

2023-2024 School Year Meal Prices and Unpaid Meal Charge Procedure

Pre-K: \$2.95

K-5th: \$3.00

6th-8th: \$3.05

9th-12th: \$3.10

Pre-K-12th: Breakfast is FREE

Adult Breakfast: \$2.75

Adult Lunch: \$4.00

The following Meal Charge Procedure will be enforced in every school.

Students will be allowed to charge a maximum of ten meals. Parents/Guardians will start receiving a text alert twice a week once their students meal account is at \$5.00. We will provide a courtesy meal if the ten meals were exceeded. A courtesy meal consists of a peanut butter and jelly sandwich, vegetable, fruit, and milk.

No student, regardless of eligibility, will be allowed to purchase ala-carte if the student has a negative balance. Even if they have cash. They must pay their lunch account balance before purchasing ala-carte. Parents/Guardians will be able to see your child's balances and charges through Infinite Campus Parent Portal. Deposits to a student's account can be made through the Parent Portal or you can send money or a check with your child.

Free and Reduced Meal Applications are available on Infinite Campus Parent portal. A paper application is available at each school building. If you fill out a paper application, please allow 10 business days to process. You will be responsible for any charges that may accrue on your students account during that period. When you qualify for benefits your household is covered for the remainder of the year and the first 30 days into the next school year.

*Negative balances do roll over from year to year, regardless of eligibility. You can dispute any charges on the account for the current school year. Any charges that remain on the account in past school years will remain on the account and you will be responsible for those charges.
