# I.W.A. HONORED AS EXEMPLARY SCHOOL

## IWA HONORED AS ONE OF U.S.'S BEST

Remember the "visitors" last spring? Well, we did it! Incarnate Word Academy was selected as one of 277 outstanding public and private secondary schools in the nation to be singled out as a model for the nation by the U.S. Department of Education. The notification was made June 20. Education Secretary William J. Bennett said each of the schools selected "represent the strength and vitality of America's pluralistic system of education."

IWA was one of 65 private schools and 212 public schools selected as models for the nation's schools. Other Texas private schools selected included Monsignor Kelley from Beaumont and Greenhill School in Dallas. The private schools selected include 39 Catholic schools.

Each school selected will receive a plaque and a flag from the U.S. Department of Education. Incarnate Word was judged along with other Catholic private schools by the National Catholic Education Association for the federal contest. The schools were judged by a visiting team of educators last spring on "13 attributes of success" while the public schools were judged on 14 other attributes and seven "outcomes or indicators of effective school programs" including test scores and enrollment rates.

For the private schools, the attributes included: a clear statement of philosophy; challenging students to grow in intellectual and moral judgment; rigorous academic standards; student achievement on tests; job placement and extracurriculars; effective teachers; emphasis on values and ethics; faculty and staff involvement in counseling students; emphasis on social and community responsibility; maintaining a "multi-cultural and multi-racial environment"; financial aid; regular self-evaluation; staff development; prudent financial management; and parental involvement.

Sister Agnes Marie commented that she felt that the visitation team was impressed with the fact that 98 percent of IWA's students go to college. "They (the visitors) commented on the atmosphere of community at IWA," she added. "I think that our honor system teaches self-discipline and contributes to a desire for service to others."

In an interview with the Corpus Christi Caller-Times, Sister Agnes Marie said that parental involvement has played a large part in IWA's success. "We have always felt very supported by parents and friends," she explained.

Sister Agnes Marie participated in an awards ceremony at the White House on October 1, honoring representatives from the "model" schools.

# INVESTING IN EXCELLENCE



Ground was broken on October 7, 1985 for the new Science and Athletic wing. Fund raising for the addition to the school began soon after. The total cost of the building was \$1 million. A challenge grant was made by the Sisters of the Incarnate Word and Blessed Sacrament for \$500,000, challenging everyone to raise the other \$500,000 to complete the new wing. With the help of Sr. Martha O'Gara, Paul York, Dr. Fred Cervantes, Charlie Flynn, and the entire Incarnate Word family, the goal was soon reached.

