IV. Superintendent Report

A. Updates

1. Friends of Arts & Music Enrichment (FAME) Tree of Inspiration Presentation

Dr. Rianna spoke about the process that she went through to rename the high school auditorium. The Board of Education talked about it and thought about staff who have had a special impact on the school. A committee was formed; however, the Committee thought that instead of renaming the auditorium with one person, they would honor the impact made by many. The Committee went to the Friends of Arts & Music Enrichment (FAME) and asked that they find a way to celebrate the people who have made an impact on the school. Dr. Rianna thanked FAME because they took this idea and ran with it. She introduced Judith Germano, President of FAME. Ms. Germano stated that they are honored to speak to the Board tonight. Ms. Germano introduced Linda Cirigliano, Vice President; Beth Corets, Secretary and Historian; and Valerie Lasser, Creative Director, who were in the audience. She proceeded to describe the Tree of Inspiration, which is hanging in the hallway outside of the High School auditorium. She stated that they started discussing this project in 2021 with the school district. The Board members are all alumni of Glen Cove High School and have greatly benefited from their experiences in high school. Ms. Germano stated Valerie is an award-winning film editor, Linda expresses her voice in business and Beth is a stage manager and always brings people together. All of these virtues were taught to them in high school. The purpose of FAME is to fill different gaps that funding is not available for. They have donated the piano in the high school auditorium, as well as different instruments, monitors for the TV studio and scholarships. We presently have three names on the tree in the hallway; it will grow in time with other names of people who make a difference to the children of Glen Cove. Their website is famegc.com and there is a link to their website on the Glen Cove CSD website. Trustee Lavine stated that she is so happy to see the tree in the hallway. Dr. Rianna stated that it has been a wonderful journey working with FAME, and she is in awe of their commitment to the Glen Cove CSD.

2. Bond Presentation

Dr. Rianna reviewed the presentation that was given at the last board meeting on the bond proposition by the district architect, John Grillo. The proposed projects - science room reconstruction, cafeteria and kitchen reconstruction, corridor door and hardware across the district, exterior door replacement, toilet ADA reconstruction, courtyard curtain wall replacement, high school tennis and basketball areas, including parking lots, tennis court replacement, handball court reconstruction, main parking lot asphalt, curb and sidewalk replacement, athletic field construction, new high school track and turf and several other projects, will cost the district residents \$30,552,621. It will take three years to complete and tax increases will be phased in depending on cash flow at the time. The tax impact will be phased in over three years. The district will receive 33% of the cost of the proposition in building aid from New York State. The monthly tax rate impact will .05 per \$1,000 of assessed value. Assessed value is not what you can sell your home for. The assessed value is found on your tax bill. The website will be updated with the progress of the bond.

The Board of Education stated that anyone who is a United States citizen can vote. Absentee ballots will be available.

V. Student Board Member Report

Student Board Member Aidan Costello spoke to the Board about the bond proposition and he hopes that it passes. Every student should have the opportunity to succeed academically and athletically. He stated that there is a lack of funding for our schools. He proceeded to talk about an incident that happened on one of fields just this afternoon at the middle school. We only have one trainer in the district and he was at the high school when the incident occurred. Dr. Rianna stated that she will speak with the Athletic Coordinator about this immediately. Dr. Rianna asked Aidan how the students feel about the bond proposition. He stated that the students feel that we

have an amazing staff and the school should reflect its greatness. They feel that they should have access to what other schools have.

The new doors would also be equipped with closers per the Fire Code of New York State; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 6 NYCRR §617.5(a), “Actions or classes of actions identified in subdivision (c) of this section are not subject to review under this Part, except as otherwise provided in this section. These actions have been determined not to have a significant impact on the environment or are otherwise precluded from environmental review under Environmental Conservation Law, article 8. The actions identified in subdivision (c) of this section apply to all agencies.”; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 6 NYCRR §§617.5(c)(1) and (2), the “maintenance or repair involving no substantial changes in an existing structure or facility” and/or “replacement, rehabilitation or reconstruction of a structure or facility, in kind, on the same site, including upgrading buildings to meet building, energy or fire codes . . .” are Type II actions;

2. Lead Agency Determination

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Glen Cove City School District (Board of Education), is proposing building and site improvements at the Glen Cove High School building located at 150 Dosoris Lane, City of Glen Cove, County of Nassau (“proposed action”); and

