### Susan Lynn Ofe Webster Named Alum of the Year!



Susan Lynn Ofe Webster was the daughter of Carl "Pooch", PHS class of 1950 and Jayne Gorton Ofe. She was born on March 1, 1955 in Fort Benning, Georga. Susan was the oldest of five children, they all attended grade school and high school in Plattsmouth. Susan was a 1973 graduate, Tom, class of 1976, Missy 1977, D. J. 1981, and Mike 1984. While in high school, Susan was na active member of pep club, ski club, National Honor Society, St. Luke's Episcopal Church, and Job's Daughters. Susan was a member of the PHS concert band and the high stepping marching band. Susan was the drum major when the Marching Blue Devils marched in the 1972 Rose Parade in Pasadena, CA. Susan was lucky enough to work at the infamous Merritt Beach for many summers while her brothers worked for Dad at Ofe Oil Company and Robo car wash.

After graduation from PHS, Susan attended Clarkson School of Nursing in Omaha, where she received her diploma degree in nursing education in 1976. Her first nursing experience was in the CCU (cardiac care unit) at Clarkson Hospital. Susan moved to Fort Collins, Colorado to take a job at McKee Medical Center in Loveland, CO as an ICU and ER nurse from 1977 to 1984. She was with Kaiser Permanente in Denver, CO until 1988 and was a flight nurse for Airlife in Greeley, CO until 1997.

In the fall of 1991, Susan accepted a marriage proposal from Ken Webster on the Airlife landing pad in Rocky Mountain National Park. They were married on August 14, 1992.

Susan's final career path began in 1988 with Poudre Valley Health Systems-Medical Center of the Rockies/University of Colorado Health. She became the Trauma Performance Improvement Coordinator. Susan was instrumental in establishing the Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) program in 1997.

Susan's compassionate, professional demeanor and keen assessment skills were recognized by both the Fort Collins Police Services and Investigative Services Departments. Susan's diligent service to humanity brought rapists, abusers, and murderers to justice. She worked

on cases that were in the national headlines, such as the Lydia Tillman case in Fort Collins and the Matthew Shepard murder in Laramie, Wyoming, as well as cases in her own backyard. Every victim and their families were important to her, she believed they all deserved dignity and respect. Her hard work was recognized by her peers as a recipient of several nursing awards and honors, a couple note worth honors are: She was Employee of the Year and was a Nightingale Award finalist. She was a member of the International Association of Forensic Nursing, Society of Traauma Nurses, and American Trauma Society.

Susan accomplished those professional highlights while keeping up with three children, Sarah, Andy, and Liz, her stepchildren, and grandchildren. In her spare time, she enjoyed golfing, knitting, reading, walking, shopping, making beaded jewelry, and riding her scooter. Enjoying fun times with family and friends was the best past time. She was an avid traveler, always planning the next big adventure, especially to warm beachy places.



#### HAS YOUR CLASS ACCEPTED THE CHALLENGE?

This is cool; it is really cool being in this gym in front of you PHS graduates and friends. Most of you never heard of me and have no idea if I ever lived in Plattsmouth. As my father, I was born in Plattsmouth and attended Plattsmouth schools and graduated from PHS in 1954. That class graduated just 60 years and 2 days ago. That is when gasoline sold for 29 cents a gallon, and one could buy a bag of popcorn for 10 cents at GG Griffin's theatre. Last fall, I attended two PHS football games and setting in that new stadium with the new turf brought back so many good memories that included fun times with my classmates that graduated in 1954.

My 10-year old grandson and his brother spend a week with Beverly and I during the spring and during the summer. But Matthew is a little special because during his visits, he consistently asks his grandmother or me to tell him some stories about when we were growing up. He says—"I want to know what it was like."


