

Background Information The Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) is a federally-funded, state-administered program. SFSP reimburses approved program operators who serve free healthy meals and snacks to children and teens (18 years and younger) in low-income areas when school is not in session. In 2023, FWCS served 6,699 breakfasts, 35,504 lunches, and 17,842 snacks for a total of 60,045 meals at 28 sites.

SFSP Supports Food Insecurity

Feeding America defines food insecurity as when a family, in the past 12 months, has worried that their food would run out before they had money to buy more.

St. Joseph Community Health Foundation

- In Allen County alone, approximately 14% of our population is food insecure, including children.
- Food-insecure individuals are more likely to have chronic diseases, such as diabetes and cardiovascular disease, resulting in higher healthcare costs.

• Cultivated our own produce for Nutrition Ed classes.


Introduced Breakfast Coffee Bar Pilot at High Schools:
