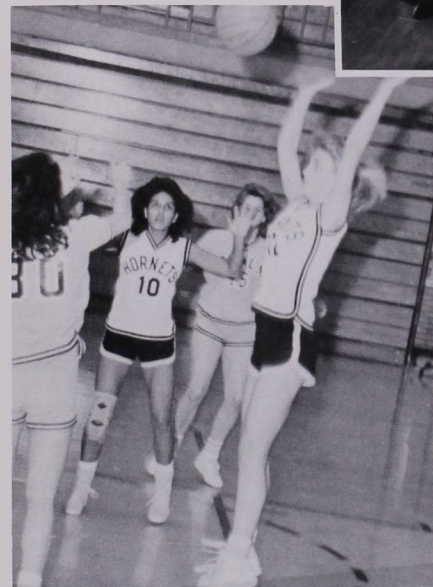
GIRL'S BASKETBALL

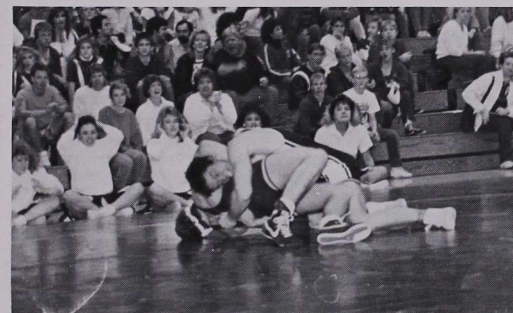

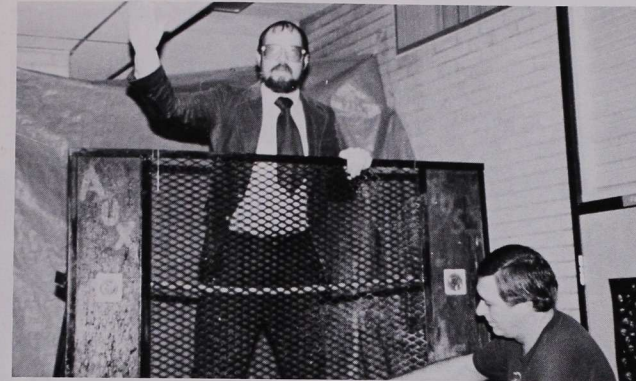


OCTOBERFEST

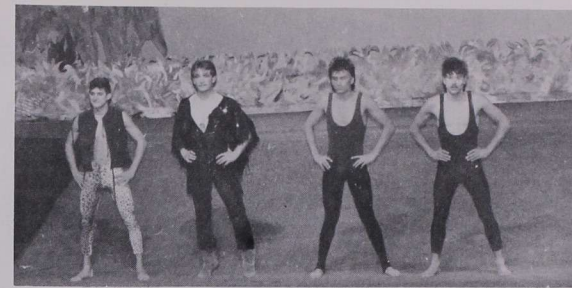