WHEREAS, the proposed action also includes the replacement of original existing single tier lockers with wider double tier lockers; replacement of corridor classroom and office doors and hardware for inside locking capabilities and narrow vision glass; reconfiguration of and renovations to the existing kitchen and two cafeterias for the creation of a multipurpose space as well as the installation of outdoor seating on existing concrete adjacent to the cafeteria and the replacement of utilities and installation of air conditioning; reconfiguration and renovations to the original science classrooms, laboratories and prep spaces which would include the demolition of spaces and select walls to enlarge the classroom space, installation of new cabinetry and finishes, upgrades to the HVAC system, as well as plumbing and electrical, technology upgrades and the creation of a total of 12 fully functional science labs by capturing additional storage and prep spaces; installation of smoke doors at the interior stairwells; renovations to select bathrooms which would include asbestos abatement, carpentry and new finishes, installation of fixtures, plumbing modifications, and upgrades to exhaust, lighting, and electrical systems as well as the installation of ADA stalls within each bathroom and the conversion of a storage room into an additional bathroom; replacement of the original unit ventilators and rooftop units in select rooms; upgrades to the existing electrical service system, including the installation of new sub panels and the replacement of an existing transformer; replacement of the existing public address system which would include all classroom handsets, speakers, wiring and main console; replacement of the orange panel curtain wall within the existing courtyard as well as the installation of new windows and new insulated panels; replacement of three exterior doors and associated frames and hardware; and

WHEREAS, the proposed action also includes the replacement of four existing asphalt parking lots (main lot, rear lot, administrative lot and tennis court lot) and the associated sidewalks and curbing; replacement of existing interconnecting stormwater piping and/or installation of supplemental drainage (i.e., drywells); repainting of the existing handball court area (i.e., asphalt and handball wall) as well as the replacement of the existing black vinyl coated chain link fence; replacement of an approximate 2,480-square foot (SF) grass area with synthetic turf for the creation of a small play area; renovations to the existing tennis court building which would include exterior painting, replacement of interior and exterior doors, upgrades to ventilation and exhaust system, renovations to the bathrooms, office space and concession stand and replacement in-kind of the adjacent brick pavers; replacement of the existing tennis courts which would include the replacement of the asphalt pavement, stone sub-base, tennis nets, posts and footings, perimeter fencing and footings, wooden retaining walls, drinking fountain steps, drainage and perimeter trench drains and concrete curbing; removal of approximately six (6) to eight (8) trees along the southern tennis court fence line; installation of a 10 foot high black vinyl chain link fence; replacement of the existing grass-surfaced athletic field inside the oval of the track with synthetic turf; replacement of field events and goal posts; repairs to the existing running track; reconstruction of the existing 150-foot-long sidewalk that extends from the field to the rear parking lot for ADA accessibility; and the re establishment of an existing play area/court for a basketball, including replacement of asphalt and fencing and removal of approximately 2,000 SF of perimeter vegetation (i.e., brushland and select trees) that has impeded the play area; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 6 NYCRR §617.4 and 6 NYCRR §617.5, the Board of Education

reviewed the proposed action and has preliminarily determined that same is an Unlisted Action; and

WHEREAS, as coordinated review is optional for Unlisted actions, pursuant to 6 NYCRR Part 617.6(b)(4), and coordinated review was not undertaken by the Board of Education;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education hereby designates itself as lead agency pursuant to the implementing regulations of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, specifically 6 NYCRR §617.6(b)(4), with respect to the above-described proposed action.

3. Determination of Significance: Negative Declaration

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Glen Cove City School District (Board of Education), is proposing building and site improvements at the Glen Cove High School building located at 150 Dosoris Lane, City of Glen Cove, County of Nassau (“proposed action”); and

