### Community

Radnor Township is located 13 miles west of Philadelphia and has a population of approximately 30,000. Radnor Township covers nearly 14 square miles and serves a diverse, multicultural population.

### Curriculum

The following is a breakdown of requirements for the class of 2024: 4 credits of English; 3 credits each of Social Studies, Math and Science; 2 credits of Arts & Humanities electives; 0.5 credit of Physical Education; 1 credit of Health; 0.5 credit of Technology or Business; 4 credits of additional electives. This totals a minimum of 22.5 credits.

## Instructional Levels

Students are grouped by instructional levels in all academic departments: English, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science and World Languages. Advanced Placement (AP), Integrated (Interdisciplinary English & Social Studies) and Seminar (math only) level courses are considered the most rigorous courses in the core disciplines, followed by Honors (H), Advanced (A) and College Preparatory (CP).

### National Merit Recognition 2023

The RHS Class of 2023 was proud to include 4 National Merit Scholarship winners, 17 National Merit Scholarship Finalists, and 47 National Merit Scholarship Commended Students. All semi-finalists in the Class of 2023 were named Finalists.

## College Board Advanced Placement Recognition

In May 2023, 477 RHS students took 1,063 AP exams. Over 84% of Radnor students scored a 3 or higher.

### Weighted/Unweighted GPA

RHS uses a weighted GPA system to reflect levels of instruction. Courses designated as AP, Integrated, Seminar and Honors receive weighted quality points as noted in the table on the left. Advanced and College Preparatory classes receive unweighted quality points.

### Grade Point Average (GPA) & Class Rank

he GPA is cumulative, including all courses taken at RHS except those aken Pass/Fail. Both a Weighted and an Unweighted GPA are reported on the transcript. The Unweighted GPA does not account for levels of nstruction in a course. No class rank is recorded on a student's transcript.
