It was a pleasure over the past week to welcome our governors on site for on site governor monitoring - they also met with small groups of children to talk about their experiences at school and has some great feedback.

LEARNING SNAPSHOTS

Year 1 have really enjoyed this week. They have been measuring length and height in centimetres in Maths. In English the children have been reading the poetry anthology 'Out and About.' They have been exploring vocabulary for different parts of nature and writing poems about mud and water.

Ask me: How to measure something in centimetres ?



Year 2 have enjoyed science this week! We have been thinking about what a plant needs to survive and we have been planning and completing two different germination investigations. The first investigation has been testing how important water is to the growth of plant. We have planted cress seeds and have put them on our window sill. We have been watering the seeds in 2 pots, but the other two do not get any water. The second investigation is observing whether different sixed seeds germinate at different rates.

Ask me: what does the word 'germination' mean ?





Children in **Year 3** have been really engaged in their 'People and Places' mini art project this week. They created a fabulous piece of artwork in the style of LS Lowry to reflect scenes at school. In English children are continuing to delight in our book 'The Iron Man' and were inspired to create a class poem on the story so far. Ask me: Using a simile, how big is the Iron Man?



Year 4 have been working hard with fractions this week, thinking about equivalent fractions and converting between mixed numbers and improper fractions. In Geography the children worked in groups to consider man-made and natural disasters. They used a Venn Diagram to sort out disasters with careful consideration of any disasters which they felt could be both natural and man-made. In PE, the weather was kind enough to allow the children outside this week and they had a fun PE lesson with Coach Fizz.

Ask me: What are equivalent fractions ?



This week, **Reception** have been reading the story 'Rosie's Walk' by Pat Hutchings. They created plans and maps for Rosie to go on a different route to get away from the cheeky fox! They have also been observing aerial photographs of farmland and painting their own inspired pictures.

Ask me: Can you describe our route to school ?
