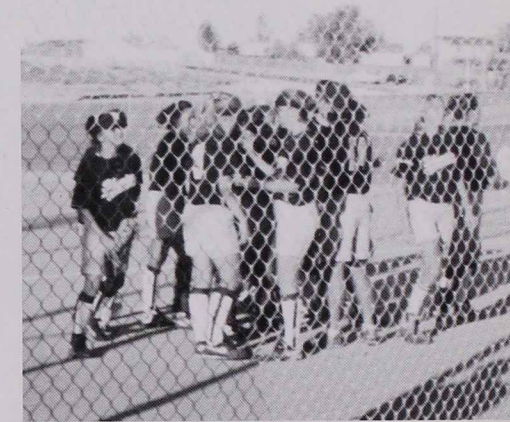

One Starry Night

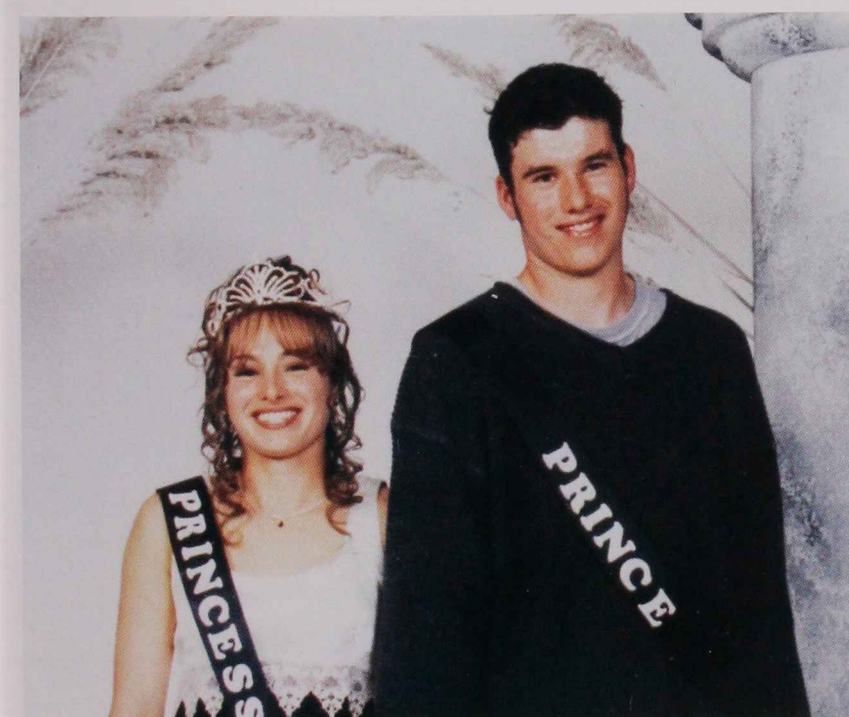

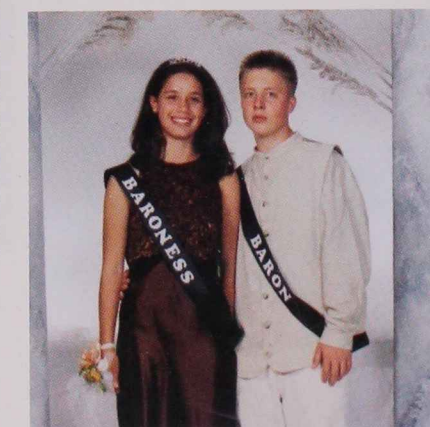

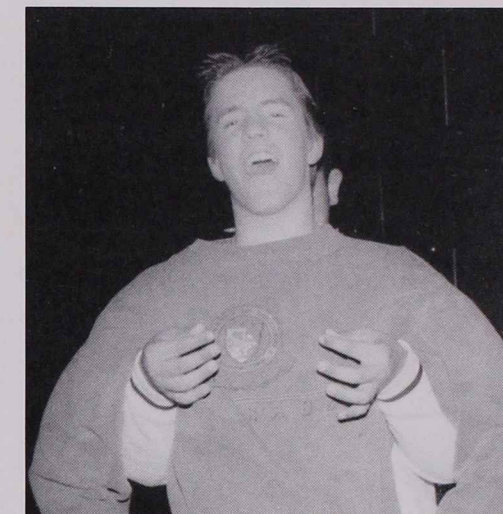

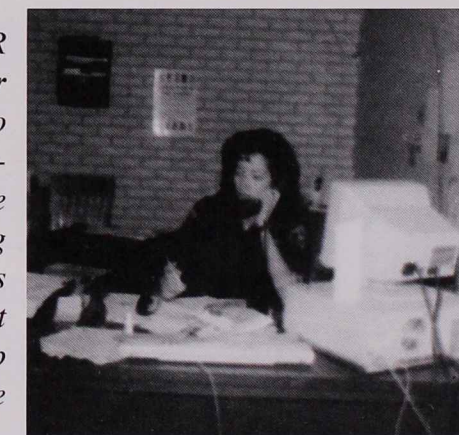