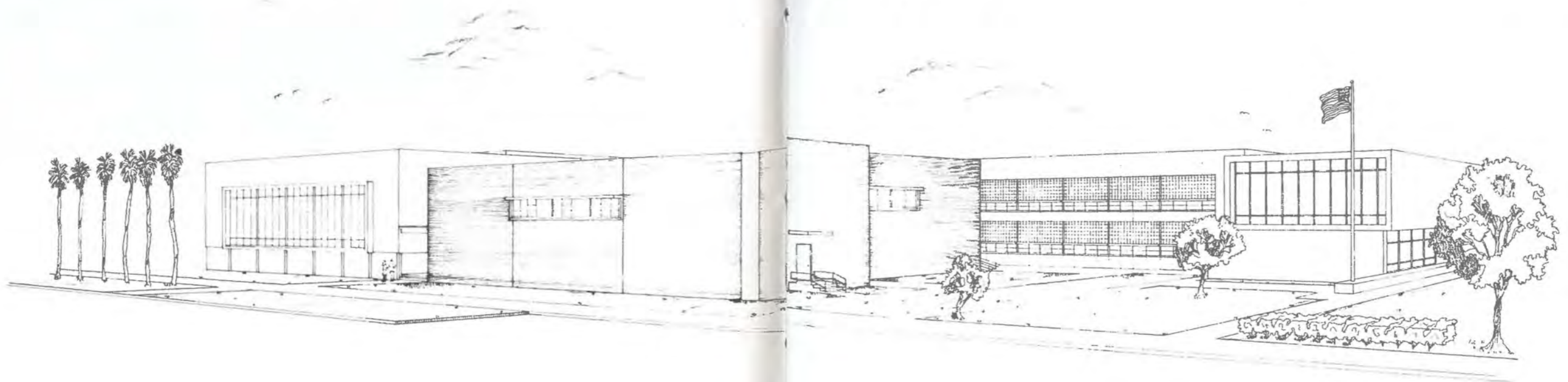

## The Science and Athletic Wing

The new one million dollar science and athletic wing was scheduled to be completed by August 1986. The first floor contains a new locker room for the varsity basketball team with fifty lockers and private showers. The soccer teams have an identical locker room with a large restroom connecting the two locker rooms. The new building also has 1800 square foot weight room for boys and girls, a training room with a whirlpool and three coaches offices. The second floor has new biology facilities, a large audio visual room and a boys restroom. The wing also contains special facilities for the handicapped including an elevator. The Science and Athletic wing will be connected to the main school by a skywalk. This new building is needed to provide adequate athletic facilities, laboratory space and offices necessary to provide the excellent education offered here at Incarnate Word Academy.

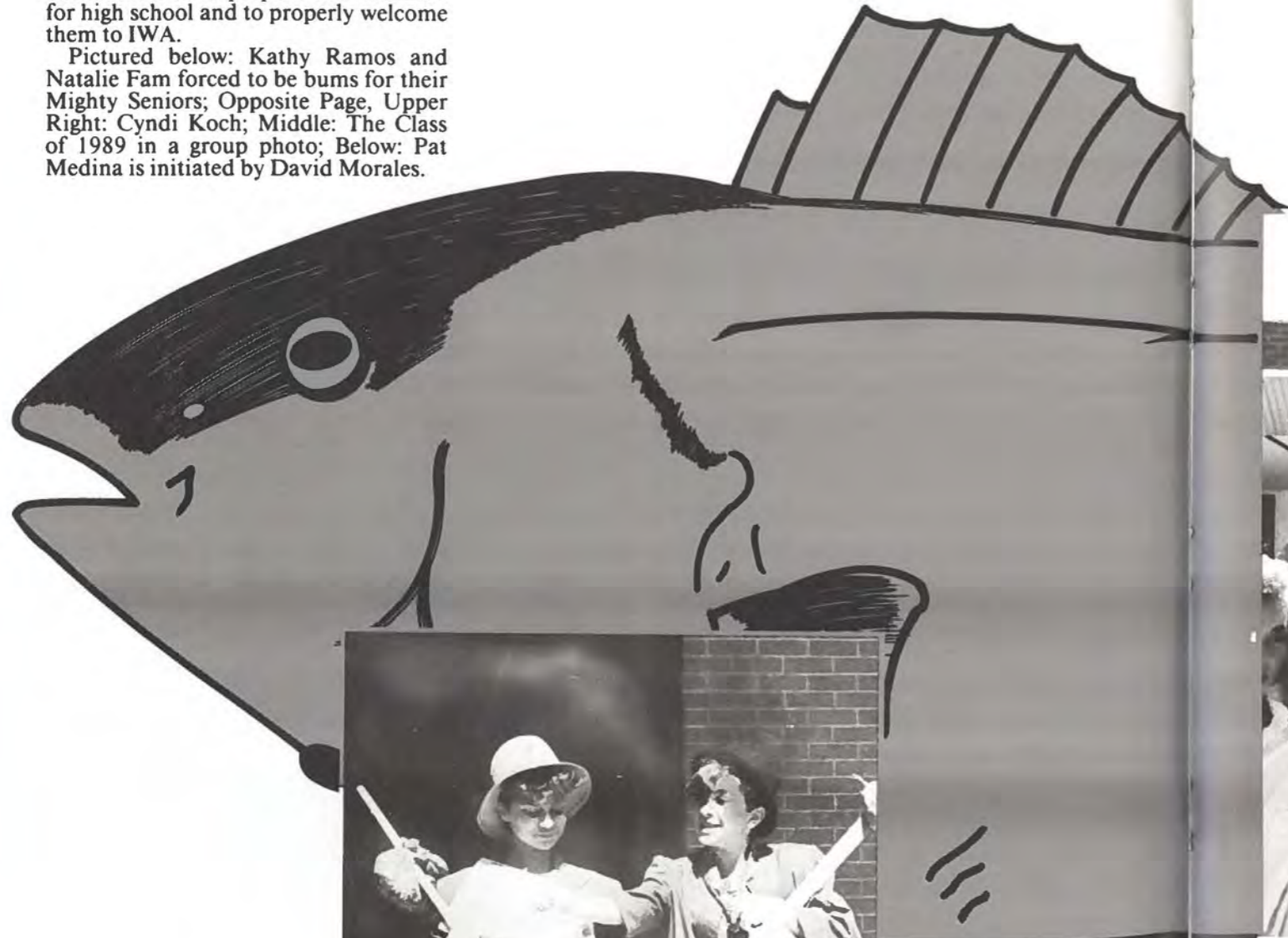
Freshman initiation — the dreaded ritual of fall when IWA freshmen are transformed into "real" high school students.

