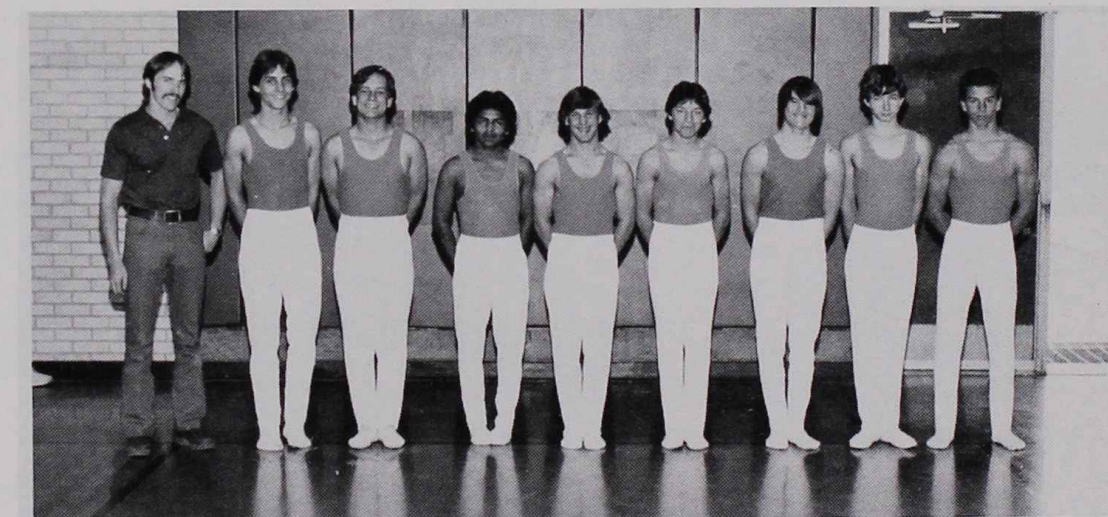
FLYING HIGH

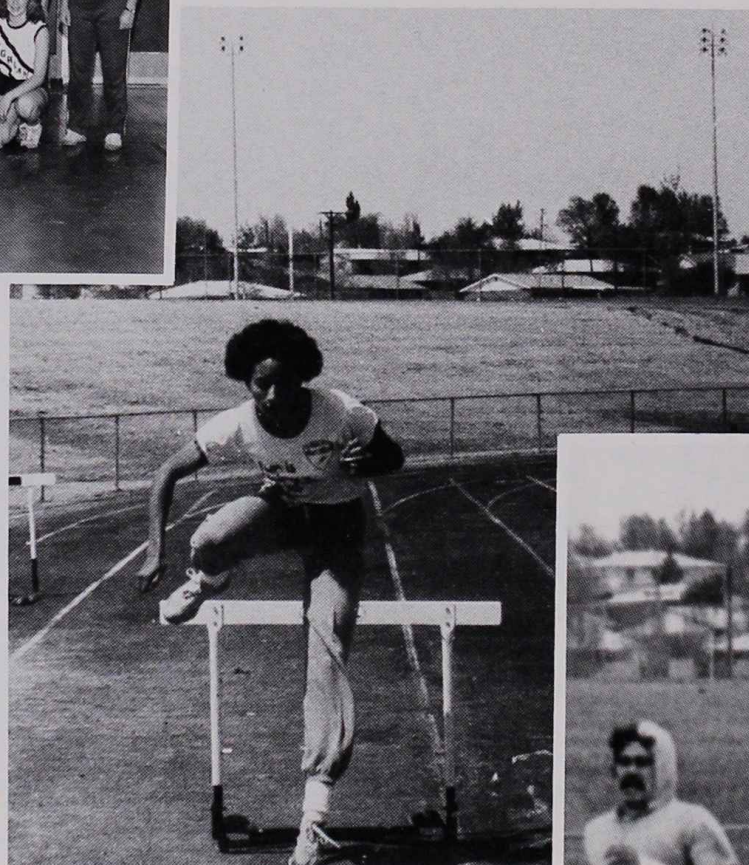

At the state meet, senior T.D. Newton took first place in the 300 meter low hurdles and Yvette Grove took second place in the 110 meter hurdles.