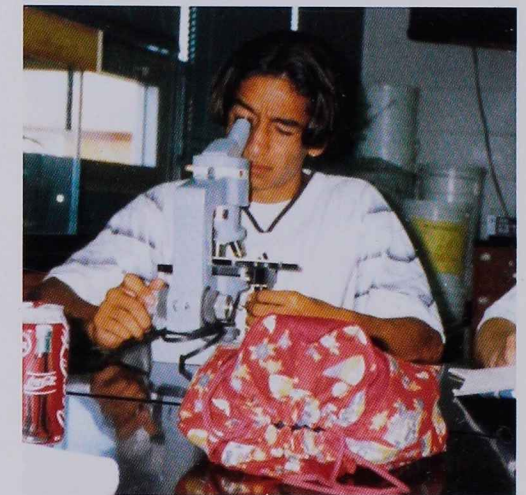
Peace of Work

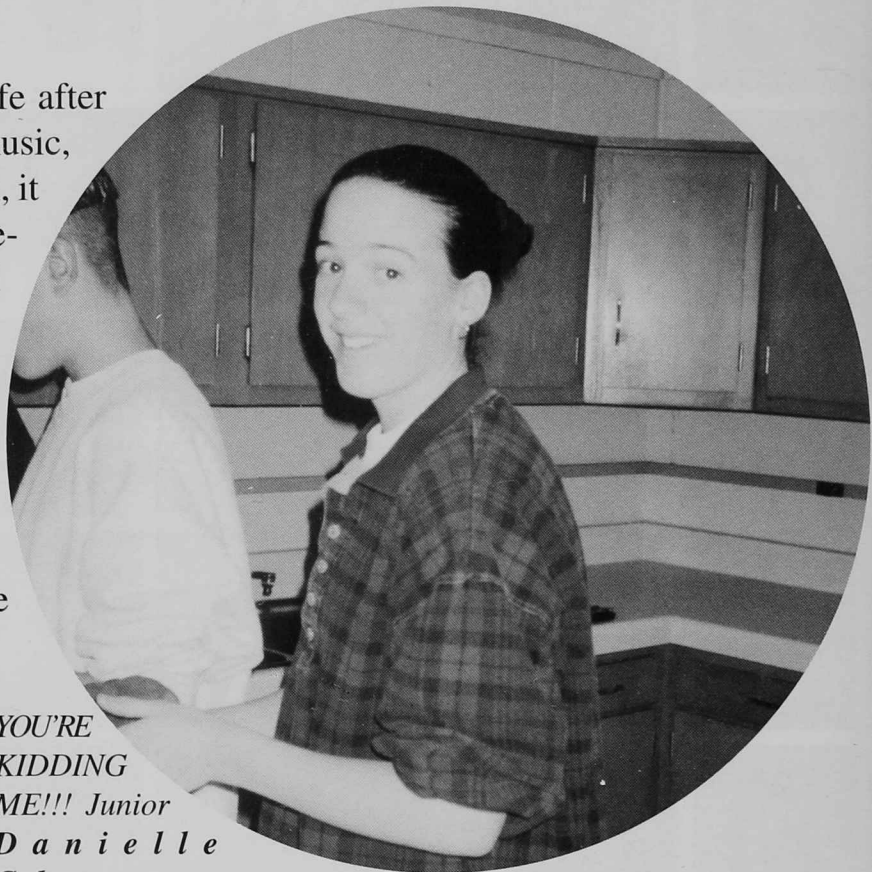

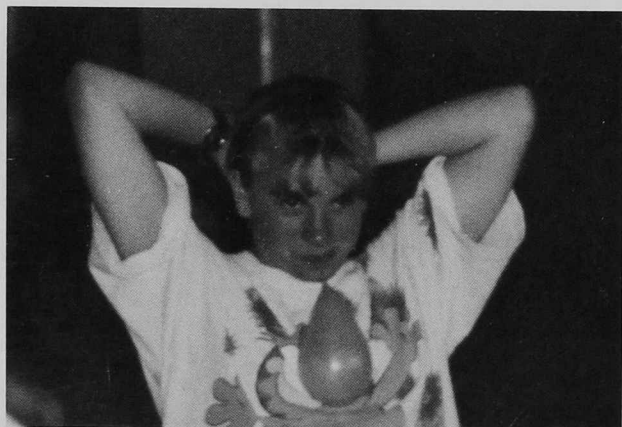

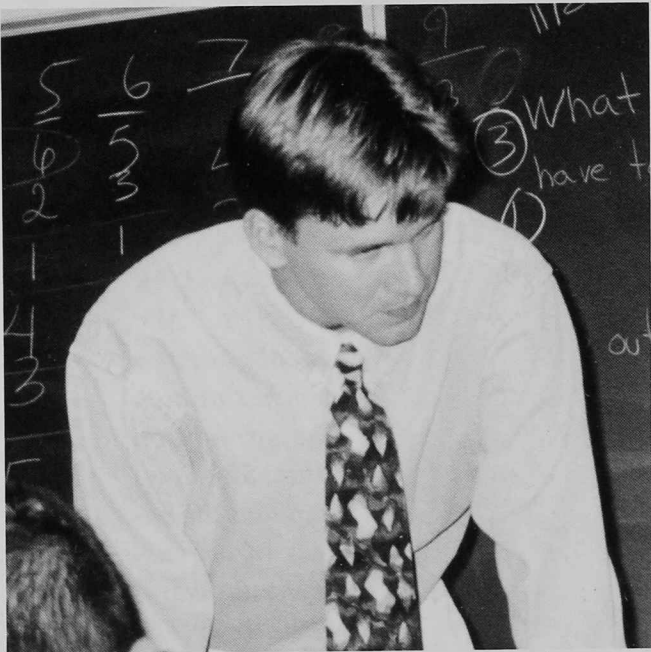

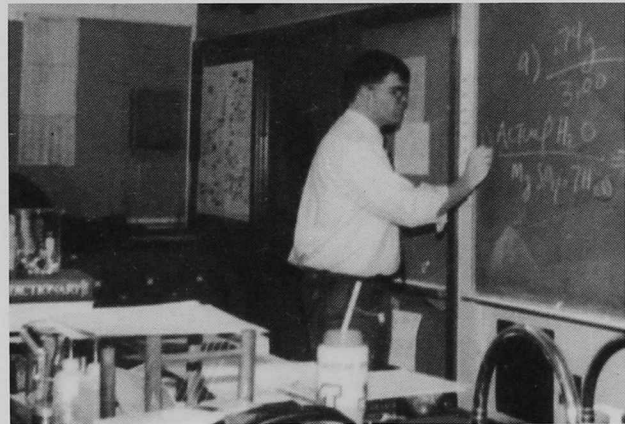

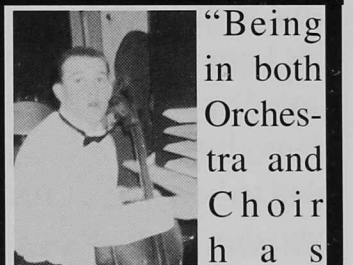

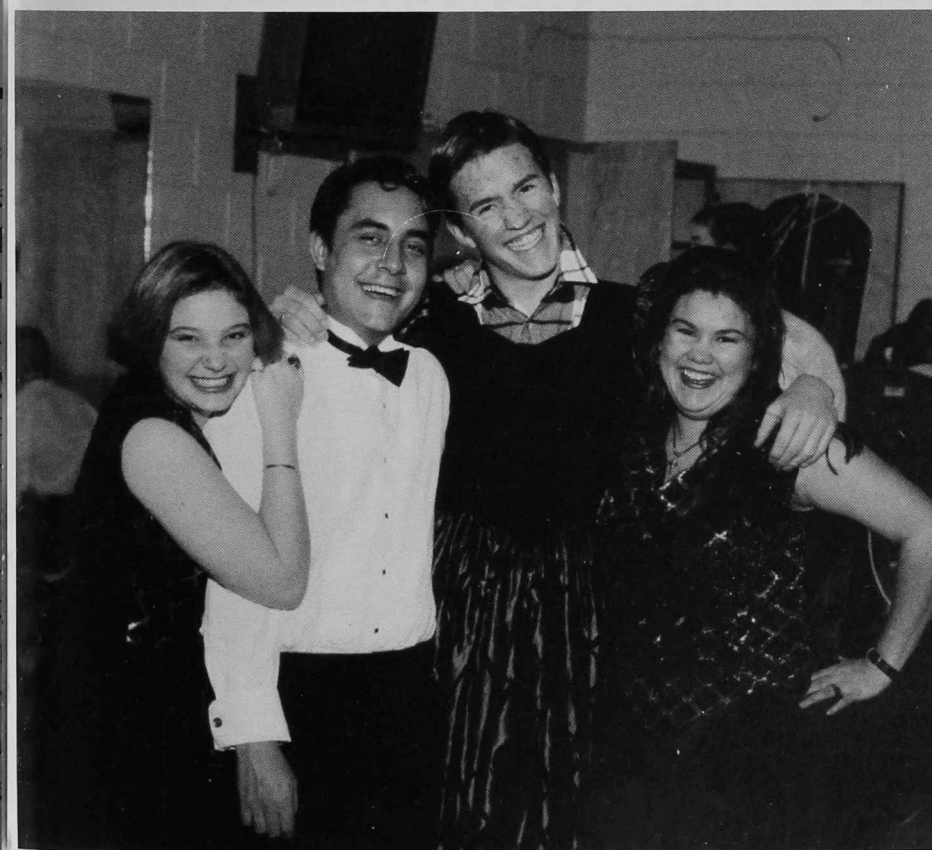

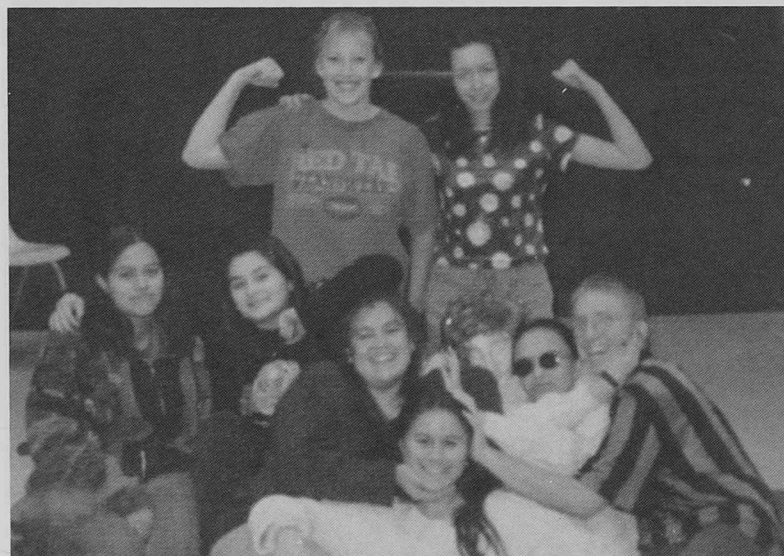
The Show Must Go On

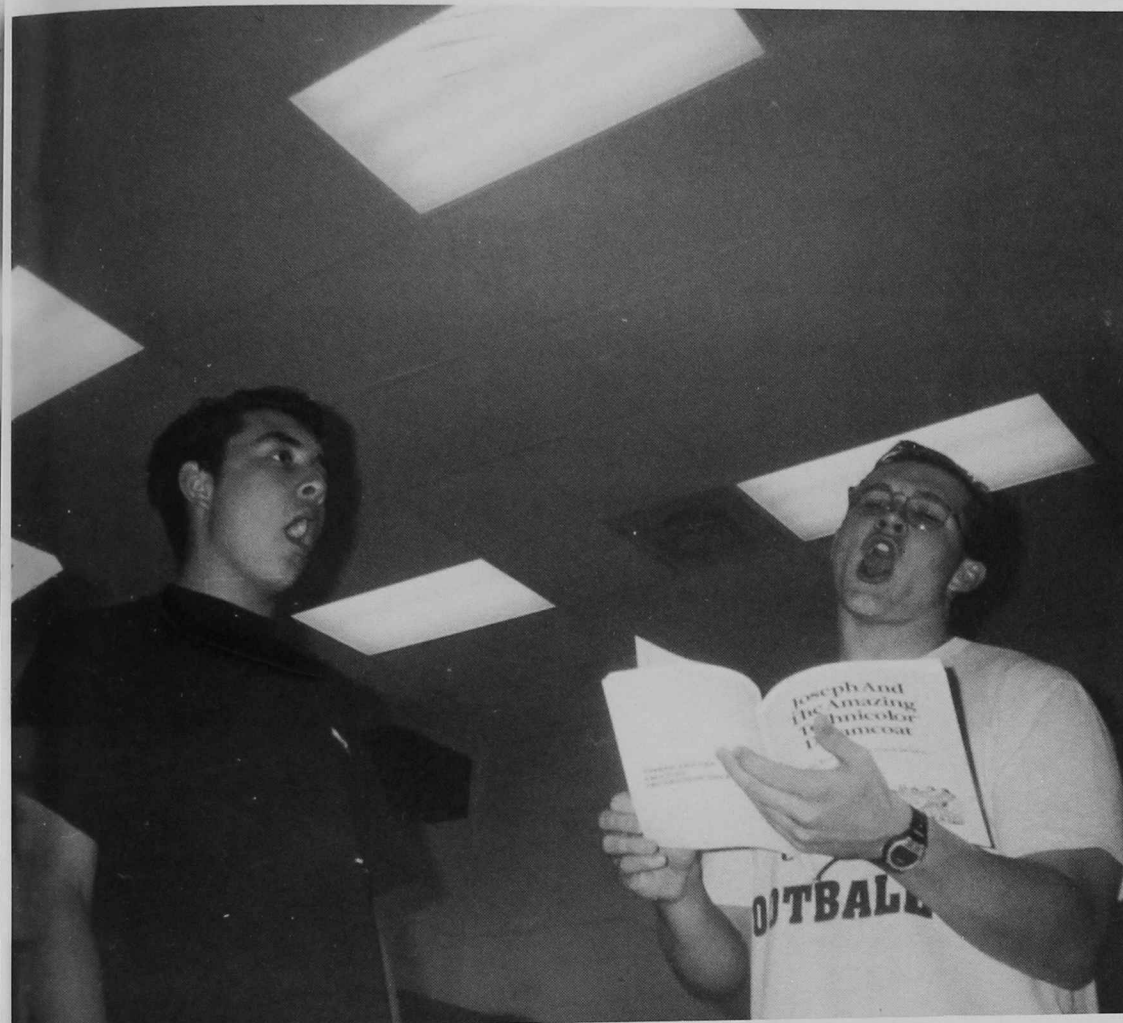

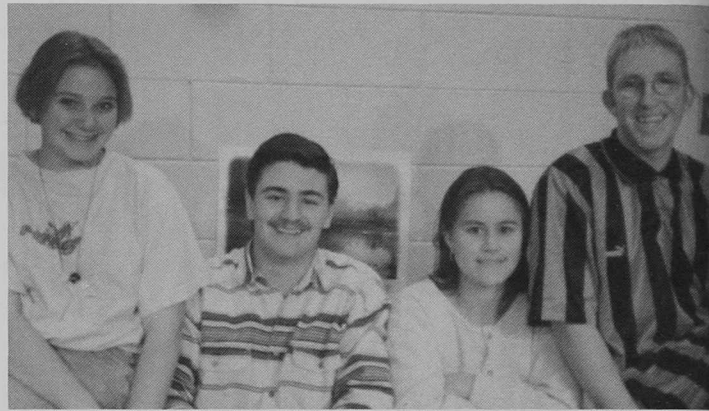