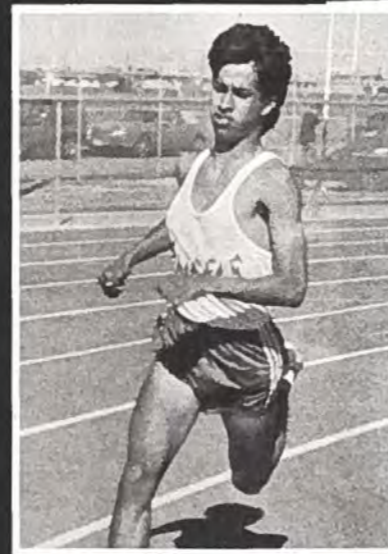

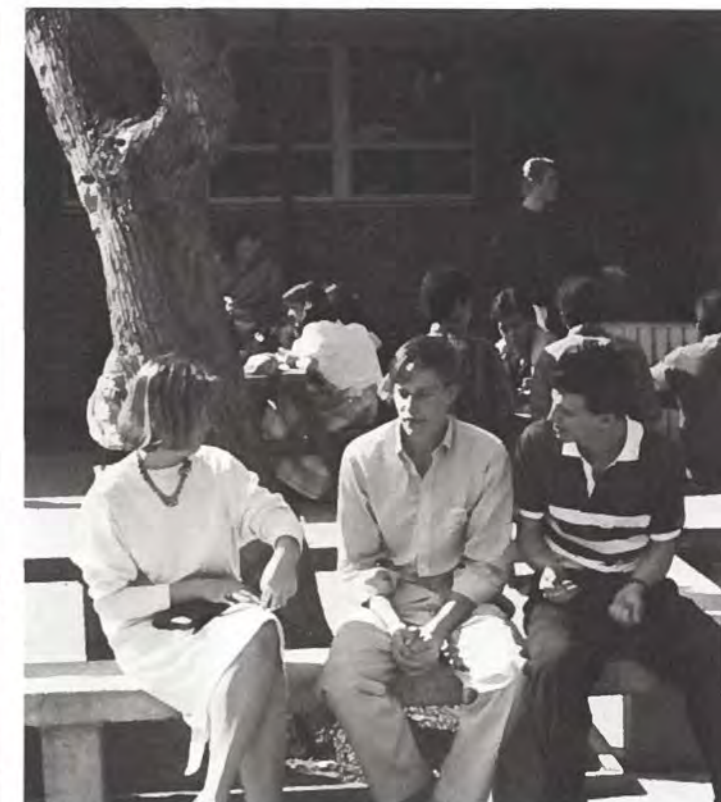

January 28, IWA students were stunned by Sr. Agnes Marie's announcement that the space shuttle "Challenger" had exploded on take-off from Cape Canaveral. This space shuttle was even more special because the first "ordinary person in space" — teacher Christa McAuliffe — was on board. During the day, students watched television in the library and listened to radios, hoping that somehow the astronauts had survived the accident. Of course, that was not to be, and IWA joined the nation in mourning the seven killed astronauts.

Dr. Fred Cervantes, Educational Development Board president and long-time supporter of Incarnate Word, was killed in a motorcycle accident March 22. Dr. Cervantes, a CCSU professor, was very active in Incarnate Word events and fund-raising and was on the steering committee of the "Investing in Excellence" campaign for the new science/athletic wing. He was also extremely involved in Corpus Christi civic affairs, having served on the CC'90 Committee and the single-member council district committee.