WHEREAS, the proposed action also includes the replacement of original existing single tier lockers with wider double tier lockers; replacement of corridor classroom and office doors and hardware for inside locking capabilities and narrow vision glass; reconfiguration of and renovations to the existing kitchen and two cafeterias for the creation of a multipurpose space as well as the installation of outdoor seating on existing concrete adjacent to the cafeteria and the replacement of utilities and installation of air conditioning; reconfiguration and renovations to the original science classrooms, laboratories and prep spaces which would include the demolition of spaces and select walls to enlarge the classroom space, installation of new cabinetry and finishes, upgrades to the HVAC system, as well as plumbing and electrical, technology upgrades and the creation of a total of 12 fully functional science labs by capturing additional storage and prep spaces; installation of smoke doors at the interior stairwells; renovations to select bathrooms which would include asbestos abatement, carpentry and new finishes, installation of fixtures, plumbing modifications, and upgrades to exhaust, lighting, and electrical systems as well as the installation of ADA stalls within each bathroom and the conversion of a storage room into an additional bathroom; replacement of the original unit ventilators and rooftop units in select rooms; upgrades to the existing electrical service system, including the installation of new sub panels and the replacement of an existing transformer; replacement of the existing public address system which would include all classroom handsets, speakers, wiring and main console; replacement of the orange panel curtain wall within the existing courtyard as well as the installation of new windows and new insulated panels; replacement of three exterior doors and associated frames and hardware; and

WHEREAS, the proposed action also includes the replacement of four existing asphalt parking lots (main lot, rear lot, administrative lot and tennis court lot) and the associated sidewalks and curbing; replacement of existing interconnecting stormwater piping and/or installation of supplemental drainage (i.e., drywells); repainting of the existing handball court area (i.e., asphalt and handball wall) as well as the replacement of the existing black vinyl coated chain link fence; replacement of an approximate 2,480-square foot (SF) grass area with synthetic turf for the creation of a small play area; renovations to the existing tennis court building which would include exterior painting, replacement of interior and exterior doors, upgrades to ventilation and exhaust system, renovations to the bathrooms, office space and concession stand and replacement in-kind of the adjacent brick pavers; replacement of the existing tennis courts which would include the replacement of the asphalt pavement, stone sub-base, tennis nets, posts and footings,

perimeter fencing and footings, wooden retaining walls, drinking fountain steps, drainage and perimeter trench drains and concrete curbing; removal of approximately six (6) to eight (8) trees along the southern tennis court fence line; installation of a 10 foot high black vinyl chain link fence; replacement of the existing grass-surfaced athletic field inside the oval of the track with synthetic turf; replacement of field events and goal posts; repairs to the existing running track; reconstruction of the existing 150-foot-long sidewalk that extends from the field to the rear parking lot for ADA accessibility; and the re-establishment of an existing play area/court for a basketball court, including replacement of asphalt and fencing and removal of approximately 2,000 SF of perimeter vegetation (i.e., brushland and select trees) that has impeded the play area; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education declared itself lead agency for the proposed action, pursuant to the implementing regulations of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, specifically 6 NYCRR §617.6(b)(4); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education, as lead agency, has caused to be prepared Parts 1, 2 and 3 of the Short Environmental Assessment Form (SEAF) with a Supplemental Analysis (as prepared by P.W. Grosser Consulting, Inc.); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has reviewed the aforesaid SEAF and assessments and agrees with the contents thereof;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that, the Board of Education, as lead agency for the action contemplated herein, after review of the proposed action and 6 NYCRR Part 617, hereby determines that the above-described project is an Unlisted action; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, based upon the information contained in the SEAF and other relevant information, the Board of Education, as lead agency for the action contemplated herein, and after due deliberation, review and analysis, hereby determines that the proposed action will not result in significant adverse impacts to the environment, and hereby adopts the annexed Negative Declaration.

4. Resolution of Necessity

On motion by Trustee Lavine, seconded by Trustee Markoulis, the Board of Education unanimously (7-0) moved to approve Item VIII B4:

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF GLEN COVE, NEW YORK, ADOPTED OCTOBER 12, 2022, SPECIFYING IN DETAIL THE NECESSITY FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF ALTERATIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO DISTRICT BUILDINGS AND SITES, AT THE ESTIMATED TOTAL COST OF NOT TO EXCEED \$30,552,621.

RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF GLEN COVE, IN THE COUNTY OF NASSAU, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Board of Education of the City School District of the City of Glen Cove, in the County of Nassau, New York (the "District") hereby determines that in order to continue to provide appropriate educational facilities for the students of the District, it is necessary and in the public interest to construct alterations and improvements to District buildings, substantially as described in a plan developed for the District by John A. Grillo, Architect, P.C., Port Jefferson, New York, including, (i) interior reconstruction and space reconfiguration; improvements to heating, ventilation, air conditioning, mechanical, electrical, plumbing and public address systems; replacement of lockers, windows, doors and hardware; renovations to facilitate access by the physically challenged; parking lot, asphalt, pavement, curb, walkway and sidewalk improvements; the installation of a new synthetic turf field; replacement of basketball and tennis courts, and handball court and

tennis building reconstruction, at Glen Cove High School, at the estimated cost of \$29,235,746 and (ii) District-wide replacement of doors and hardware, at the estimated cost of \$1,316,875, all of the foregoing to include all furnishings, equipment, machinery, apparatus, and ancillary and related site, drainage, demolition and other work required in connection therewith; and to expend therefor, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to the financing thereof, an amount not to exceed the estimated total cost of \$30,552,621.

Section 2. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

BOND RESOLUTION OF THE CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF GLEN COVE, NEW YORK, ADOPTED OCTOBER 12, 2022, AUTHORIZING THE CONSTRUCTION OF ALTERATIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO DISTRICT BUILDINGS AND SITES AT THE ESTIMATED TOTAL COST OF NOT TO EXCEED \$30,552,621; APPROPRIATING SAID AMOUNT THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED \$30,552,621 SERIAL BONDS OF THE DISTRICT TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION.

Recitals

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the City School District of the City of Glen Cove, in the County of Nassau, New York (the "District"), has adopted the required resolution of necessity pursuant to Section 2512(3) of the Education Law for the implementation of a school building improvement project; and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest and the best interest of the District and its inhabitants that the Board of Education proceed promptly and expeditiously to provide the financing necessary for such project;

Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF GLEN COVE, IN THE COUNTY OF NASSAU, NEW YORK, (by the favorable vote of not less than three-fifths of all the members of said Board of Education) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City School District of the City of Glen Cove, in the County of Nassau, New York (herein called "District"), is hereby authorized to construct alterations and improvements to District buildings and sites, substantially as described in a plan developed for the District by John A. Grillo, Architect, P.C., Port Jefferson, New York, including, (i) interior reconstruction and space reconfiguration; improvements to heating, ventilation, air conditioning, mechanical, electrical, plumbing and public address systems; replacement of lockers, windows, doors and hardware; renovations to facilitate access by the physically challenged; parking lot, asphalt, pavement, curb, walkway and sidewalk improvements; the installation of a new synthetic turf field; replacement of basketball and tennis courts, and handball court and tennis building reconstruction, at Glen Cove High School, at the estimated cost of \$29,235,746 and (ii) District-wide replacement of doors and hardware, at the estimated cost of \$1,316,875; all of the foregoing to include all furnishings, equipment, machinery, apparatus, and ancillary and

related site, drainage, demolition and other work required in connection therewith. The estimated total cost of the foregoing, including the preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to the financing thereof, is not to exceed \$30,552,621 and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. The plan of financing includes the issuance of not to exceed \$30,552,621 serial bonds of the District to finance said appropriation, and the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the District to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable. The costs of the components of the project as set forth above may be reallocated among the components of such project if the Board of Education shall determine that such reallocation is in the best interests of the District.

Section 2. Serial bonds of the District in the principal amount of not to exceed \$30,552,621 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law"), to finance said appropriation.

Section 3. (a) The period of probable usefulness applicable to the object(s) or purpose(s) for which said serial bonds authorized pursuant to Section 2 of this resolution are to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 97 of the Law, is thirty (30) years.

(b) The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds may be applied to reimburse the District for expenditures made after the effective date of this resolution for the purpose or purposes for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.

Section 4. Each of the bonds authorized by this resolution, and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, shall contain the recital of validity as prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the District, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the District without limitation of rate or amount. The faith and credit of the District are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds, and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the District by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and any notes in anticipation thereof to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Law and pursuant to the provisions of Section 21.00 relative to the issuance of bonds having substantially level or declining annual debt service, Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes and of Section 50.00 and Sections 56.00 to 60.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Board of Education relative to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized, and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said bond anticipation notes, are hereby delegated to the President of the Board of Education, the chief fiscal officer of the District.

Section 6. The validity of the bonds authorized by this resolution, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:

(a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the District is not authorized to expend money, or

(b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution, or a summary thereof, are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

(c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.
