LEARNING SNAPSHOTS

Year One have been working hard on their 'Uses of Materials' Science project. Their final challenge was to create some bunting that was rainproof and would flutter in the breeze. The children tested a variety of different materials and put their findings on a venn diagram to help them decide which materials to use. They decided that greaseproof paper, tinfoil and laminated paper would work best. The children have hung some bunting in the classroom and some outside. They will be observing the bunting over the coming weeks and comparing how the different materials hold up. Ask me: How do I put information into a venn diagram?

In **Year 2** we have been learning about animal adaptations in Science this week. We learnt about why adaptation is so important to different animals to ensure their survival and the different ways they do this. We then spent time decorating some moths, we decorated some that were not camouflaged and some that were. After we hid them in the garden, some Year 4 'predators' arrived to see how many moths they could hunt! Ask me: what are some of the different ways animals have adapted?

Rafi Year 3 have worked hard to complete their 'Bell Beaker' inspired clay pots this week. They used the clay skills practised last week to mould their creations. Then they peer-assessed their creations considering form and pattern, and gave feedback on what worked well. The children are looking forward to bringing them home next week! Ask me: What are the steps to creating a clay pot?



Year 4 have been learning about climate zones in Geography this week. The have used the atlas to learn about climate in North and South America. In Healthy Minds, Coach Fizz talked to the children about good and bad listening and they were able to role play and work on their good listening skills. In English the children listened to the sound track of a story and tried to guess what the story was about. They enjoyed writing their own stories to match the sound track. Ask me: What are the different climate zones?

## **Children's Mental Health**

Mental health is discussed openly with the children at Eton Porny. We know that good mental health is as important as good physical health. We understand that when children are stressed or fearful, they are least able to learn and think clearly.

It's a worrying statistic that 1 in 6 children aged 5-16 are likely to have a mental health problem (The Children's Society, 2021). Good mental health helps children develop the resilience to cope with whatever life throws at them and grow into well-rounded, healthy adults.

Things that can help keep children and young people mentally healthy include:

- being in good physical health, eating a balanced diet and getting regular exercise
- having time and freedom to play, indoors and outdoors
- being part of a family that gets along well most of the time
- going to a school that looks after the wellbeing of all its pupils taking part in local activities

Other factors are also important, including feeling loved, trusted, understood and safe. Children who are optimistic, and resilient, have some control over their lives and feel like they belong are more likely to have good mental well-being.

At Eton Porny, work around mental health is completed through various areas of the curriculum and through assemblies and discussion. All staff at Eton Porny have completed a 'Mental Health Champion' training course. Mrs Bergin, is our Mental Health Lead and she completed her Senior Mental Health training last year. We are also lucky enough to have a small group of Year 4 children who are our Mental Health Champions and support other children by offering a 'listening ear'.