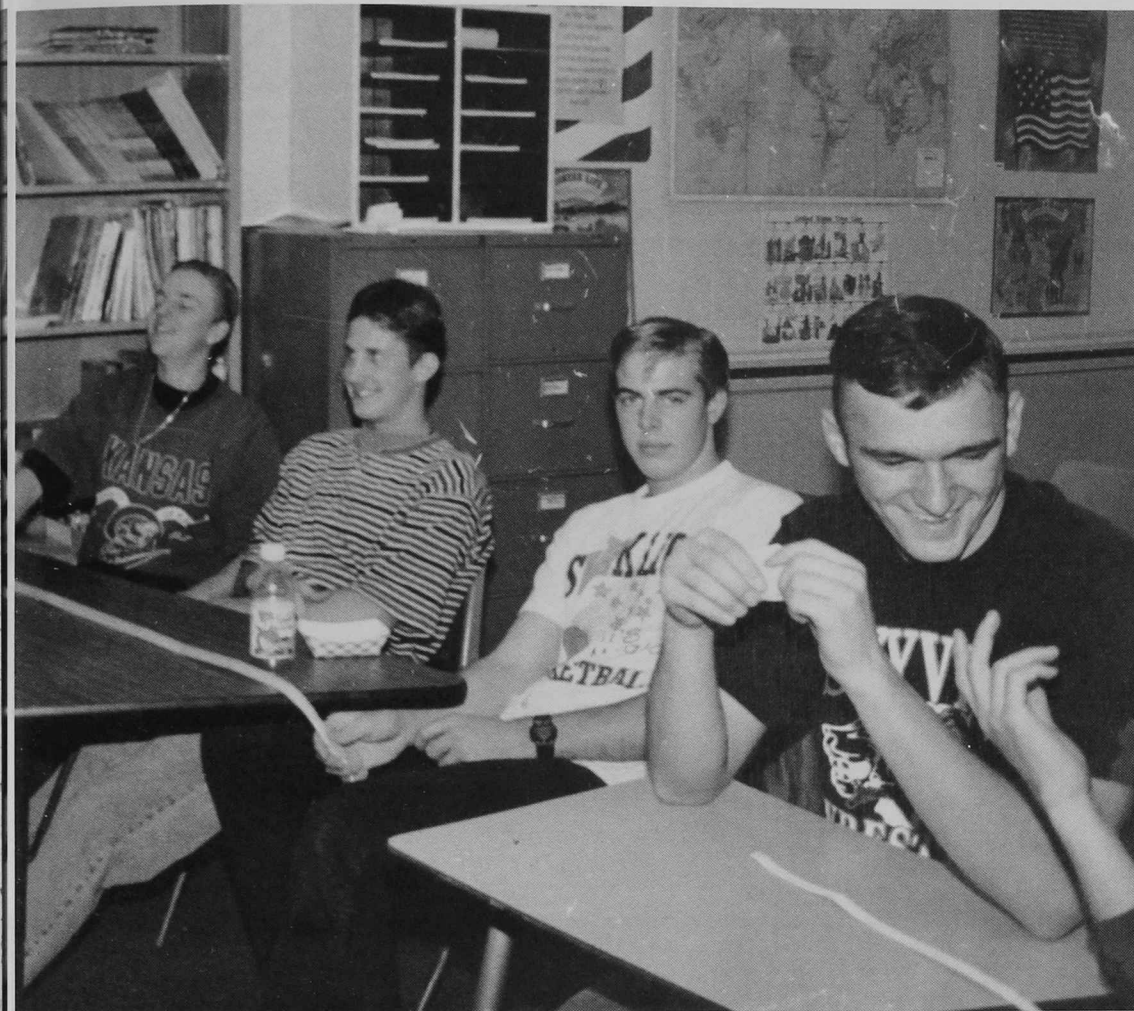

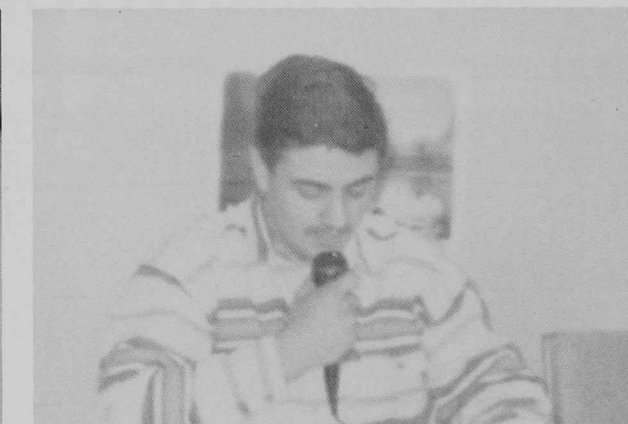

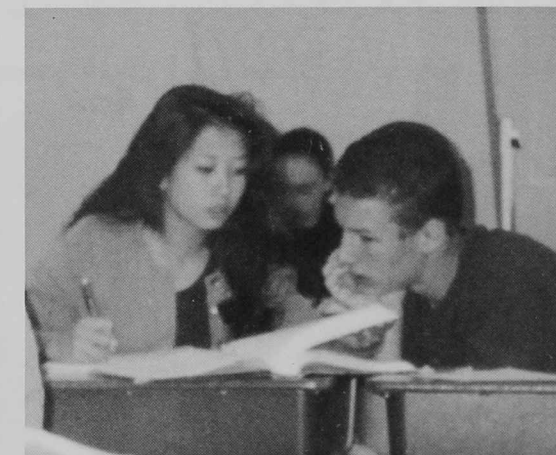

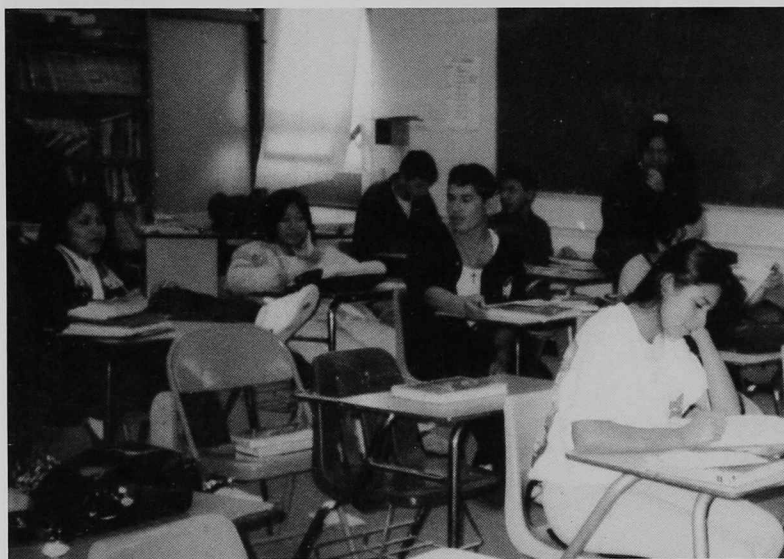
Higher Learning

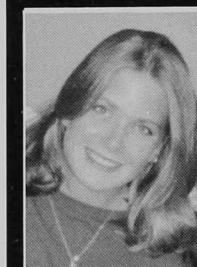

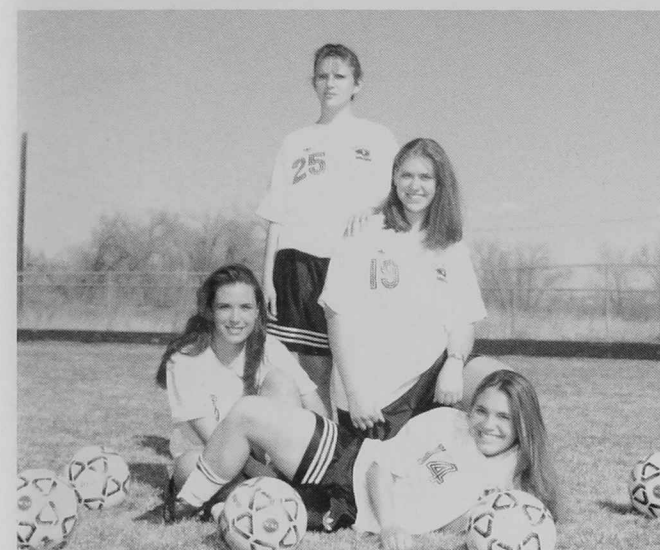

