GlenOak's academic offerings include a traditional college preparatory curriculum, several honors Advanced Placement courses, College Credit Plus (Post-Secondary) and an International Baccalaureate Programme, which is complemented by several Career and Technical programs. 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College Credit Plus (CCP) Courses

Students earn both high school and college credit for CCP courses. CCP courses can either be taken at the college or, at the high school. CCP courses taught at GlenOak are taught by high school teachers with adjunct professor status per university standards. GlenOak has partnerships with Stark State College of Technology, Kent State University at Stark, Aultman College and Franklin University.