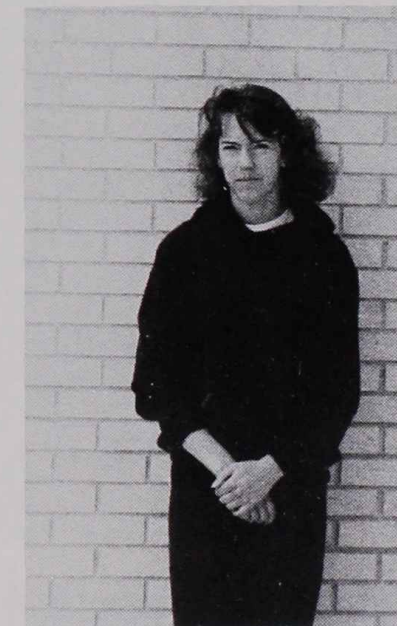

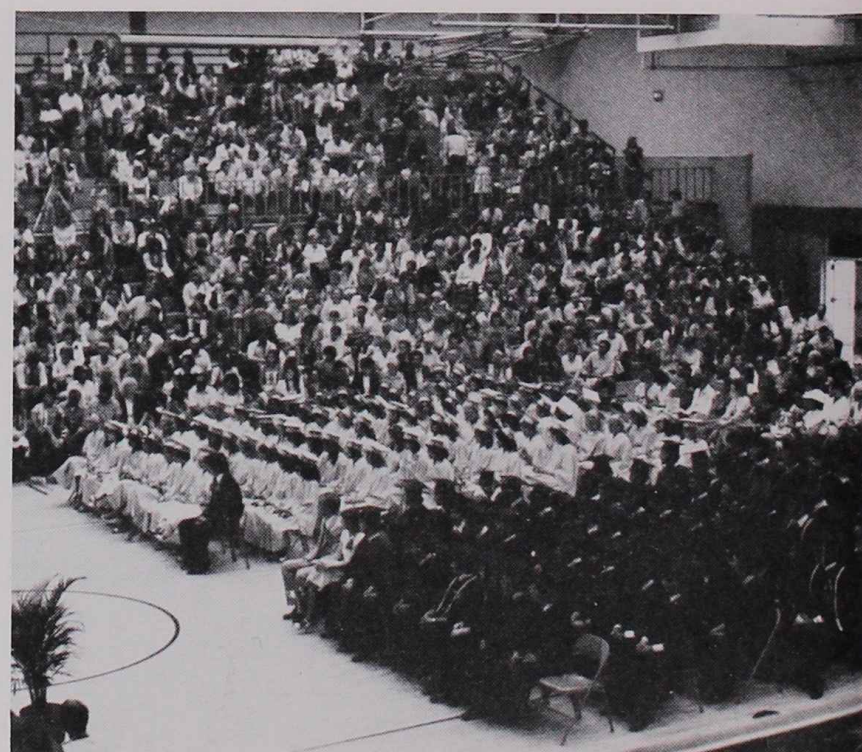
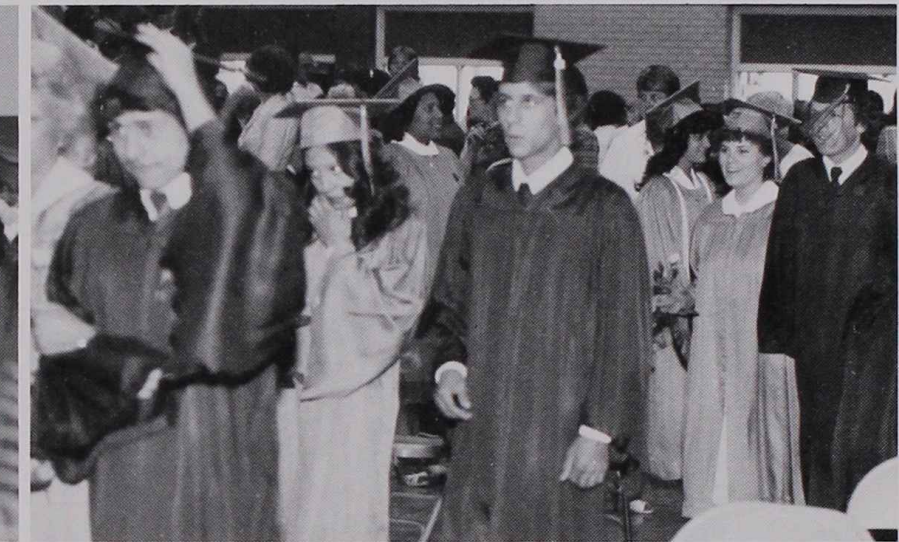
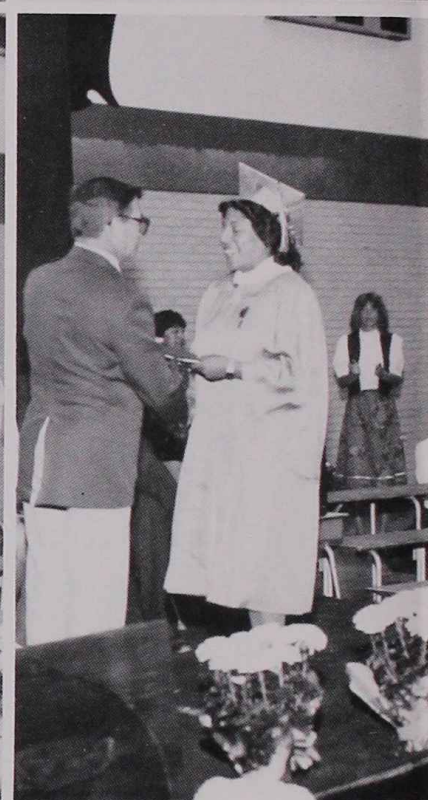