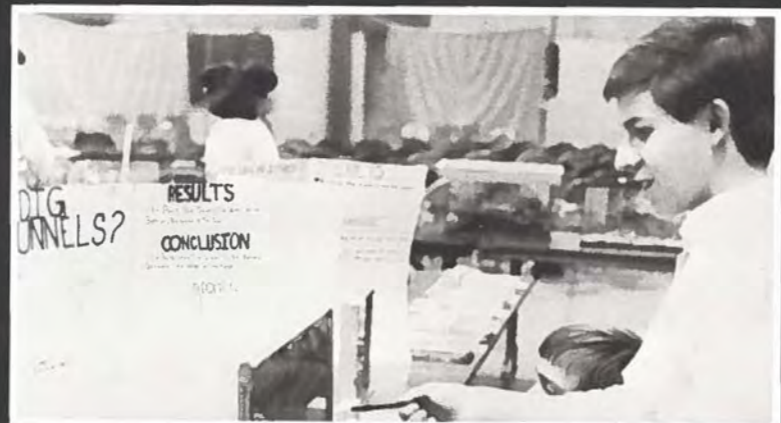

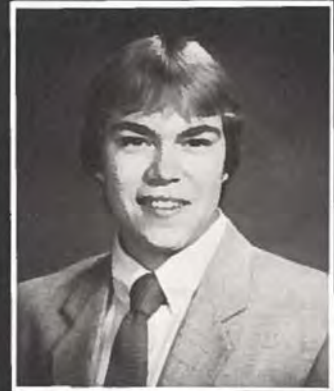
## Death of the Senior Parking Lot

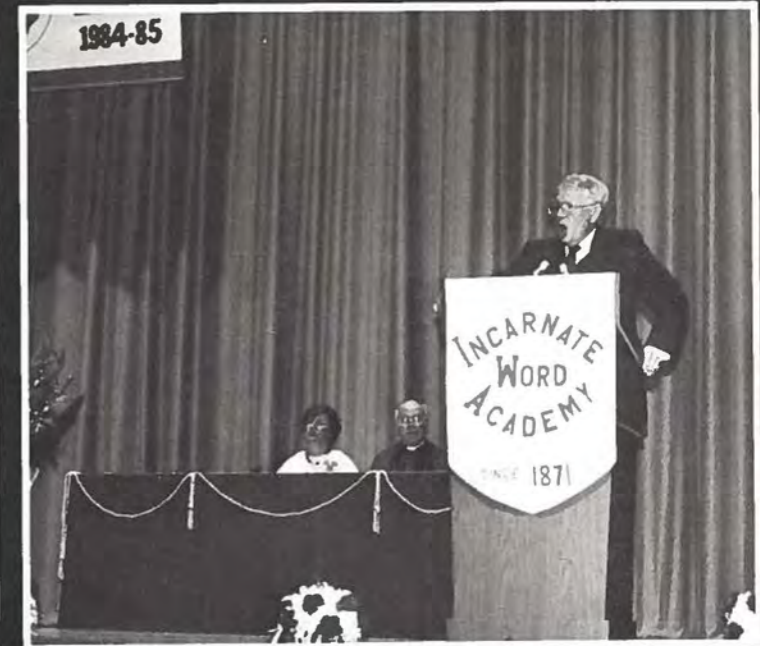

