Dr. McKersie:

District Highlights

COVID-19 Update:

- George Latimer, Westchester County Executive will be declaring a State of Emergency solely to give him the flexibility to make decisions and take certain actions.
- We are seeing an uptick in infections in the County, however, hospitalizations are down. Vaccinations, masking, physical distancing, and staying home if you are not feeling will help, we just need to monitor these things carefully.

1. Jen Ito - emailed the following comment which was read by District Clerk:

I was a bit disturbed to see the SEL survey results from Asian students.

"In grades 6-12...

- -Asian students are reporting supportive relationships less favorably than multiracial students and those with confidentiality protected. -Multiracial students are reporting self-management more favorably than Asian students.
- -Asian students are reporting positive feelings less favorably than all students and those with confidentiality protected. Asian students are reporting emotion regulation less favorably than students of other races.
- -Asian students are reporting school climate less favorably as compared to all other groups of students. —Asian students are reporting sense of belonging less favorably as compared to multiracial, White, and all students."

Are there plans on steps to take to specifically address this cohort of students (especially in light of the goals under the CRSE framework) and investigate further what is going on with this group?

Thank you for a very enlightening assessment of our students.

Dr. Lang:

• Expressed that for the sake of equity and with the advancements in technology she feels we should consider allowing write-ins, she would like the Policy Committee to work through the public comment issue, also thinks it is something the Communication Committee can look at.

Silvia Robles:

• Noted that because we have reverted to being in person, the Board Policy that we have regarding comment presumes that people are coming in person.
