



Another contribution to the losing season was the fact that the team had a total of 66 errors in sixteen games. This was an average of more than four errors per game.




BODAGION


THE ROAD NOT TAKEN

Two roads diverged in a yellow wood, And sorry I could not travel both And be one traveler, long I stood And looked down one as far as I could To where it bent in the undergrowth.


Then took the other, just as fair, And having perhaps the better claim, Because it was grassy and wanted wear; Though as for that the passing there Had worn them really about the same.

I shall be telling this with a sigh Somewhere ages and ages hence: Two roads diverged in a wood, and I — I took the one less traveled by, And that has made all the difference.




years of coaching. When asked about his team this year, he says, "These are good kids to work with. On any given day, any player on the team can beat another one."








SHOOT THE HOOP
