Crockett Splits Matches with Dyer County By Ron Barry

Thursday's Crockett County sports action found the girls soccer team winning its opening district game at Dyer County, the volleyball team suffering its first district loss while hosting Dyer County, and the middle school softball team blasting Martin 9-1 in its home opener.

GIRLS SOCCER - Kristin Lewis sandwiched two goals around one by Braniya Green as Crockett's Lady Cavaliers improved to 4-1-1 by winning its district opener on the road at Dyer County in Newbern.

Defenders Casey Thornton and Dani Rios contributed assists to the offensive cause and goaltender Hannah Johnson recorded her third consecutive clean sheet as Coach Stan Jamscek's club won its third straight contest.

The Lady Cavs are off until a September 7 home matchup with district foe Obion County Central.

"VOLLEYBALL - The first set was all-out war. Sets 2-4 were more like collateral damage.

After becoming the first AA team all season to capture a set from defending district champion Dyer County, Coach Bobby Rawson's Lady Cavaliers dropped the next three to suffer their first league defeat after a 4-0 start.

Crockett won the first set 26-24 in an epic battle in which the lead changed hands several times and the Lady Cavs received exceptional front line play from Joy Evans and Deonna Cole.

It went quickly downhill from there, however, as the Lady Choctaws showed why they'll be favored to repeat again at district tournament time. Junior hitters Ava Huke and Teagan Reed stepped up after Set 1 and made the rest of the evening fairly miserable for Crockett, taking the final three sets 25-19, 25-12, and 25-16.

While he didn't think his team played poorly, Rawson didn't think it was hitting on all cylinders either.

"We have to get stronger net play and our passing needs to improve if we're going to challenge Dyer County," he said. "Our mistakes are magnified when we play a team as good as that. I thought our back line play was fairly solid, but we just kept giving Dyer County too many chances to put points away."

The Lady Cavs are now 14-5 overall and will next play September 5 in a home match with Milan.

Crockett's shortstop went 3-for-3 from her leadoff spot and has now collected a hit in each of her last 10 official plate appearances to lead the Lady Cav middle schoolers past visiting Martin 9-1.

Just the day before, Thornton was 4-for-4, scored three times, and drove in two as Crockett squashed South Gibson County 15-1. In that contest, Madison Stitts drove in 5 runs with three hits and center fielder Fallon Beaird scored three times in a 3-for-3 hitting performance.

Emmalynn Medlin provided the pitching power in that one, holding the Lady Hornets to two hits and a run over four innings.