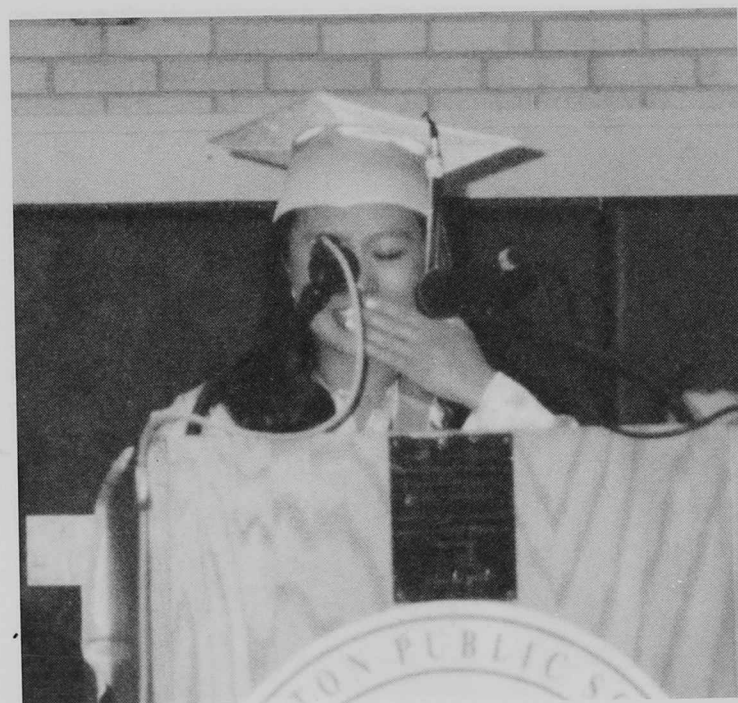

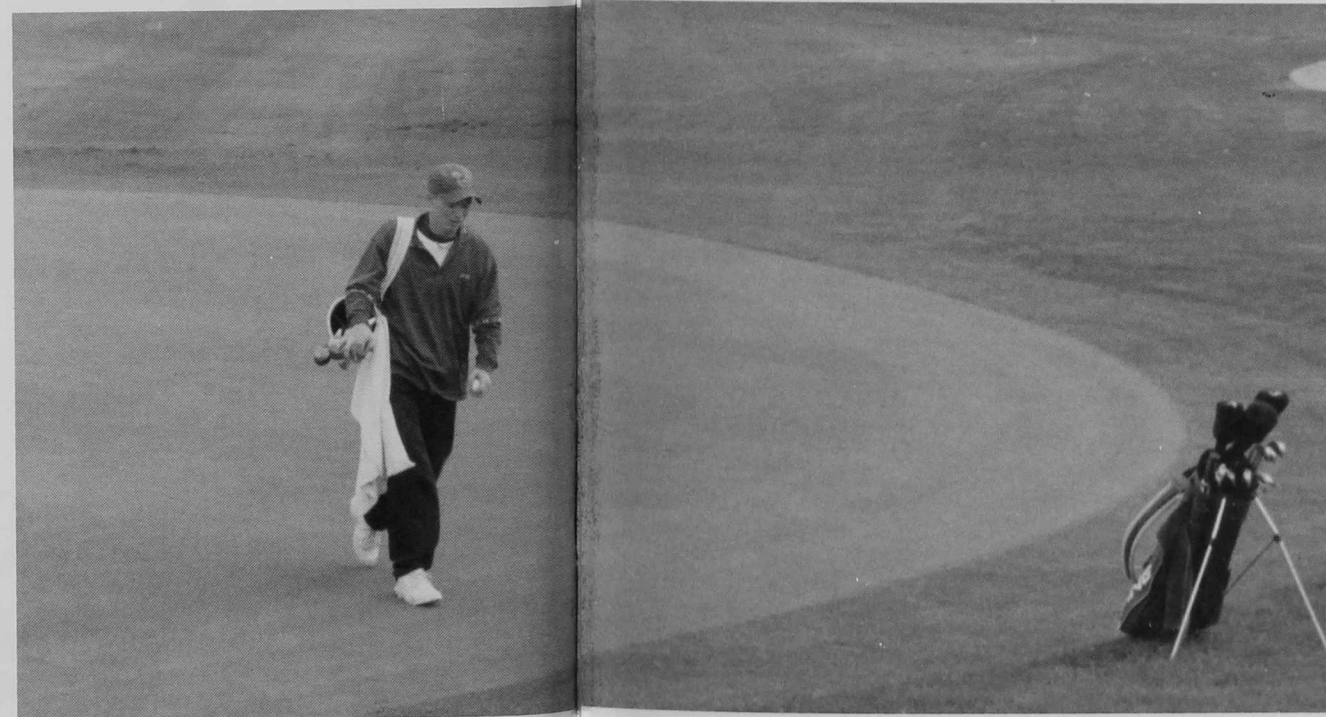

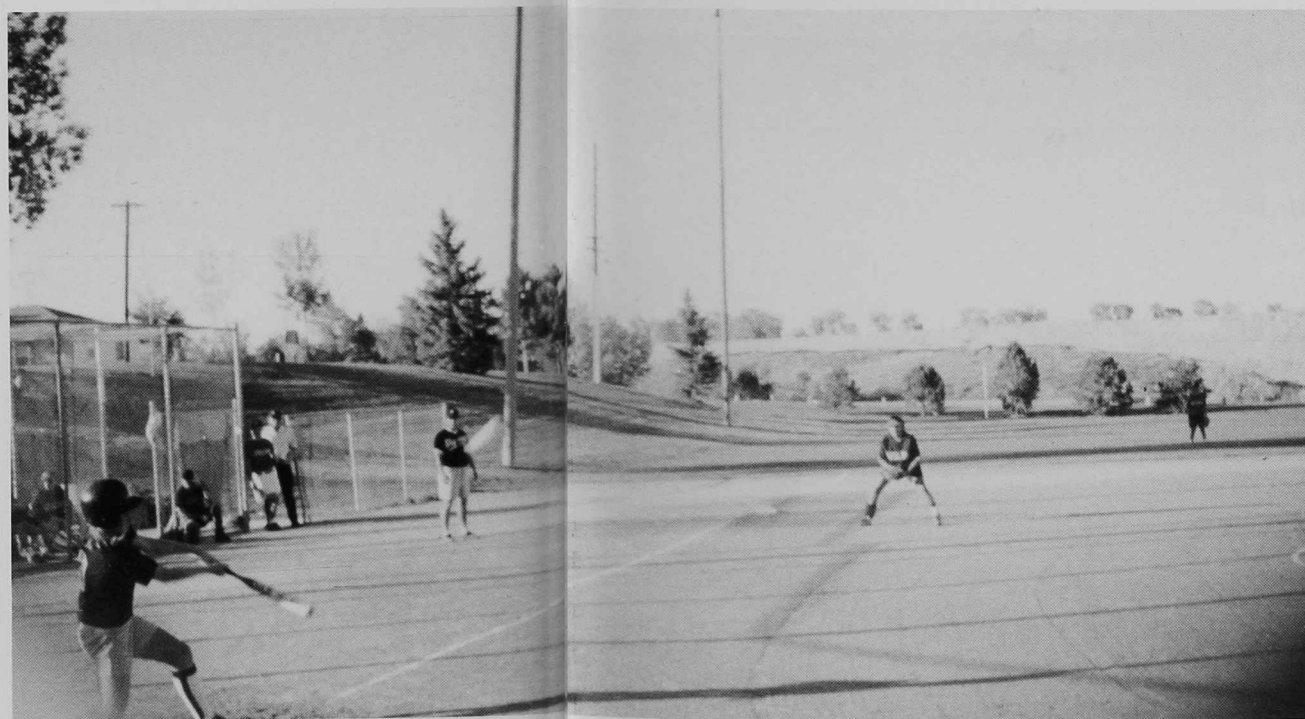

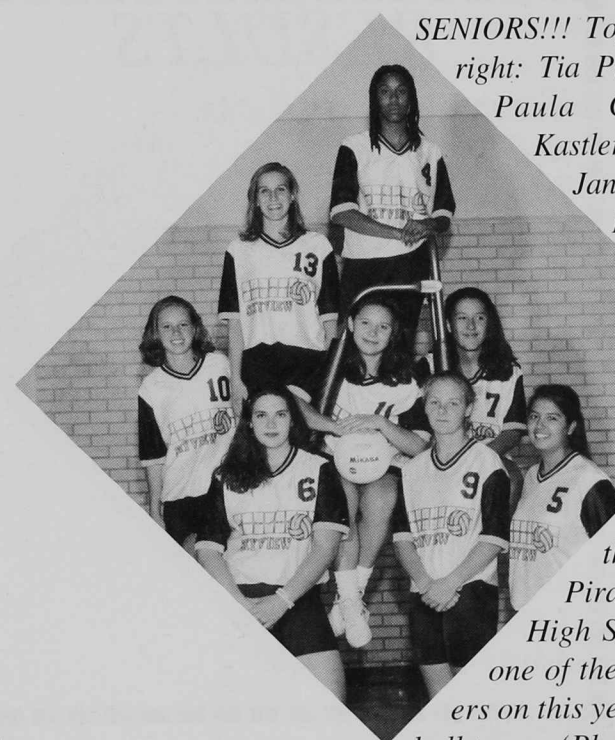
Kills and Skills

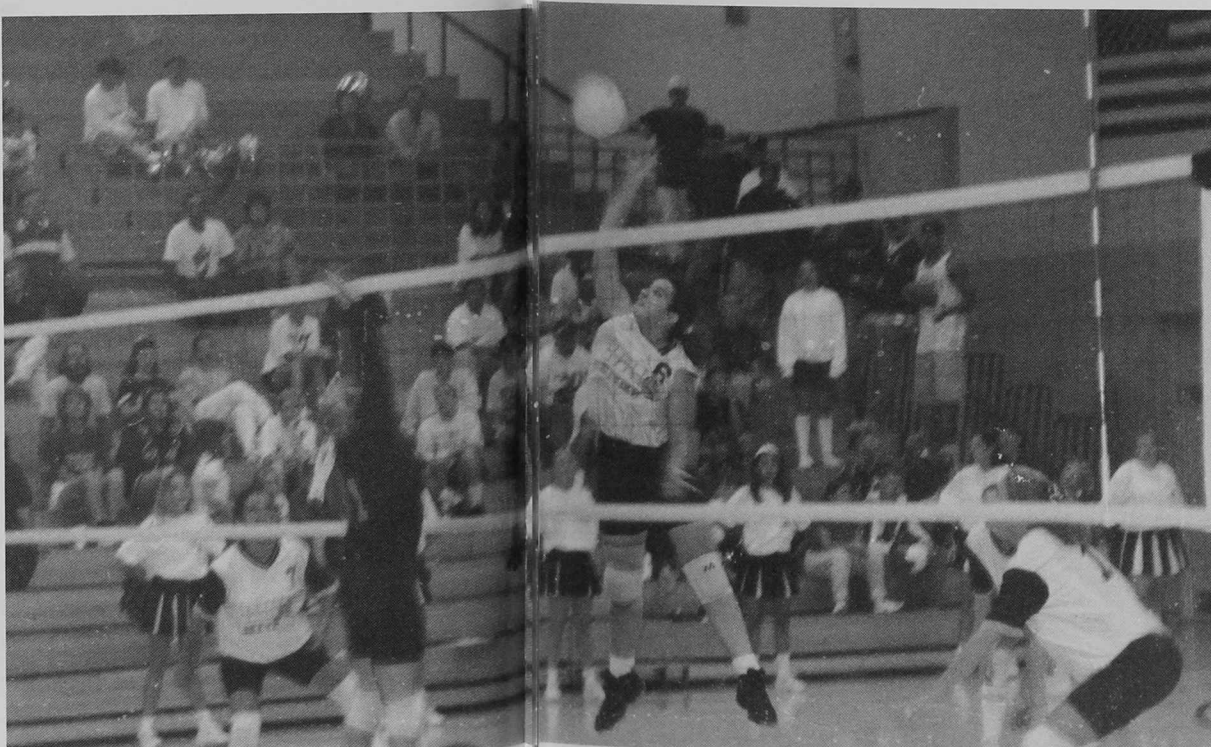

