### **Goal: K-3 Acadience Reading**

By January 2024, Whitesides Elementary will increase the percentage of K-6 students making typical or better growth on Acadience Reading Composite Pathways by 3% from BOY to MOY.

Action Plan:

1. Four reading tutors will be hired, using Land Trust funds to support reading interventions using the SIPPS program.
2. After Acadience testing is complete, the Drill Down diagnostic will be used to identify specific needs of students who are below benchmark.
3. Grade level teachers will meet in professional learning communities (PLCs) to collaborate, plan, assess, and analyze data to drive instruction.
4. The Local Case Management Team (LCMT) will discuss students identified as needing more intense intervention. The team will determine appropriate interventions for the teacher to implement in the classroom and/or request a referral for Special Education testing.
5. Teachers who have not completed LETRS training, will continue to participate in this training.

### **Goal: K-6 Math**

Whitesides Elementary K-6 students will demonstrate 3% growth in mathematics from BOY to MOY as measured by the diagnostic assessment.

Action Plan:

1. Adaptive software will be used to monitor progress.
2. Utilize weekly PLCs to analyze student data and adjust instruction accordingly.
3. Use Acadience progress monitoring to support students below benchmark.

### **Goal: TSI (Targeted Support and Intervention)**

Students receiving special education services for reading will show 2% proficiency growth from BOY to MOY as measured by Acadience Reading.

Action Plan:

1. Utilize SIPPS reading intervention program with fidelity.
2. Trained aides will provide SIPPS intervention.
3. Trained aides will progress monitor to individualize instruction.

### **SEL (Social Emotional Learning) Goal:**

Whitesides Elementary will provide a safe and supportive learning environment by strengthening student SEL skills in optimism, gratitude, and growth mindset.

1. All faculty will conduct morning meetings to incorporate SEL components.
2. 6th grade classes and teachers will participate in 12 weeks of Learning to Breathe instruction by DBH
3. Continue "Compliment Cards" initiative for students.
4. Continue "Gratitude Cards" initiative for teachers.
