

#### SAFETY FIRST: REMINDERS

Many of our students are car riders in the mornings and/or afternoons. It is important that parents driving on campus during these times observe safe driving habits. This includes driving slowly, observing the established traffic pattern, and watching for students who are crossing. Also, cars should not stop in the middle of crosswalks. Parents should drop off or pick up students in designated areas only. This helps prevent unnecessary crossing in front of buses or other motor traffic.

Parents should drive AROUND the building (following the desig-

nated car lane) to drop students and pick students up in the afternoons at EXIT 2 ONLY.

All car-riders will be dismissed at Exit 2 in the afternoons and are expected to be dropped off there as well.

ALL morning drop off should happen at EXIT 2, using the car lane and driving all the way around the building. This includes choir, band and orchestra.

Students should never be let out of vehicles in the parking lot containing school bus traffic. Crossing guards will be available to assist walkers.

Please remember that the bus and car lanes designated by identifying marks on the pavement, cones and a sign are to be observed during the hours of 7:50am-8:40am and 3:00-3:40pm for the safety of our students and staff.

There is parking available behind the gym at the back of the building if you need to enter the building during these times. Follow the car lane for this parking.

If you cannot attend, please acquire the following.

Violins/Violas:

1) Instrument RENT do not buy yet. 99% of students will not be on a full size yet.

2) Measures of Success Book One for Violin/Viola

3) Shoulder Rest (I recommend the brand Kun. Everest is also acceptable. Please don't buy Resonans).

4) Rosin

5) A soft cloth (A really soft microfiber cloth or old cut-up tshirt will do! For cleaning rosin dust)

6) Instrument name tag

7) MUST have a pencil every day in class. You may also like to purchase a tuner. Some small and affordable options are Snark or Korg

Cellos/Basses:

1) Instrument RENT do not buy yet. Students will not be on a full size yet.

2) Measures of Success Book One for Cello/Bass

3) Floor stopper (Sometimes called a rock stop. Cellos recommended to use a strap instead of a "puck" as pucks tend to slide). 4) Rosin

5) A soft cloth (A really soft microfiber cloth or old cut-up tshirt will do! For cleaning rosin dust)

6) Instrument name tag

7) MUST have a pencil every day in class. You may also like to purchase a tuner. Some small and affordable options are Snark or Korg
