

Early Literacy

PAF is a multisensory phonics-based program in which reading, spelling, and handwriting are taught as one unified lesson. It's a beginning reading program that meets the needs of all children, including those at risk for reading failure, and offers instructional techniques based on the latest scientific research.

PAF Program Implementation

PAF will be implemented as a Tier 1 reading program. PAF lessons will be delivered a minimum of 45 minutes to one hour a day, 5 days a week.

Tier 1 instruction for the whole class by the classroom teacher.

Benchmark English Language Arts And Social Studies



Benchmark Advance is our district adopted ELA curriculum

- Benchmark is a balanced literacy approach to ELA
 - Balanced Literacy has five components:
 - Read Aloud
 - Shared Reading
 - Reading Mini Lesson (Mentor Read)
 - Independent Reading

Social Studies curriculum is embedded in the Benchmark units

Daily lessons include whole group and small group instruction









Zearn Math

Teachers will facilitate Small Group Lessons 4-5 times weekly-students work with:

- concrete manipulatives
- show their math
- explain their reasoning to the teacher and sometimes in small group settings with fellow students

Each student completes four Independent Digital Lessons weekly - students work through:

- Fluency
- concept development
- independent practice at their own pace with supportive digital feedback





Bell Schedule for First Grade

- Student Supervision on Yard/Gates open 8:00
- First Grade 8:20-2:40
- Minimum Day Schedule: 8:20-12:30 (Wednesdays)
 - Students who ride the bus will have lunch on campus before boarding the bus
- First Grade Students will have recess/brunch 10:30-10:50 and lunch/recess from 12:15-1:10.



Supplies

We have taken care of the supplies needed for each student. Each student have his/her own toolbox for the storage of the supplies. Throughout the year, we will most likely need to reach out to the families to restock some of the supplies.

Please have a backpack, water bottle, and lunchbox for your child. (remember to label these items with your child's first and last name).

Child Nutrition Services

Birthdays




