Induction of the 26th Class of the Hamilton City School District Athletic Hall of Fame

Danny Grabel

Dan Brandenburg- Class of 1964

Dan Brandenburg is a 1964 graduate of Taft High School where he played baseball and basketball. Brandenburg excelled on the baseball diamond where he was a threeyear letter winner playing shortstop. During his senior season, Brandenburg earned first team ALL-GMC honors. Brandenburg earned a scholarship to Miami University where he played baseball and earned his bachelor's and master's degrees. After his graduation he began his teaching and coaching career. Brandenburg served as the Head Girls' Basketball Coach for eleven years, where he coached several fellow Hall of Famers and started a city wide youth basketball league for fifth and sixth graders. In 1981 Dan was named Hamilton High School Teacher of



the Year. Likewise, in 1990 he was named the Booker T. Washington Teacher of the Year. After retiring from teaching, Brandenburg continued coaching and was named Coach of the Year four times-once at Ursuline Academy (GGCL) and three times while coaching at Talawanda (Mid Miami Conference). Brandenburg still calls Hamilton home.

Diane Holderbach Burtchin - Class of 1993

Diane is a 1993 graduate of Hamilton High School where she earned varsity letters in soccer, basketball, and track and field. On the soccer field, Diane was a four year starter on the soccer team and earned ALL-GMC Honors, two of them being First Team selections. Burtchin was named the team's MVP all four of her years at HHS. Burtchin played in the Cincinnati Classic All-Star Game and traveled to Europe as part of a National Team Tour. On the basketball court, Burtchin was a four-year varsity letter winner while earning ALL-GMC honors on two occasions. During her career, she set the single-season record for assists (129) and the career assist record (347). She was also named to the Butler County All-Stars and played in the Cincinnati All-Star Game. Not only was Burtchin an outstanding athlete, but she was also her class Valedictorian. Burtchin earned her bachelor's degree in mathematics and



secondary education from the University of Cincinnati and her master's from Bowling Green State University. She began her teaching career in the Cincinnati Public School System and currently serves as the Gifted Intervention Specialist at Rossford, where she was voted Teacher of the Year in 2016. She and her husband, Kevin, reside in Pemberville, Ohio, with their two children, Riley and Logan.

Dean Curtis - Class of 1981

Dean Curtis had the unique opportunity to play for both Hamilton Taft (1979-80) and then after the consolidation, for Hamilton High School, where he graduated in 1981. While at Taft, Curtis played with fellow Hall of Famers, Brian Barlow and Don Baker, as they won the Greater Miami Conference Championship. The following year, Curtis again teamed up with Baker along with Hall of Famers, Greg Stokes and Rusty Hargraves, to win the Greater Miami Conference Championship. Both of those teams were led by Hall of Fame Coach, Marvin McCollum. Curtis was the driving force to unifying the two schools, where he had a unique way to unite people and show true leadership skills. Curtis had 104 assists during his senior season. This makes him one of only 14 players in the history of Hamilton High School to have over 100 assists in a season. During that season, Big Blue finished the



season with a 25-1 record--only losing to eventual State Champions Dayton Roth in the regional final in an epic game. Dean was selected to the All Golden Triangle Team. After high school, Curtis attended Urbana University and majored in sociology while playing basketball. He was married to Chamina Curtis and has one son, Ryan. Curtis was an ordained minister and served in a variety of roles. Curtis retired from International paper as a process manager.

Matt Hubbard - Class of 1998

Matt Hubbard was a two sport athlete for Hamilton High School and graduated in 1998. On the baseball diamond, Hubbard was a three-year starter at second base. Big Blue won the Greater Miami Conference Title all three of these years. During his junior season, Hubbard helped lead the Big Blue to the Ohio Division One State Baseball Title with fellow Hall of Fame teammates, Curtus Moak, Chad Pennington, Aaron Cook, and Seth Morris, under the direction of Hall of Fame Coach, Dan Bowling. Hubbard was selected to the All-GMC Team during all three seasons, earning first team selection his junior season. During his sophomore year, Hubbard played the entire season without recording a single error. On the basketball court, Hubbard again was a three-year letter winner. During the 1996-1997 season, Hubbard was named the Top Defensive Player for Blue Blue and led the



team in assists and steals. During his senior season, Hubbard was a First Team All-GMC selection, once again leading the team in assists and steals. Hubbard still holds the record for most free throws attempted in one game (21). Hubbard is the lead carpenter for Meyer Brothers Inc., resides in Hamilton with his wife, Stephanie, and has three children: Braden Hubbard, Preston Ratliff, and Julia Hubbard.

