- Set a good example by letting your child see you:

 - Using math to prepare budgets, compare prices, etc.
- Set aside time each evening to listen and read with your child.

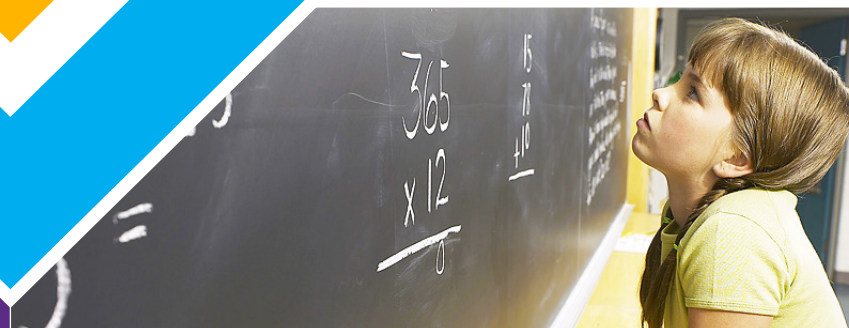

What is Title I?

Title I is part of a federally funded program designed to provide support to low income-students who are performing below grade level in reading and/or math.



About Title I

ISD 728 offers Title I programs to meet the needs of students at Lincoln, Otsego, Parker and Zimmerman elementary schools.

These schools provide a 'targeted' program where qualifying students receive additional academic assistance to support them in their classes.

The program focuses on providing help in reading and/or math by either assisting the students within the classroom or having a separate learning session at another location within the school.

Student progress is measured each year by administrators, teachers and parents to ensure that all Title I students are reaching the goals set for improvement.

Parental Involvement

Start by attending the annual Title I meeting. It's a great time to:

- Learn more about Title 1, the parent compact and parent involvement activities at the school and district level.
- Learn about your rights and responsibilities as a parent.
- Meet with other parents and teachers.
- Begin a process of communication and cooperation between parents and schools.
- Learn how to help your child at home.