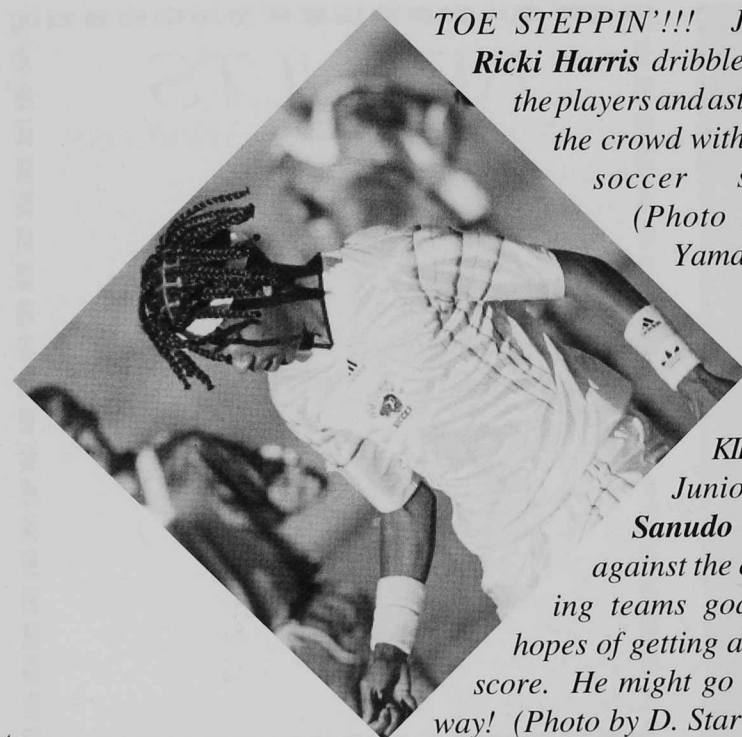
Studs 'R' Us

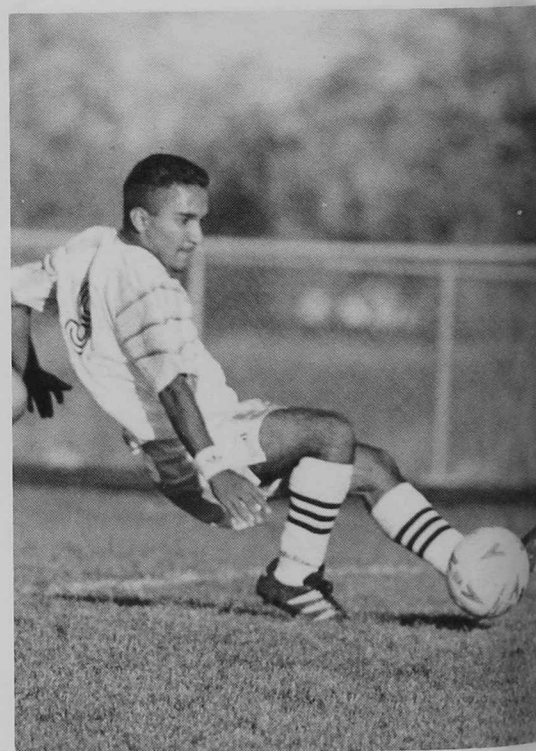

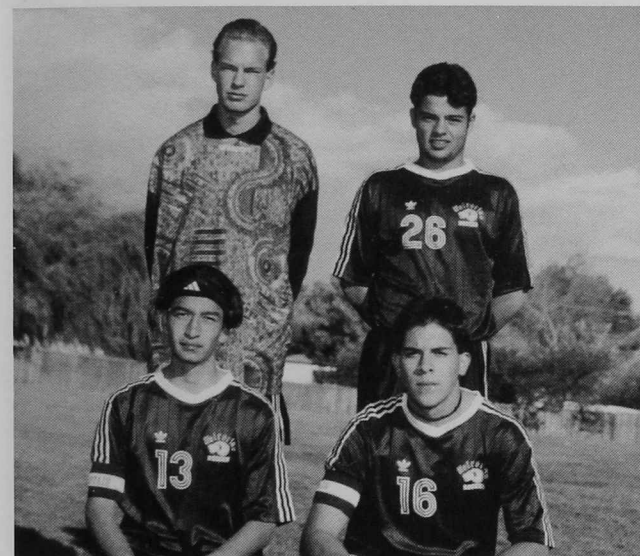

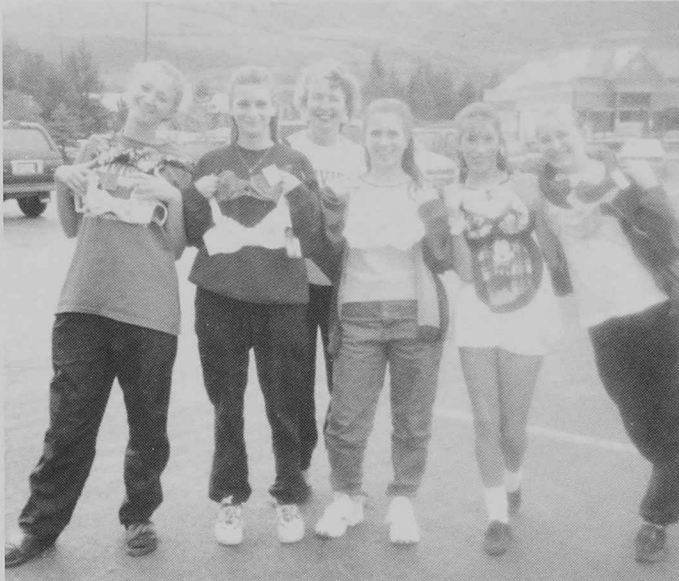

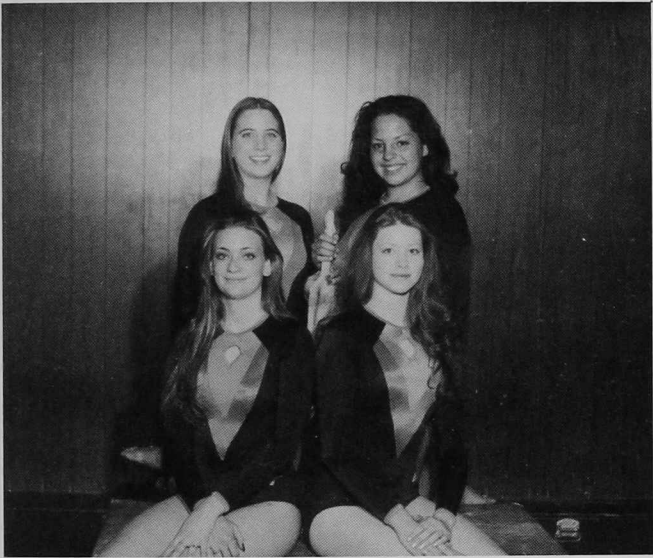

