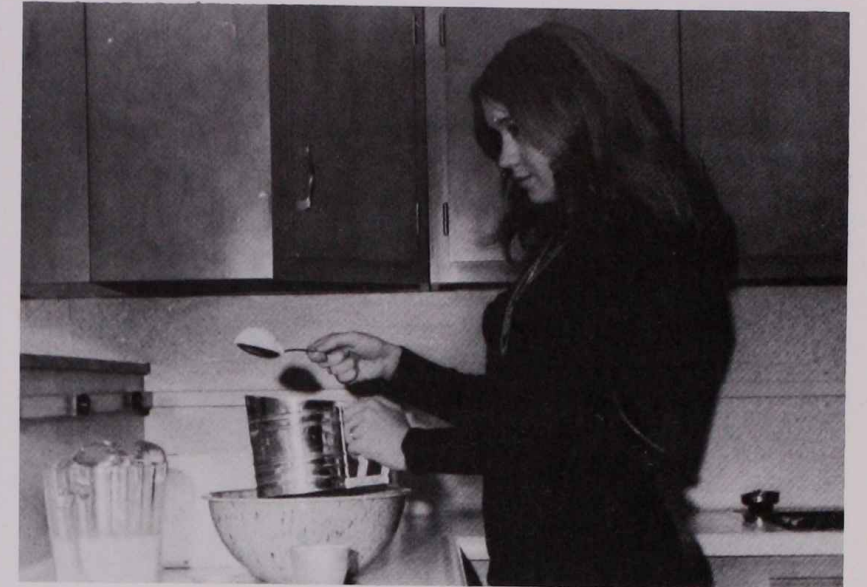

Members of the National Honor Society, a service organization, were selected because of their high academic standings.

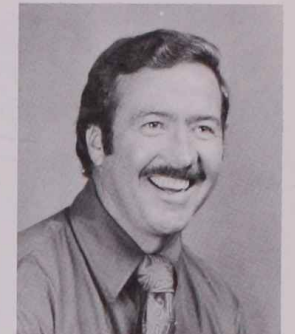
Their first activity was setting up an annual volleyball game with the Thornton High School NHS.

In the past five years, the Highland Speech Team has been within the top 10 schools; this year they placed sixth in state competition.

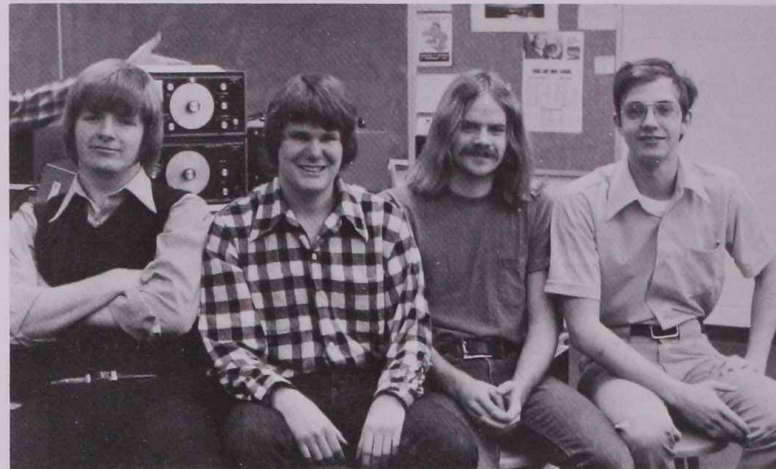
VICA, SKI CLUB

The officers attended the State Conference for VICA and also competed in parliamentary procedure.

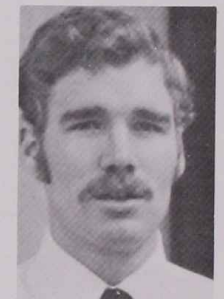
