School Bus Safety Rules

- ▶ Be at the bus stop 10 minutes prior to the arrival of the bus. Never run to or from the bus
- ▶ Wait at your designated stop in a safe place, back from the side of the road
- ▶ Do not board the bus until it has come to a full stop and the driver indicates that it is safe to board
- ▶ Remember never to stand in the danger zone that surrounds the bus. The danger zone is 10' from all sides of the bus
- ▶ All Kg-3rd grade students must be met at the bus stop by a parent. Please do not wait in your car or house
- ▶ Parents cannot go on to the school bus.

Rules for Riding the Bus Safely

- ▶ Take your seat and sit properly, facing forward at all times. The driver or principal will assign seats as necessary
- ▶ Wear your seatbelt at all times
- ▶ Remove your backpack and place it under your seat or on your lap
- ▶ Keep the aisle clear at all times
- ▶ Always keep your head, hands and arms inside the bus
- ▶ Talk quietly; the driver needs to concentrate to safely drive the bus.
- ▶ Be absolutely quiet when approaching a railroad crossing
- ▶ Please do not bring any toys on the bus and keep cell phones and other electronic devices in your backpack
- ▶ Eating and drinking is not allowed on the bus at any time. This rule protects students or drivers that have food allergies, prevents choking, and maintains bus cleanliness.
- ▶ Always follow the bus driver's instructions

Walkers

- ▶ Students that are picked up by their parents at the end of the day are called walkers.
- ▶ Kindergarten walkers are dismissed before all other students.
- ▶ They will exit out of the front door of the building
- ▶ Parents should stand by flagpole
- ▶ Please do not approach the students who are lined up or call your child to you.
- ▶ Teachers will have the children point to their parents. You should then wave so that we know you saw your child.
- ▶ The teacher will release the child to come to you.

Tips for a Smooth Transition

 - ▶ Get's plenty of sleep
 - ▶ Eats healthy meals
- ▶ Limit video games and TV time
- ▶ Develop Routines
- ▶ Talk to your child about what to expect
- ▶ Send in an extra set of clothes - Accidents happen

Attendance

- ▶ It is very important that your child attends school.
- ▶ Any absence from school requires notification to the school nurse's office. Some reasons for an absence may be illness, doctor's appointment, religious holiday or vacation.
- ▶ Notification can be made either by phone, email or note (only if sent in advance). Please clearly indicate your child's name, their teacher's name and the reason for the absence. If the absence is for a planned extended period of time, such as a vacation, please provide the dates the student will be absent and the expected date of return. If your child is absent for a religious holiday, a note will always be required and may be provided in advance of the holiday.
- ▶ Sayreville has an automated phone system that will call to notify you of your child's absence regardless of whether you have called already or not. If you have already called to report the absence or sent in a note, an additional call is not necessary.
- ▶ If your child is kept home for illness, they must be without a fever without the aid of medication, i.e. Tylenol, Advil, or any fever reducing medication), vomiting and/or diarrhea for 24 hours before returning to school.
