Public Comment

- Adi Sodri shared the reasons why her family moved to Tenafly due to high performing school system. She read best practices by the experts of the state should be followed. In addition, the experts shared fencing, guards, windows that prevent bullets are important, and feels the board of education is keeping the security in low concern. She asked the board president, if there was a shooting, would she still present the current scenario or would she change to improve security. Board should feel a shooting will happen here. It's a matter of where and when as there is a store that sells weapons within the town.
- Stuart Conboy speaking in favor of having Class3 officers in each school, and the reasons for supporting these officers. The time gap until the police come would be filled with the Class3 officers present. Used Sandy Hook as an example of this. Also, Townville, South Caroline, people were killed in twelve seconds by the shooter, and how the shooter had access to the school before the officers arrived. Police indicated luck on how the shooter was caught.
- Avihai Sodri, husband of Adi, shared his experience as a military officer in Israel where someone who would shoot cannot be prevented. Feels that concerns and documents are neglected over the years.
- Soyung Pak wants to remind everyone where the budget is to advance the progress of the students. Students have a better chance of winning a lottery than being shot. Maybe mental health and awareness should be invested with students. Gun safety allows students to die at home than in school. If the district is irrational about security, taking funds away from advancing the students with better curriculum, training, facilities with the budget. Student safety is of concern, but not the shootings as indicated overall. SROs doesn't always prevent shootings being onsite siting Parkland as an example. Officers on site is a fantasy.
- Allan Todd shared has listened to previous meetings. Wanted to correct what the previous person said. Says he sees people on the board looking at the phones, and not paying attention to what is being shared. Feels something should be done about security and terrorism. One life and one student is enough. One incident outside of school is a concern. Feels there isn't enough open dialogue about the issue at hand to where the community

and school district is working together. Needs to be a “We” instead of an “Us” vs “Them”. Would like to know the rationale.

- Bryan Rudolph wants to respond to some comments made earlier regarding SROs, safety. Also, shared New Jersey practices are in place. Also, it’s difficult to draw from other countries with strict gun laws is not a fair comparison. Feels all the people are missing the point. Commonsense gun laws is not the responsibility of the board. Laws prevents gun shootings. This district has not looked at the evidence and data and not annotates.
- Poli Loslw shared her entrance of where came from and how came into Tenafly. Came here to realize the American dream, and new educations to come. Parent of two children is concerned about the safety in Tenafly. Had an experience in Tenafly at the Middle School where was able to enter freely without being stopped, and asked for identification. Feels guards, fences are needed. How can we ensure the children’s life is protected from any danger from criminals in any school as she did that day in the Middle School? Asked her child in the elementary school, what you would do if someone came into the school, and his response was to jump from the window. Feels the programs at the school should be directed to what children should be doing.
- Jam Mishkin wanted to respond to each of the speakers. Setting up questions to each makes the board look like they don’t care about the children which isn’t fair. The district has good protocols in place. Gun violence in America is a concern. The board of education is not the place to deal with security. It’s the State of New Jersey public officials where the concerns should be, and not to the board.
- Maya Doran is concerned about children’s safety in schools. Watched August, 2022 meeting by the Tenafly police department, and appreciated the content. Feels armed police guards would protect children. Class 3 officers have been place by a number of school districts in the area and has been welcomed where Tenafly should consider Class 3 officers. Emotional stress for children should be addressed on an individual basis.
- Adi Sodri wanted to respond to a person who commented earlier and was wrong and irrelevant regarding children’s safety. Talking about statistics are very strange when it comes to security for the children. Shootings can happen anywhere. Parkland shooting is a town like Tenafly. Taking risks on children’s lives cannot be accepted.
- Soyung Pak responded to the person who brought her name up earlier. The risk is so small based on the data and statistics that are out there is relevant. Feels funds should be used for students and not security. Reinforced her earlier comments.
- Jocelyn Schwarz commented about the concerns raised. Feels everyone’s interest comes from the heart on this topic. Students’ safety is a concern by all on the board, administration and in the room from the community. Thread Assessment Teams mandated for the 23/24 school year must be in place. Students learn what to do in each school with security drills held monthly.
- Bruce Watson also commented that this is an emotional topic, and there is more ingredients to putting security measures and ideas in place. Many factors are needed to be considered. Also, it depends on funds available to implement certain things.
- Inbal Israeli Miller wanted to clarify one of the comments. NJ security has best practices to refer to regarding SROs. Shared that some items were wrong and correct represented by public comments.

- Avihai Soudri wanted to repeat what wanted to say earlier today, and clarify what Bryan Rudolph said. No decision made on the round table discussions on what was shared. Need to come to the committees to share items and topics from State of N.J. is just lack of concern by the board.
- Jocelyn Schwarz responded to concerns. Opra requests can be submitted to inquire about reports.
- Inbal Israeli Miller responded to the accusations, and clarified her interests.
