


Current Guidance Happenings

Guidance is now collecting the \$40 per exam non refundable down payment for your Advanced Placement Exam(s). The deadline to make your deposit is **Friday, November 2nd**. Payments of cash or check (made payable to ORRHS) will be accepted in the guidance office. If you miss this deadline, an additional \$40 per exam late fee will be added to your exam cost. The full cost per exam is \$98 with the exception of Seminar and Research, which is \$146 per exam. If you qualify for Free or Reduced lunch and would like to apply for a waiver, you must contact Guidance prior to Friday, November 2nd, for approval. Students that are approved to receive a waiver will be responsible for a payment of \$15 per exam, due by November 2nd to avoid the \$40 per exam late fee. SAT Information

Are you planning on taking the SAT? Here are some important deadlines to remember:

- Sept 7 is the deadline to register for the Oct 7th test
- Oct 5 is the deadline to register for the Nov 4 test
- Nov 2 is the deadline to register for the Dec 2 test



The Buzzards Bay Coalition is a nonprofit organization dedicated to the restoration, protection, and sustainable use and enjoyment of our Bay and its watershed. As a volunteer, students will join a network of volunteers of all ages and backgrounds who are passionate about the Buzzards Bay region and clean water.

Their biggest upcoming volunteer opportunity is the Buzzards Bay Watershed Ride, one of their signature fundraising events taking place on Sunday, October 1st. The Watershed Ride is a scenic bike ride throughout the Buzzards Bay watershed region. With three routes of either 100, 75, or 35 miles, around 400 riders every year ride throughout the South Coast and end in Woods Hole. They are looking for volunteers to help support the riders at start lines, water stops, along the course, and at our finish line party.