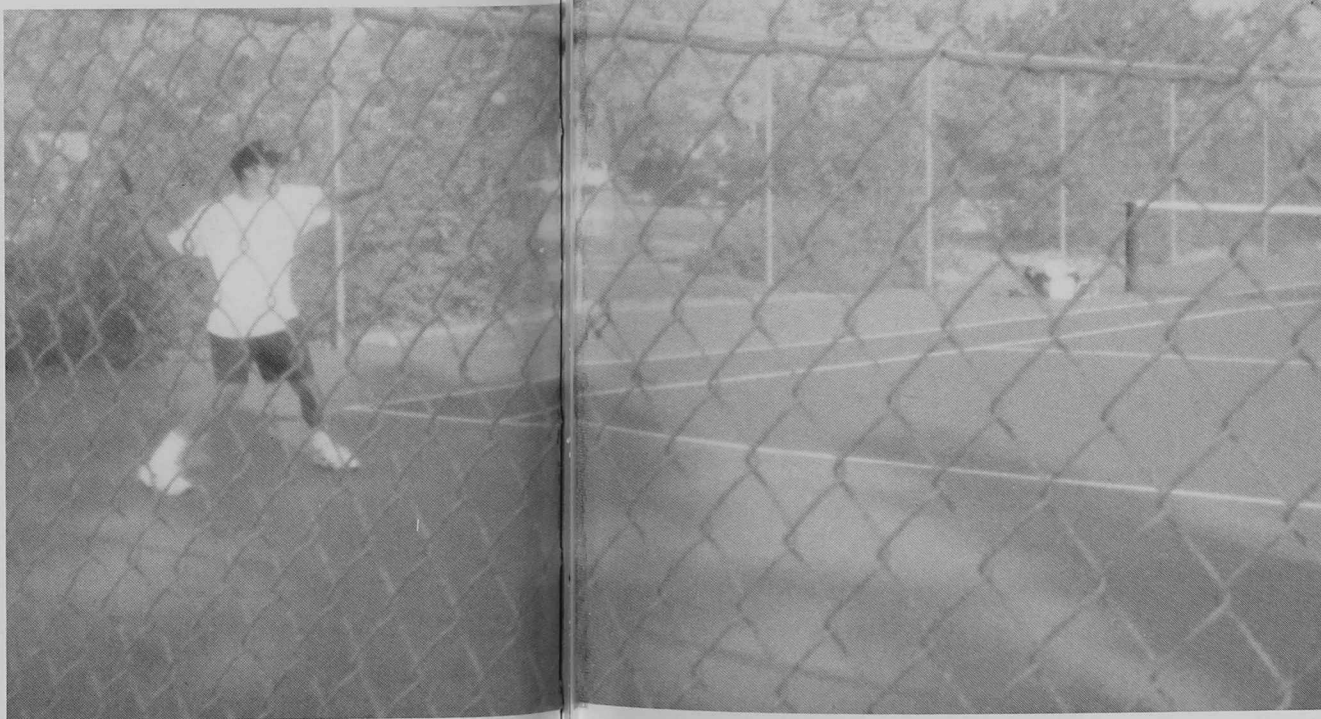

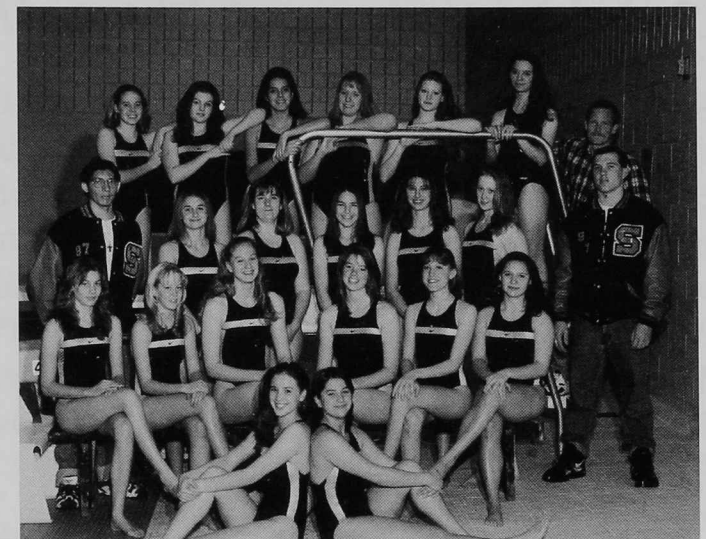

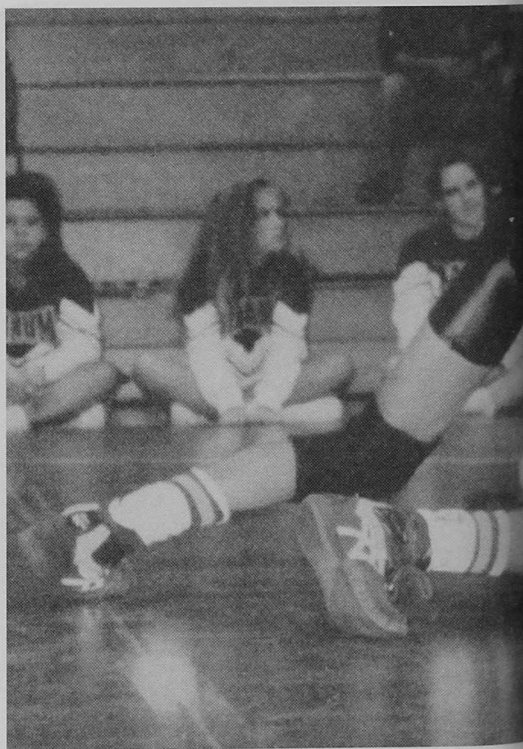

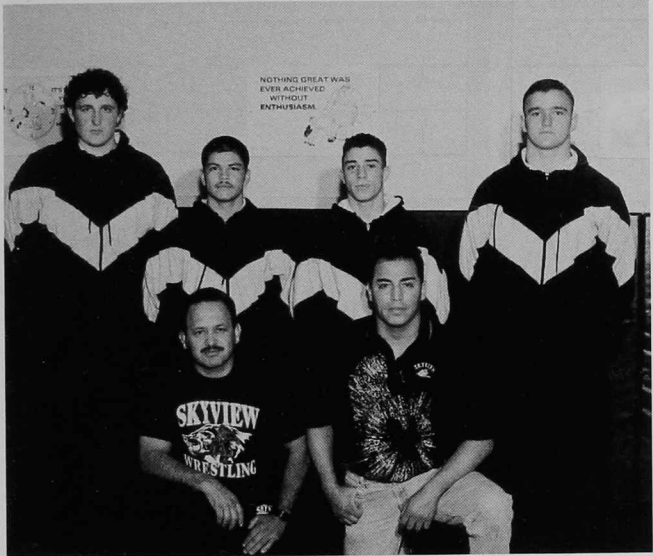

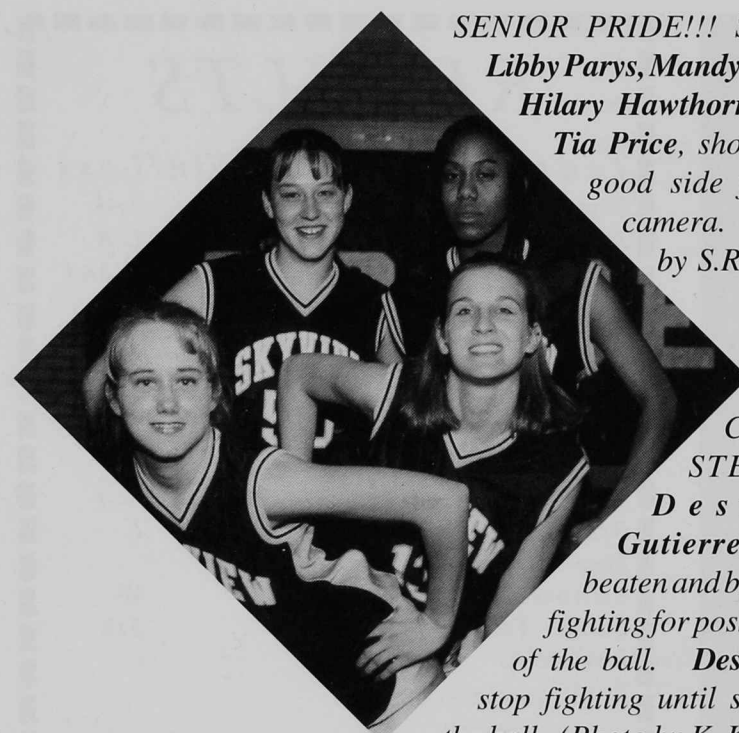
Can You Feel the Love!?