## "A Night in Egypt"

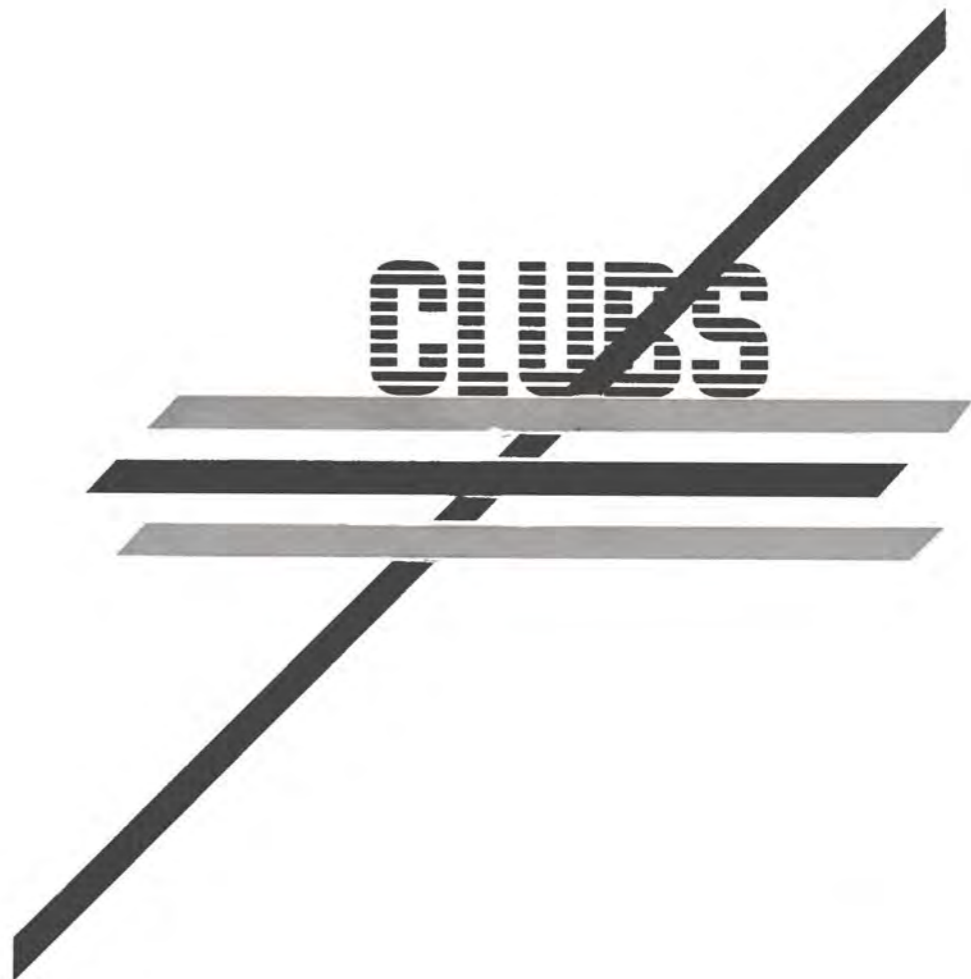

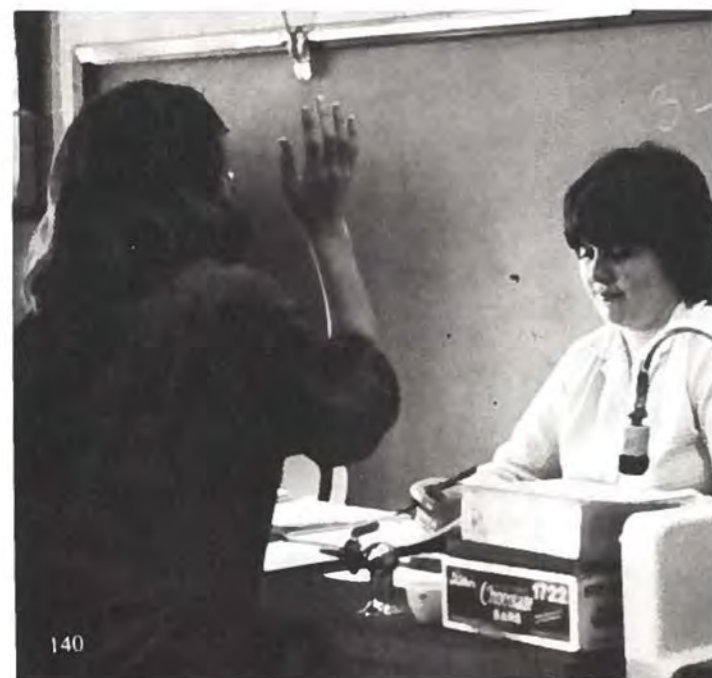

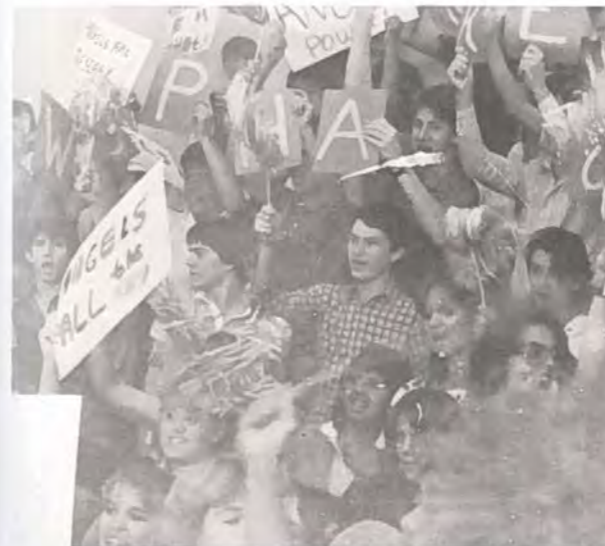
