Hello Medford!

It's hard to believe that this summer is coming to a close, but we've been busy with events like our Poet Laureate Installation, the Morrison Park Playground ribbon cutting, National Night Out, and so much more. I had a great time meeting with some of you at my most recent mobile office hours this month, and look forward to the next one (details below)! We've also been busy preparing for Run Medford, and securing important grant funding for departments like the DPW and Council on Aging.

Here are a few of our August highlights:

- Medford was awarded over \$100,000 in MVP Action Grant funding from the Massachusetts EOEEA to help us strengthen and protect our tree canopy against climate change. The funding will allow us to conduct a resiliency assessment so we can understand potential vulnerabilities.
- Our Council on Aging has also secured over \$45,000 in Enhance Digital Literacy for Older Adults grant funding to provide technology classes to senior residents. The funding will be used to purchase and upgrade technology needed for these classes, which will be free of charge and offered in up to five languages.
- Finally, our Charter Study Committee has launched a public survey so you can help shape our local government! The Committee wants to hear from people who live and work in Medford about the city charter through the survey <u>here</u>.

Morrison Park Playground Ribbon Cutting

After a few delays for the rain, we officially cut the ribbon on the newly renovated Morrison Park Playground this month!

The new park features new rubber surfacing, a sandbox, fishnet climber, balance balls, and other preschool-aged play elements. Porous rubber surfacing was also used to protect the roots of the large pine oak tree at the park, allowing stormwater to seep through and flexibility as the roots grow.

Thank you to our Office of Planning, Development, and Sustainability and Procurement for their hard work planning and getting CDBG funding to get another park project completed!

Medford Secures Over \$45K in Grant Funding to Enhance Digital Literacy Among Seniors

The City of Medford's Council on Aging (COA) has secured over \$45,000 in Enhance Digital Literacy for Older Adults grant funding, announced Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn. The funding from the Massachusetts Executive Office of Elder Affairs (EOEA), is for upgrading and purchasing technology that will be used for free technology classes for senior residents.

The Enhancing Digital Literacy program is designed to help Senior Centers better navigate essential digital tools like smartphones, personal computers, and web-based applications. The grant will enhance the Medford COA's ability to fulfill their mission and serve the community.

Despite Summer Coming to an End, Potential Health Risks from Mosquitos Still Exist

The Massachusetts Department of Public Health (MDPH) announced today one human case of West Nile virus (WNV) in Middlesex County and one human case in Worcester County.

Although serious illness caused by WNV is uncommon, there have been 228 cases of WNV in Massachusetts between 2001 and 2022. There were eight human cases of WNV in 2022, ten human cases in 2021, and eleven human cases of WNV in 2020. There have been no other human WNV cases identified in Massachusetts this year.

Medford Secures Over \$100K in Grant Funding to Help Strengthen its Tree Canopy's Climate Resiliency

The City's Department of Public Works has secured over \$100,000 in Municipal Vulnerability Preparedness (MVP) Action Grant funding from the Massachusetts Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs (EOEEA) to research strategies to strengthen the resiliency of its urban forestry network, 2023.

The Committee wants to hear from people who live and work in Medford about the city charter through the <u>survey</u> <u>here</u>. The survey covers topics such as term lengths, term limits, at-large versus ward representation, and more.

Medford to Dedicate Track at Hormel Stadium to Local Marathon Legend Dave McGillivray



The City will be dedicating the track at Hormel Stadium to Medford native and long-time Boston Marathon Race Director Dave McGillivray, founder of the Dave McGillivray Finish Strong Foundation and host of Run Medford, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced. The dedication will take place on Friday, September 22 at 4:30pm, during the first night of Run Medford.

McGillivray graduated from Medford High School in 1972 as class valedictorian. In 1978, he ran from Medford, OR, to Medford, MA, in support of the Jimmy Fund, an organization whose communitybased fundraising events directly benefit the Dana Farber Cancer Institute. He then opened up Dave McGillivray Running and Sports Center in Medford, and soon transitioned to his event management business, Dave McGillivray Sports Enterprises. For the last 36 years, Dave has been the technical director and race director for the Boston Marathon. Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced.

The MVP Action Grant will be utilized to fund an Urban Forest Vulnerability Assessment for the City of Medford. Through this assessment, information will be gathered to help understand the effects that climate change will have on the City's urban forest. By understanding the vulnerabilities Medford's tree canopy will face, the City will be able to implement maintenance strategies and identify opportunities for growth. The project is expected to be completed by early summer 2024.

Medford Residents Have Recycled 954 Pounds of Unwanted Clothing in July

Through its partnership with Helpsy, a textile recycling company, the city has been able to help residents recycle 954 pounds of unwanted clothing in July.

As the largest clothing collector in the Northeast, Helpsy partners with municipalities and organizations across 11 states to collect unwanted clothing and other textiles in order to keep clothes out of landfills. In 2021, the company diverted nearly 30 million pounds of textiles from landfills through a combination of clothing drives, home pickups, thrift store partners and clothing receptacles.

As part of its environmental mission, Helpsy now requires a three bag minimum for pickups. The company is optimizing routes in order to use resources as wisely as possible and reduce environmental impact.
