## Health

The district shall provide for health screenings as required by law in the areas of:

- 1. Vision
- 2. Hearing

The purpose of such screening is to identify those children who are likely to have defects that will affect their studies.

Students who are enrolled in the Migrant Education program who haven't had a physical in three years may be eligible to receive a physical through the Migrant Program during the school day. A signed Parent Permission form must be obtained within ten (10) school days prior to the physical for the physical to occur.

The superintendent shall institute a screening program that complies with the requirements for frequency of screening, the standards for screening and the qualifications of those who do the screening established by the State Board of Health.

The parents of students who are identified as having health defects shall be notified of the results of the screening. They shall be informed of the significance of the handicap on the child's learning and asked to report to the school the recommendations of those health care professionals who were consulted.
