First Days Of School

In the spring of 1975, 1100 students registered for the 1975-76 school year. The student enrollment in the fall was expected to drop below 1100 but instead increased to 1175 -- 255 seniors, 275 juniors, 321 sophomores and 324 freshmen. According to Superin-