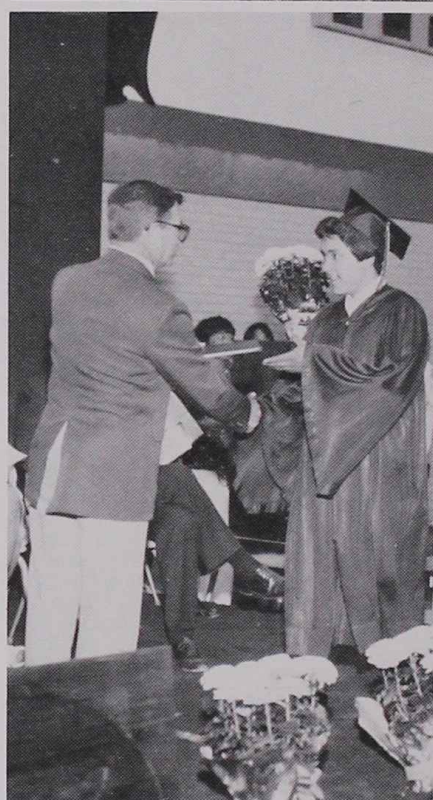
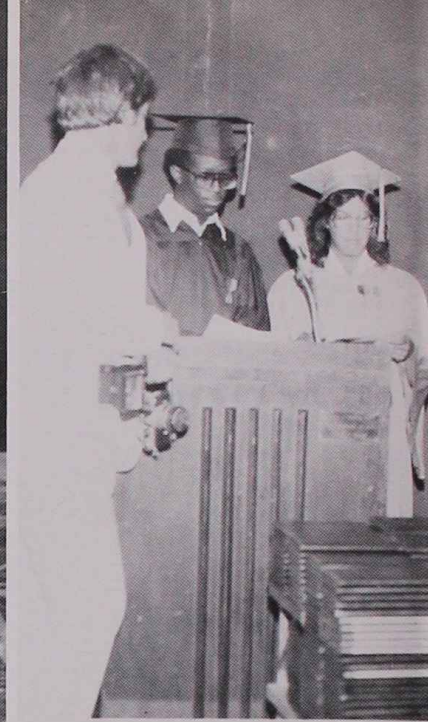
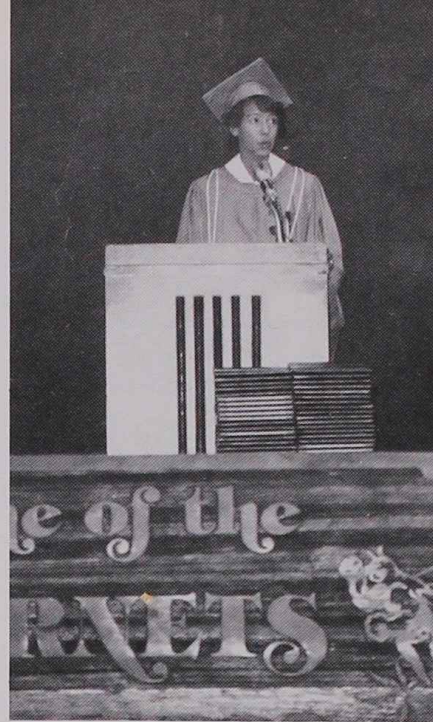
THE ROAD NOT TAKEN

