We collaborate with students, teachers and parent/guardian to provide support and resources to meet students' needs and work alongside community members and agencies to provide necessary support and resources.

Schedules



- Schedules will be available September 1st at 3:30pm for all students. You may request a change in your schedule within the window of September 5 at 3:00pm through 11:59pm. The new course being requested must be offered the same period.
- * Changes will NOT be made for the following reasons:
 - Change of class order
 - Change of lunch
 - Change of teacher
 - Class requested is full
- * If your students schedule is missing a core subject, students were incorrectly placed, or has a hole, they will come to the counseling center during the period there is a conflict, and their counselor will fix their schedule.
- * If your student was taking Math over the summer for advancement, their counselor must have transcripts from semester 1 and 2 prior to the start of school for the change to be made.


High School and Beyond Plan

- * Through various school activities, students will complete posthigh school readiness lessons that help match their skills and interests to possible careers.
- * Mr. Tyshawn Ward will be contacting students within the first week to begin/continue the process.
- * Throughout 9-12th grade, students will learn how to research their careers, explore post-high school opportunities, college and career paths for their future, while making connections to their high school classes.
- * The HSBP is a Washington State Graduation Requirement.