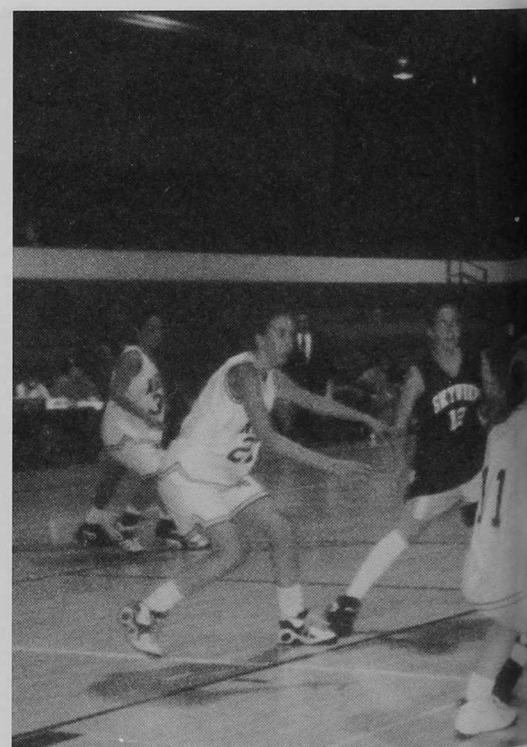

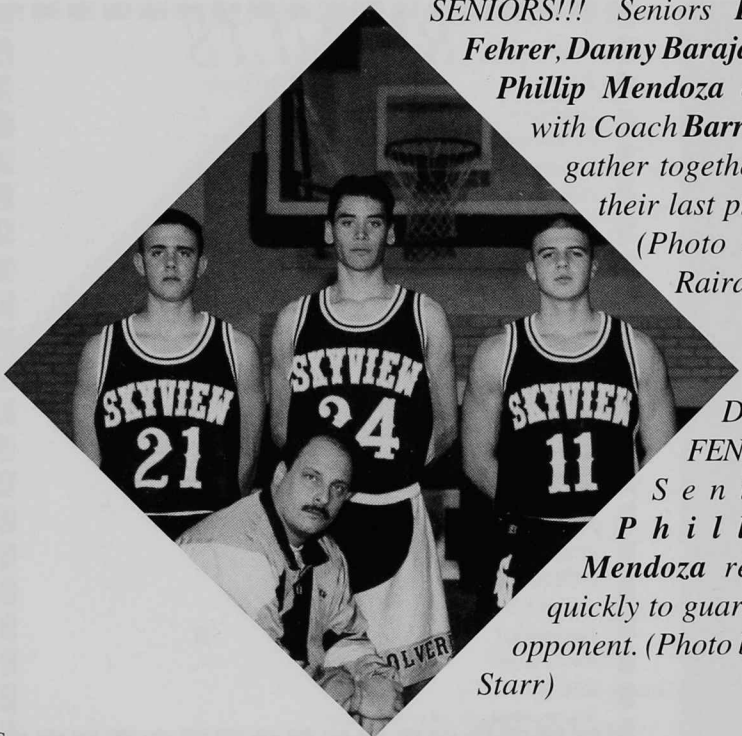
Steppin' It Up

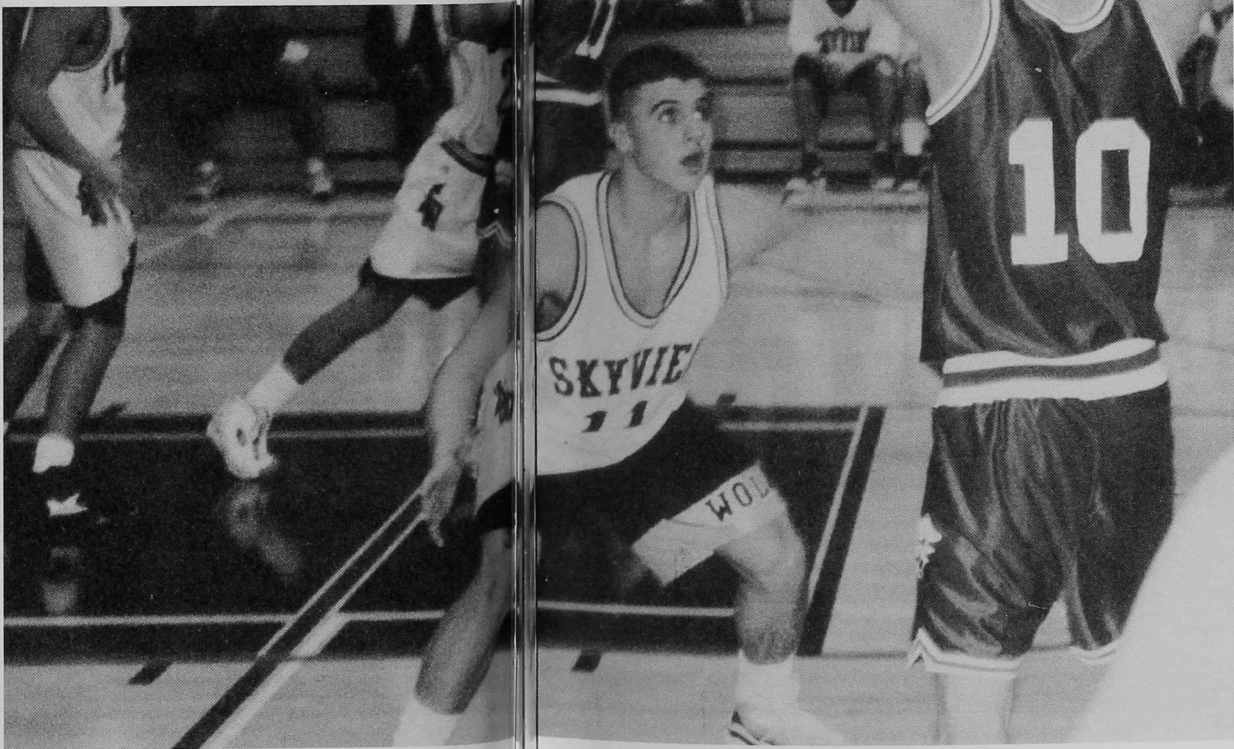

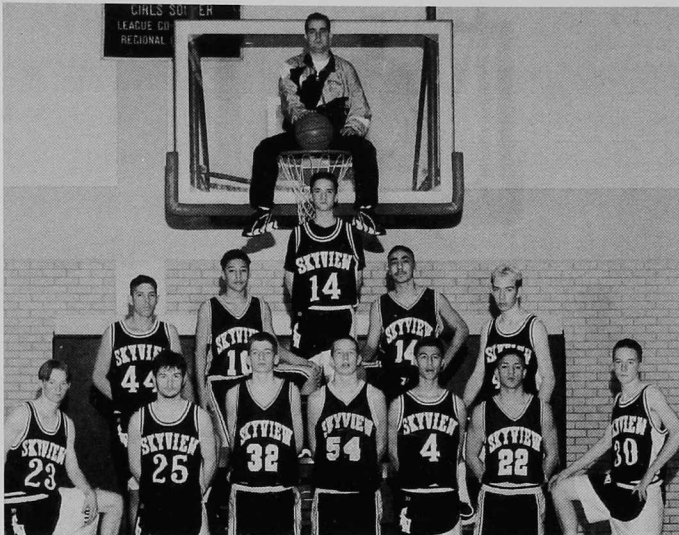