Brittany Lightfoot - Class of 2011

Brittany Lightfoot was a three sport athlete for Hamilton High School, graduating in 2011. During her time at Big Blue, Lightfoot earned 11 varsity letters in volleyball, basketball, and track and field. Lightfoot was a two-time GMC champion and two-time GMC Runner Up in shot put and discus. In 2011, Lightfoot was named the GMC Female Athlete of the Year in track and field. Lightfoot was a three-time State Qualifier--twice in shot put and once in discus. At the state meet her senior season, Lightfoot finished fifth in the discus with a throw of 136 feet and 8 inches, and she was the State Runner Up in the shot put with a throw of 44 feet and 10 ¼ inches. Both of those throws are Hamilton High School Records. Lightfoot earned a Division I scholarship to the University of Pittsburgh where she was a four-year member of their track and field program. In 2013, Lightfoot won the Scholar Athlete Award.



Lightfoot graduated from the University of Pittsburgh with a degree in Criminal Justice. She currently resides in Palm Coast, Florida, and is a Deputy Sheriff.

Joe Mosketti- Class of 1979

Joe Mosketti, a 1979 graduate of Hamilton Taft High School, was a captain on the football team and member of the track and field team. In both sports he was named the Team MVP. Mosketti was a three-year member of the football team and named ALL-GMC his sophomore season. During his senior year, Mosketti again was named ALL-GMC First Team, All Golden Triangle First Team, Honorable Mention All State, and Selected to the Ohio North/South Football All-Star Game. Mosketti was twice named the Journal News player of the week and set a Taft High School School Record for Longest run, 95 yards against Dayton Alter. Mosketti earned these accolades while only able to play in six games his senior season after breaking his ankle. Mosketti set the GMC Record in the shot put and won the District Championship his senior season. Mosketti received a full scholarship to play football at the University of Michigan, graduating with a Bachelor of



Science Degree in Education. While playing for the Wolverines, Mosketti was part of the team that played in the Blue Bonnet Bowl, the Gator Bowl, and the Rose Bowl (two times). Mosketti served as Assistant Strength and Conditioning Coach at Michigan and the Head Strength and Conditioning Coach at the U.S. Naval Academy. Mosketti works as a sales representative for Worthington Steel. Mosketti and his wife, Karen Griesinger Mosketti reside in Havre De Grace, Maryland, and have three daughters: Amanda Onorato, Samantha Fields, and Jenna Yapps.

Adam Pankey - Class of 2012

Adam Pankey, a 2012 graduate of Hamilton High School, was a member of the football, basketball, and track and field teams. In football, Pankey was selected First Team ALL-GMC for three seasons. Pankey was also twice selected to the ALL-District team and selected to the All-Ohio team following his senior season. Pankey helped lead the 2010 Big Blue team to the OHSAA playoff and was named team captain his senior season. Pankey was also All-Conference and multiple regional qualifier in both the shot put and discus. Pankey had over 30 scholarship offers and decided to sign with West Virginia University, where he ended up being a three-year starter, having 36 career starts for the Mountaineers. Pankey earned the Garret Ford Academic and the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll. Pankey received All-Big 12 Football Honors his senior year, being named to the Second Team Honors. Pankey was selected and played



in the 2017 East-West Shrine Game. He graduated from West Virginia with a bachelor's degree in multidisciplinary studies. After college Pankey signed a professional contract with the Green Bay Packers, and he recently finished his sixth season in the NFL playing for the Packers, Tennessee Titans, Miami Dolphins, and currently with the New York Jets. Pankey and his fiance, Jalan Brown, reside in Liberty Township and have one child, Alayah.

Gary Richardson - Class of 1998

Gary Richardson is a 1998 graduate of Hamilton High School where he was a vital member of both the football and track and field teams. Richardson was a three-year varsity letter-winner in football where he played for fellow Hall of Fame Coach, Ed Mignery. Richardson was elected as the team captain for the 1997 team. His leadership and linebacker play helped lead Hamilton to an undefeated season, a Greater Miami Conference Championship, and a berth in the OHSAA Division one playoff. Richardson earned First Team ALL-GMC Honors that season. Richardson was also a standout on the track, where he was coached by fellow Hall of Fame Coach, Skip Taylor. Richardson was a two-time state qualifier where he and his teammates continue to share the school record in the 4 x 100-meter relay, with a time of 42.5 seconds. Richardson was named the Outstanding Senior Athlete at Hamilton. Richardson earned a scholarship to Miami University, where he played outside linebacker. Richardson graduated from Miami with multiple degrees, including his



Bachelor's of Science in Health Appraisal, Master's of Science in Exercise Science, and his MBA. Richardson works for Cincinnati Insurance where he is an underwriter. Richardson and his wife, Carlyn, live in Cincinnati and have four children: Joshua, Joslyn, Jonah, and Jolene.