A SHAKESPEAREAN SUCCESS

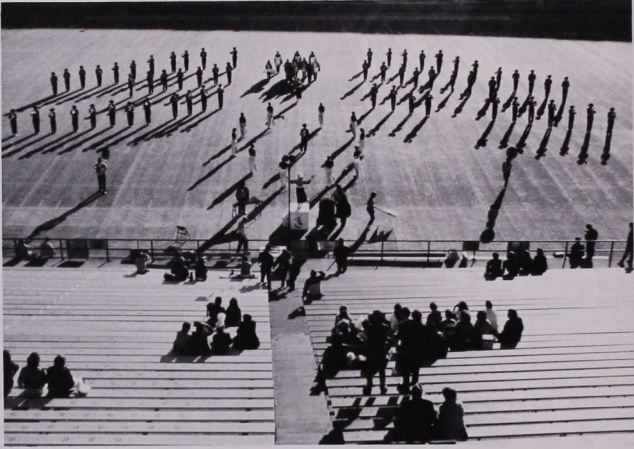

SPIRIT AND HARD WORK GO TOGETHER

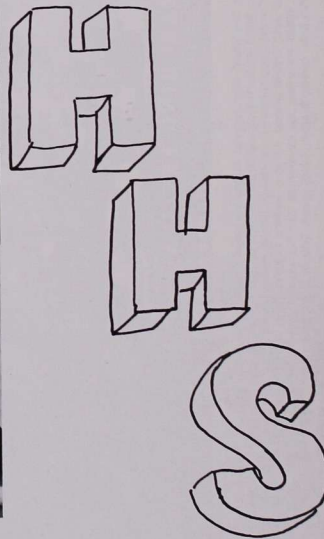

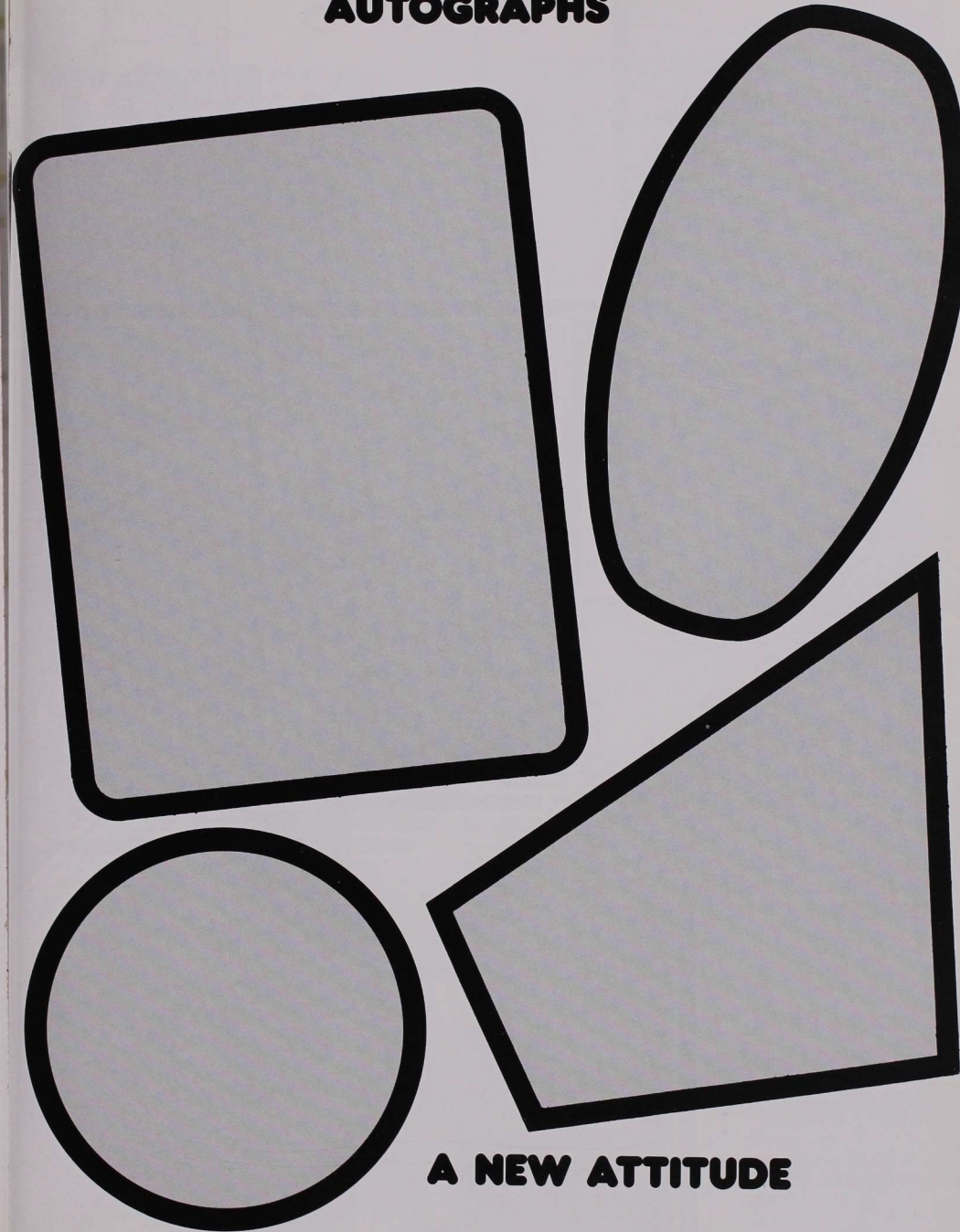