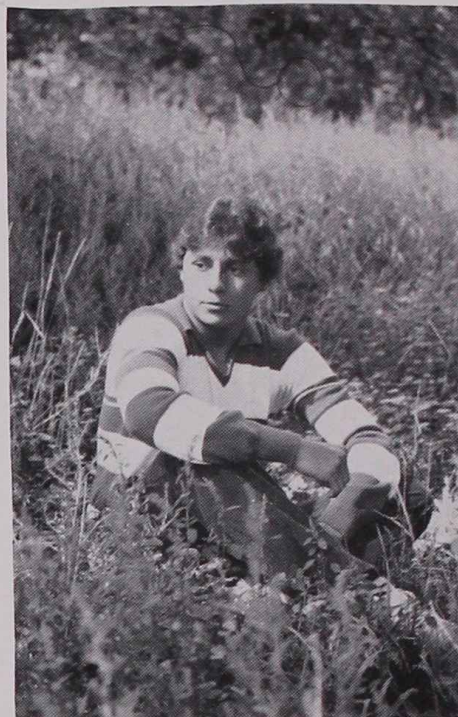
When spring fever hits students, the last thing on their minds is school the following year. Students are often caught daydreaming about the summer months ahead, instead of concentrating on their studies.

Before moving on to another year of education or perhaps working on a job, there are three months where students just break loose and let themselves go. There will be no more worries about grades or teacher pressures.

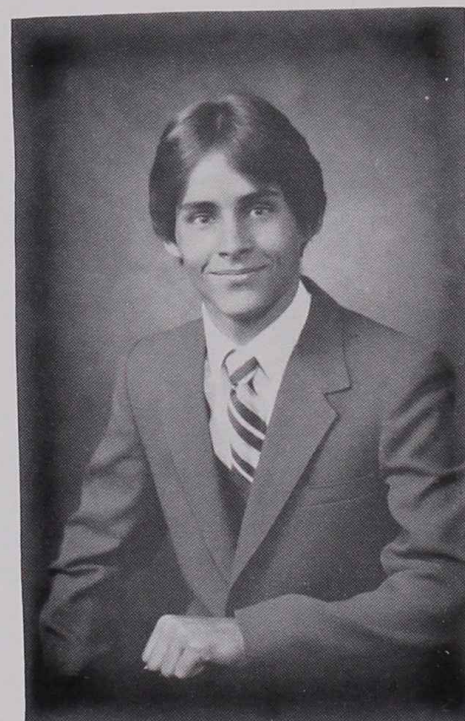
