Year One have been exploring addition and subtraction up to 20, getting ready for their new Maths topic after Christmas. The children have enjoyed using the resources to make numbers up to twenty and have been ordering the numbers. They have also been using the counters to do some addition and subtraction up to twenty.

Ask me: how can I use a part whole model to show how to make 20?


